New Five Cent Rate-Known as TWO NUMBER METHOD

Beginning July 1st, calls can be given by either of two methods, namely:

Two Number—Where a subscriber is willing to talk to any person at the telephone called.

long Distance—Where a particular person is wanted.

Iwo Number Method. The subscriber calls the operator in the usual manner. The operator will answer, saying "Number." The subscriber will then give the operator the desired number, followed by his own number, as "Rothesay, 20," "this is Main 3014-21." The calling subscriber will hold the receiver to his ear until connected with the called telephone, or is advised "Line Busy" or "They Don't Answer." If the called telephone answers it constitutes a message. A particular person will not be procured. The Initial Rate for this Service will be 5 cents for three minutes and 1

cent for each additional minute. Messages Cannot be Reversed, but must be charged to the Telephone from which they originate.

Important. As the operator cannot tell the telephone number of the person calling, it is necessary that the subscriber, on either a special or party line, should give his own number as well as the number desired. A call from a subscriber in St. John at Main 3914, wishing to get Rothesay, 28, should be given as follows:—"Rothesay, 28, this is Main 3914."

Long Distance Method. If a particular person is desired the call should be placed with the Long Distance Operator in the regular way. The initial rate for this service will be 10c for three minutes and 3c for each additional minute.





This is not a thesis on sugar refining. The mysteries of the art of sugar refining are too subtle for the lay mind. But the machinery by means of which the refining process is effected at the Atlantic Sugar Refineries is all very wonderful. Likewise, it is very complicated. The one thing that hits you most squarely in the eye is the vast amount of copper receptacles—technically known as vacuum pans—and leading from these what appears to be miles and miles of copper tubing through which various by-products pass. On another floor are mineral filtering arrangements and so on.

An adjacent building is the boiler house in which will be generated the steam to operate the dynamos which in their turn will serve to operate individual motors in the various units of the whole plant. That boiler house is in itself a thing to wonder at Twenty-four fires generating steam to the extent of goodness knows how many horse power will be tended by just two men' And it all looks so easy. The coal simply comes in at an upper floor to feed the automatic stokers on the room floor and the asness just drop through to a floor below into dump cars. The capacity of the whole plant is one million pounds of manufactured sugar a day.
