

Cattle: Milch cows, 1,010,746; store cat tle, 458,834; other cattle, 1,093,004; total 2,562,584, as against 2,507,620 in 1901. Sheep: Over one year, 915,217; under one year, 800,296; total, 1,715,513, compared

year, 1,445,643; total, 1.684,635, as couppared with 1,491,885 in 1991, and 1,771,641 Flotilla of Torpedo Boat Destroyers in 1990. in 1900.
Poultry: Turkeys, 732,359; geese, 332,781; ducks, 397,533; other fowls, 8,300,335; total, 7,762,808, against 9,755,286 in 1901.


