The Bishop has appointed Mr. William Sanders Battin to be Registrar of the Diocese. Mr. Battin consequently becomes, ex-officio, a member of the Cathedral Chapter.

CATHEDRAL LEAGUE.

In response to a notice of meeting given to the Cathedral congregation on the previous Sunday for the purpose of organizing a band of faithful women interested in the Cathedral scheme, some thirty ladies assembled in the Library of St. Alban's Cathedral on Tuesday afternoon, October the 17th, 1905, at 4 o'clock p.m. Rev. Canon Macnab took the chair, and, after opening the proceedings with prayer for Divine direction, he outlined the objects for which the meeting had been called. It was proposed, he said, to form a League of enthusiastic women, who should devote themselves to the interests and work of the Cathedral in relation to its past, present and future; to extend knowledge and information as to what a Cathedral is, and its relation to the Diocese, and the parishes within the Diocese; and also the responsibility of every member of the Church in every parish towards their Cathedral, which represents the life and activity of the Diocese; and, as funds are required to put the Cathedral in such a position, and to fulfil the dearest wish of our beloved Bishop, it was agreed that a Branch of the League should be formed (with the approval of the Clergyman) in each Parish, and that every Parish should have a representation on the Central Board of the League.

It was decided that the conditions of membership should consist of a pledge to secure five dollars annually towards the Cathedral Extension Fund, and also to subscribe to the Bishop's Quarterly Envelopes; the money to be raised by any legitimate and seemly means. It was agreed that one of the first objects of the League's work should be the providing for the erection of one of the four great Piers. The following officers were appointed:—*President*, Mrs. Sweatman; *1st Vice-President*, Mrs. Macnab; *2nd Vice-President*, Mrs. Arthurs; *3rd Vice-President*, Miss Canavan; *Treasurer*, Mrs. Howard; *Secretary*, Miss Chowne.

The League has issued a very neat and appropriate Card of Membership, setting forth the object of the Association and the obligations of its members.

THE CHILDREN'S PIER.

In connection with the proposed extension of S. Alban's Cathedral, it is gratifying to learn that the Sunday School will undertake the erection of one of the great Piers. About one hundred and thirty collecting boxes or barrels have already been distributed, and teachers as well as children are enthusiastically entering upon the work of collecting for this Fund. These four great stone Piers, which will stand in the centre of the Cathedral at the junction of Chancel and Nave and Transepts, are a very important feature of the architecture, and form the next step in the permanent extension of the building. Each Pier will cost about twelve hundred dollars. It is but right that the work of erecting a Children's Pier should have begun in the Cathedral Sunday School, but it is earnestly hoped that other Schools in the city and Diocese will render help in carrying out the proposed scheme as a fitting memorial of the Bishop's deep interest in Sunday School work. It must be borne in mind that the foregoing undertakings do not in any way supersede the larger movement for extension which has been under discussion by the members of the congregation. This has been in various ways delayed, but it is expected that it will shortly be pushed forward.

Mrs. Macnab begs to thank very gratefully all the ladies in the congregation who have shown so much sympathy and kind attentions during her late illness.
