FIRST PASSENGER TRAIN.

HALIFAX, Jan. 16.—The first passenger train over the Halifax and Southwestern railway, MacKenzie and Mann's railway on the southern shore of this province, left Liverpool at 6 a. m. today and arrived here at 2:15 this afternoon, two hours late. The distance completed is 105 miles. The road to Liverpool, which is all that is completed, is half the total distance to Yarmouth. The service commences as a tri-weekly one.
