84-86 Yonge WILL TAKE CASE TO OTTAWA Father of Young Clark is Prepared to Make a Strong Fight.

INCREASED BAIL TO BE ASKED. Accused Thought He Was Being Kidnaped, So He Hit Detective Cuddy.

THE CASE OF YOUNG GEORGE CLARK, charged with being a fugitive from justice, continues to attract a good deal of attention.

Inspector Coby brings with him properly certified copies of the six indictments against Clark, four of which charge him with securing money under false pretences, and two with larceny.

It is unlikely that the case will come to a trial Friday. In the event the decision in the Ontario courts should be adverse to the accused, the case will be carried to the Supreme Court.

When Clark was jailed, the prisoners manifested the greatest interest in his case, and many asked him if he was not one of the Evans warehouse suspects, they having heard about the case of the Front-street mystery.

HAMILTON MAY HAVE STRIKE TO CATCH UNLICENSED DOGS Will Come Within Two Days Unless Trouble of Electrical Workers is Settled.

TELEPHONE COMPANY BYLAW. Sub-Committee of Civic Finance Will Meet Soon to Consider It.

Hamilton, Aug. 18.—There is every indication that if the Cataract Power Company and the strikers do not come to terms within the next two days a strike of the street railway men will appear, with other subsequent troubles.

This, he added, was the result of the meeting held last Saturday night. W. G. Reid, the strikers' arbitrator, said this morning: "If this trouble is not settled within 48 hours every street car in Hamilton will be tied up and every light will be out, and the Cataract Power Company will have the biggest strike in its history on its hands."
