In a speech that reached a great height of parliamentary eloquence, a speech that will mark the beginning of a new epoch in the domestic and foreign history of this country, Sir Robert Borden proclaimed that the capacity of voluntaryism had been exhausted and that compulsory military service would now be resorted to to maintain undiminished the ranks of Canada's army at the front and the power of our striking force in the war. Fifty thousand men will be needed, per haps one hundred thousand, and the machinery to get them will be introduced with expedition and despatch.

The scene in the chamber when the Prime Minister made the announcement will be long remembered. Crowded Conservative benches broke into a frenzy of cheering, members leaped to their feet, waved handkerchiefs or pounded their desks. High up in the galleries men and women joined in the applause, a wave of patriotism swept over the House.
