POLICE FRAUDS. Got Civilian Clothing Instead of Uniforms From Contractors.

Montreal, Oct. 30.—As the result of an investigation made by the civic police committee that body today decided to recommend to the council that an action be entered against Drolet, Dufour & Co. a prominent local merchant tailor. From evidence furnished by the police committee, it was learned that a number of police officers went to the firm, which had the contract for supplying uniforms for the police, and there they discovered an arrangement with it to take civilian clothing for the price of the uniforms. The defence of the officers was that their old overcoats were quite good enough for the winter months, and that having worn their civilian clothes while working in the service of the city, they thought they had a right to secure their value.

COLOMBIAN WAR. Further News of Government Victory.

Colon, Oct. 29.—Further news has reached here of the engagement on October 24, at Rio Frio, near La Guasaca, and the surrender of the revolutionary general, Urdaneta, together with 10 cannon, 600 rifles and considerable quantities of government forces' ammunition. The rebel positions, in conjunction with the forces of the government, were surrounded by the government forces, and after a well-considered engagement, the rebels were ordered to surrender. Four hundred and twenty men were killed, and the dead bodies were left unburied.

The Doukhobors, a religious sect, have been on their march since last night, and are now on their way to the north. They are carrying with them a large quantity of apples, and are expected to convert their salt-coats into warm clothing. The Doukhobors are a sect of the Christian faith, and are known for their pacifist beliefs. They are currently on a march across the Canadian prairies, and their movements are being closely monitored by the authorities.

SECURED DEMANDS. Montreal Dock Laborers Get Wages Raised.

Montreal, Oct. 30.—The strike of ship laborers ended at 6 o'clock today when the men returned to work, the shipyard having unconditionally surrendered to the union. The men are to receive a daily rate of 20 cents per hour for day work, and 30 cents per hour for night work. The necessity of getting boats away promptly in view of the end of the shipping season compelled the surrender of the agents. The men refused an offer for 30 cents per hour for day work, and 40 cents for night work.
