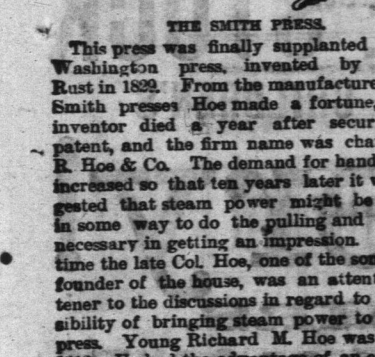
THE LATE MR. HOE.

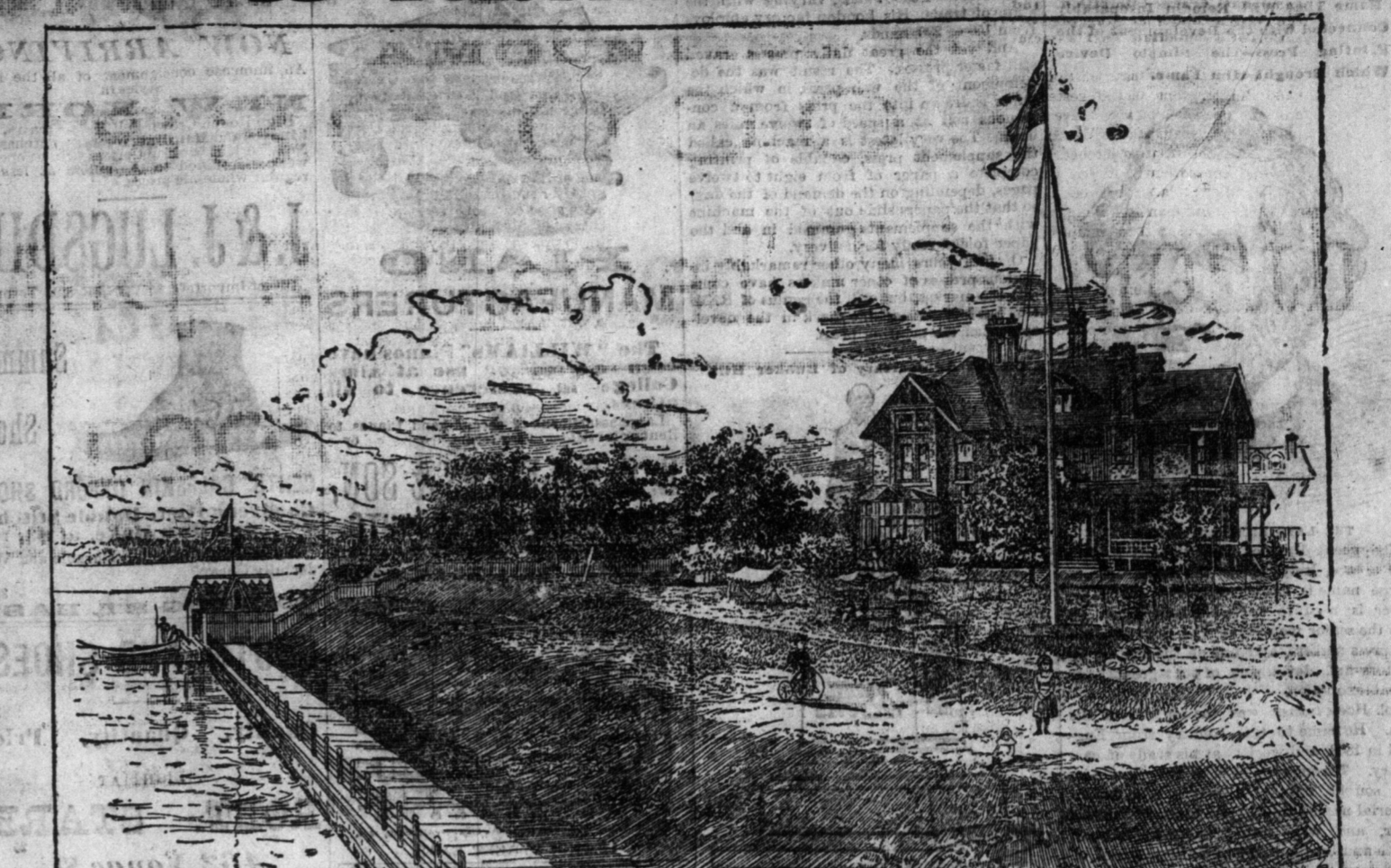
