REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY

FOR THE YEAR 1878.

The Committee of Management have the honor to present the 43rd Annual Report.

As customary the calls upon the Society during the past twelve months have been numerous, relief having been extended to 80 cases comprising 105 persons.

The total amount expended in charity is \$532 19 details of which will be found in the Report of the Sub-Committee of Charity.

The Treasurer's Report conveys information in regard to the financial position of the Society. The sum of \$2700 has been invested in Dominion Stock at $2\frac{1}{2}$ premium.

During the year one ordinary member has elected to become a Life Member.

The usual anniversary service was held in the Cathedral on the evening of St. George's Day when an excellent sermon was preached by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop; the Rev. G. V. Housman, the Rev. M. M. Fothergill and the late Rev. J. S. Sykes, Chaplains to the Society assisting in the service. Mr. E. A. Bishop, organist to the Cathedral, kindly undertook the Musical portion of the service in which he was assisted by the ladies and gentlemen of the Cathedral choir and others, to all of whom the thanks of the Society are due for the very excellent and appropriate musical service rendered on this, as well as on previous occasions.

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The collection in aid of the Society's charitable fund amounted to \$105 12.

The mutually satisfactory arrangements, between our Society and the Ladies' Protestant Home and the Finlay Asylum still continue. Your Committee would also here advert to the handsome gift made to the Society by the President, R. R. Dobell, Esq., in the shape of six beds with bedding, to be placed in the attic of the Finlay Asylum for the use of persons sent by our Society to that Institution for temporary shelter.

The thanks of the Society are again due to the Deputy Shipping Master, Mr. William Miller, for his kindness in procuring opportunities of working their passages home for several Englishmen desirous of so doing.

Our thanks are also due to the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company and others, for helping us in various ways, as noted in the Report of the Sub-Committee of Charity.

Our Society has to deplore the loss by death of one of our recent Chaplains, the late Revd. J. S. Sykes. He had been connected with our Society for a long period, and there was perhaps no one in the city to whom the poor and afflicted could look with greater confidence for sympathy and succour in their time of trouble. We have also to mourn the death of Mr John T. Lilliot, who had been a Life member since the year 1845.

The sub-committee acting with every precaution find they have been victimized by three imposters, fortunately to but a small amount, they would therefore respectfully suggest to their successors the necessity of using every means to ascertain the truth of the very plausible stories that will be made to them.

He was nine-teen years Restor of Queb.c. and was consecrated ishop 14th February, 1836. He was a diligent visitor amon his flock, a d in the dreadful vi itations of hotera in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day. among the dying nd the d ad while in 1847, when the rovince was vi ited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying y thous nds at the Quara tin station, the B shop took his turn at Grosse I. e regularly with the r st of the cle gy; and again when the choler, visited Quebec, 1849 and 1854 he was dilig nt in visiting the hospitals. During many year- and up to the time of his death, Bi hop Moun ain, besides his Lif members ip, contributed regularly to the Society a donati n equal to four annual subsc iptio s, and at all times took a great inter st in its proc edin s.

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
