ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1851,

Presented 5th January, 1852.

THE term of office having now expired, your Committee of Management beg to lay before you a brief account of their administration of the affairs of the Society during the year 1851.

The first in importance is the proceedings of the Sub-Committee of Charity. Your Committee have to express its entire satisfaction with the manner of distributing among honest and deserving applicants during the year; several sick and infirm persons have been assisted, some have been forwarded to their friends in England, while others were enabled to reach their destination in Canada West; temporary relief has also been afforded to many. Details of the whole will be found in the report of the Committee of Charity. The number relieved was 35; and the amount so expended £66 3s. 9d.

St. George's Day was observed with the usual celebration. The services of the Cathedral were performed by the Chaplains of the Society, in which his Lordship the Bishop of Quebec, Patron of the Society, took part. An eloquent Sermon was preached by the Rev. George Mackie, D. D. The Society are again indebted to the talented organist of the Cathedral, and the ladies and gentlemen forming the volunteer choir for an excellent musical service. The collection on the occasion amounted to £23 17s. 6d.

The Society has to deplore the loss of four members during the past year.

1st—Peter Paterson, Esq., he was an original member of the society, became a life member in 1844.

2nd—Wm. Bennett, Esq., who for several years most efficiently discharged the duties of Secretary, and at the time of his decease was one of the Vice-Presidents; he always took an active part in the management of the society, and his loss will be long felt by his brother Englishmen.

3rd and 4th—In Mr. Edwin Hull and Mr. Wm. Gillard, the society has sustained the loss of two respectable members.

Nine new members have joined the society, and no less than seventeen have become life members during the year.

Your Committee has much pleasure in referring to the Treasurer's Report, which for the 16th time shews a steady annual increase, more fully explained in reference to the books of our indefatigable Treasurer, R. Symes, Esq.

The by-laws of the Society have been re-modelled in conformity with the Act of Incorporation, and in a few days will be placed in the hands of the members.

The Charitable Committee are happy to Report, that your Society has, during the past year, extended timely and substantial relief to *twenty-two* "fatherless children and widows;" to *four* persons incapacitated by accident from earning their living; to *six* individuals destitute and helpless, either suffering from actual illness, or the debility consequent upon recent sickness; to *five* aged and infirm persons, some of whom had seen happier days; to *two* mechanics, who sought but the wherewith to buy needful food for their families, until they could by honourable industry earn a sufficiency; and to *five* families whose means were exhausted, and who were desirous of proceeding to the westward; and *eight* individuals (generally far advanced in life) have been assisted to return home to England.

The expenditure of your Committee during the past year amounts to the sum of £66 3s. 9d.

Your Committee have to acknowledge their obligations to ALFRED HAWKINS, Esq., Shipping Master, for much valuable assistance in obtaining passages to England on favourable terms for several of the persons whom your Society had aided.

In conclusion, your Committee would desire to express their thankfulness to the Giver of all Good, that your Society should have been the honoured instrument in His hand of affording relief to so many of our Countrymen when debilitated by sickness, or surrounded with difficulties.

TREASURER'S REPORT

TO THE ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY,

FOR 1851.

The Sixteenth Annual Financial Statement is now submitted, and the Treasurer has much pleasure in presenting to the Society the continued prosperity of this truly charitable institution. The steady progress of the Permanent Fund will be gratifying to the members. The amount given in charity during the past year is £66. 3s. 9d. distributed to 35 applicants. The receipts for subscriptions and entrance fees amounts to £40 5s.

The sum added to the Permanent Fund is £105 3s. 3d. which now amounts to £1277 1s. £1225 is permanently invested in Bank Stock, Fire Debentures and Quebec Water Works. £52 1s. is temporarily placed in the Savings Bank.

Nine new members have been elected since the last report, four of whom entered the Society as life members.

Thirteen old members have availed themselves of the reduction in the fee, and have become life members, and the wisdom of having adopted the recommendation contained in the Treasurer's last report will be manifest, when he states that the arrears of annual subscribers amounts to the large sum of near £50. The prosperity and permanence of the St. George's Society may be chiefly attributed to the system of Life Membership, for which the Society owe a lasting debt of gratitude to the late Earl of Durham, from whose suggestion and example, as the first life member, it was established. The fee being now only £5, the Treasurer respectfully recommends to the members to place their names upon the permanent list.

The Right Honorable George, Earl of Durham, G.C.B., Patron. Died at Cowes, Isle of Wight, 28th July, 1840, at the age of 48 years.

The Right Honorable Lord Sydenham, G.C.B. Died at Kingston, C.W. September, 1841, at the age of 42 years.

The Right Honorable Sir Charles Bagot, G. C. B. Died at Kingston, C. W., 18th May, 1843, at the age of 62 years.
