

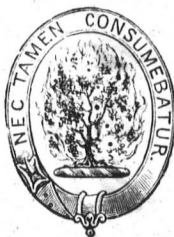

Report of Session for 1896.

Dear Fellow-Members and Helpers.

We mark once more the goodness and favor of God in our congregational life. This year has not been marked by such an increase in membership as last year but it has been one of large attendance at the Sabbath Services, both in the Sabbath School, the Church services and the Endeavor Society. The weak spot of our Congregational life is the Prayer Meeting. The attendance was very good during the first half of the year but has not been so good during the latter part. The attention of the congregation is directed to this as in a Congregation such as ours there should be no weak spots.

Through the closing of the factory and the corresponding removals incident thereto we have lost 12 members, while death has carried off 6 more. We have added during the year 6, which leaves our membership at the present time 294.

The Communion has been well observed and parents have been faithful in presenting their children for Baptism, there having been 13 baptisms during the year.

Your Session would express its sympathy with all those who have lost loved ones during the year and commend them in prayer to Him who has promised to be with us in six troubles and in seven not to forsake us.

A very successful Rally of the Presbyterians of Peel was held in May, at which delegates were present from Brampton, Port Credit, Churchville and Norval.

The meetings of our society have been found to be educative and helpful in developing the powers of usefulness in our young people, thus enabling them to take a more active part in church work.
