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RESOLUTIONS OF COUNCIL APPOINTING COMMITTEE TO REVISE AND CONSOLIDATE BY-LAWS.

PREFACE.

WARDENS FROM 1850.

COUNCILLORS AND PRINCIPAL OFFICERS.

BY-LAWS.

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Extract from the Minutes of the Counties' Council, 19th June, 1877.

"Moved by G. H. MacGillivray, seconded by John N. Tuttle, that a Committee be formed to examine and report upon the By-Laws of this Council with a view to the Consolidation of the same in a convenient form, and that said Committee be composed of Captain Farlinger, Mr. Peter Kennedy, Mr. Finlay McNaughton, and the mover and second.—Carried."

Extracts from the Minutes of the Counties' Council, 23rd June, 1877.

"Moved by Mr. Kennedy, seconded by Mr. MacGillivray, that the report of the Committee appointed to examine and report upon the By-Laws of this Council be received and read.—Carried and report read."

WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS :

"The Committee appointed to examine and report upon the By-Laws of the Council beg leave to report as follows:—

A cursory attempt to perform the duty assigned to your Committee has been sufficient to show that urgent necessity exists for the adoption of some plan by which a collection and if necessary a revision of certain By-Laws be made. It has been customary to enter the By-Laws in the Records of the Council and to print them in the proceedings. Neglect to number or indorse them, however, made it difficult in course of time to ascertain what regulations were in force, and was the cause of the constantly increasing confusion which follows.

At present the only means of ascertaining what By-Laws are actually in force is by an examination of the County Records or the printed proceedings extending over a period of twenty-seven years; and from the facts that in the former all By-Laws have not been numbered and that an unbroken collection of the latter cannot be procured, it is impossible even by such tedious process to ascertain what the Municipal Law relative to certain matters really is.

Those By-Laws that had a temporary effect only have ceased to be of any importance, while others that were intended to legalize and make known Municipal Regulations which are continuous, should be embodied in a form accessible and intelligible to those who are required to act under their provisions.

1.—Your Committee recommend that a collection and arrangement in convenient form be made of all By-Laws which as a Record or in any other way may effect the interests of this Municipality, or of any Municipality within the United Counties, and be indexed and filed with the Records of this Council.

2.—That authority be given for employment of professional services to do the work suggested, also for the Consolidation of the By-Laws operative at present, or if it should appear more practicable to draw out a set of By-Laws giving effect to the regulations intended to be enforced by this Council, and that the work be completed and submitted at the October Session.

3.—That the system of numbering and endorsing By-Laws be adopted."

All of which is respectfully submitted.

“ Moved by Mr. McNaughton, seconded by Mr. I. R. Ault, that the Committee appointed to examine and report upon the By-Laws be authorized to continue their labors and to take such steps as may be necessary to carry out the suggestions contained in the report.—Carried.”

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PREFACE.

It will not be necessary to state at length the reasons for undertaking the present compilation and consolidation of the By-Laws of these United Counties. When it is considered that some five hundred and fifty By-Laws have been passed by the Council since the year 1850, that some of them have not been printed and can only be referred to in manuscript, that many have been repealed and amended, but owing to their not having been printed and numbered it is difficult to trace such amendments and repeals, that in many instances By-Laws neither distinctly repealing nor amending have created inconsistencies, and that there is no such thing as an analytical index or digest to call attention to such repeals or amendments, it will be seen at once how necessary was the step taken by the Council at its June Session.

No such collection or consolidation has been made since the year 1848 during the time of the Eastern District Municipal Council.

After due deliberation the only feasible course in the opinion of the Committee was to print all the By-Laws, first having consolidated all those relating to the same subjects, amending where necessary, so as to exhibit and record the unbroken course of legislation, under the Municipal Acts in these United Counties, by giving the series of both numbers and titles from the establishment of Municipal authority therein, with the sole distinction of printing at length only those By-Laws still in force.

It was also thought by the Committee that inasmuch as the material collected was to form a Record, an appropriate introduction to the same would be a Schedule of the names of the members of the Council and County Officials, thus rendering it a matter of easy reference to ascertain on the one hand the names of the members of the Council at the time any By-Law was passed, and to preserve on the other hand a record of useful and for the most part gratuitous service rendered to the United Counties by their representatives and officials, many of whom have already passed away.

The Committee have had prepared a By-Law number 552 in the series, containing a list of all repealed and amended By-Laws, with amendments at length, and have inserted the amendments in their places in the different By-Laws without further reference or comment.

The consolidation of the numerous By-Laws referring to similar subjects has been made with a careful endeavor to preserve as far as possible both the wording and the intention of the original By-Laws, which consolidated By-Laws have been submitted to the Council and have been re-adopted.

In addition to the marginal notes the index has been made as full and complete as possible.

The Committee under the resolution of Council employed Robert B. Carman, Esquire, of the firm of Carman & Leitch, Barristers, &c., Cornwall, to make the present compilation and consolidation of the By-Laws.

Be it therefore enacted, that the said Treasurer is hereby required and authorized, to cause to be executed for, on behalf, and in the name of the said County Council from the said Colin Chisholm a deed in fee simple with a bar of Dower, and freed and discharged from all incumbrances of the Front half of the East half of the said Lot number thirty-three. And be it further enacted, that upon the execution of such deed the Treasurer is authorized and required for, on behalf, and in the name of the said Council to cause to be executed unto the said Colin Chisholm and his heirs and assigns, a release of the said mortgage; and also a deed or Quit-Claim to the said Colin Chisholm and his heirs and assigns, of the rear half of the said East half of the said Lot.

That any Hawker, Pedler, Petty Chapman or other person intending to carry on any Petty Trade, who has not become a permanent resident in these United Counties, or who intends to go from place to place, or to other men's houses, on foot or with any animal bearing or drawing any goods, wares, or merchandize for sale, or in or with any boat, vessel or other craft, or otherwise to carry goods, wares or merchandize for sale in these United Counties, and wishing to obtain a license therefor, shall first pay to the Treasurer of these United Counties the fees herein set out; which fees the said Treasurer shall receive, and he shall grant a receipt therefor, which receipt the said Hawker, Pedler, Petty Chapman or other person wishing to obtain said license shall present to the Clerk of these United Counties, who shall forthwith issue said license to said applicant.

4. That the sums to be paid for said licenses shall be as follows:

(a.) For every person travelling on foot, as aforesaid, the sum of eight dol- lars.

(b.) For every person travelling with one horse or beast of burden or draught, the sum of twenty dollars.

(c.) For every person travelling with two horses or beasts of burden or draught, the sum of thirty dollars; and for every additional horse the sum of six dollars.

(d.) For every person travelling in or with any decked boat, vessel or other craft, the sum of forty dollars.

(e.) For every person travelling in or with any open boat, vessel or other craft, the sum of twenty-four dollars.

5. That each such license so granted shall be in force for one year from the date thereof, and no longer.

6. That any party, as aforesaid, who wishes to apply for a license for six months only, may obtain the same by paying to the Treasurer one half the amount required for such license for a year; in which case the said Treasurer shall specify that fact in his receipt.

Clerk shall keep record.

7. That said Clerk shall keep a proper record of all such licenses so granted.

Terms goods, &c. not to include printed books.

8. That the terms goods, wares, merchandize or effects shall not be held to include printed books, maps or charts not of an immoral tendency.

Peddler shall exhibit license to constable.

9. That every Hawker, Pedler, Petty Chapman or other person selling goods, wares or merchandize, as aforesaid, shall exhibit his license to any Constable, Preventive or other Peace Officer asking to see the same.

No duty to be imposed for peddling goods manufactured within Ontario.

Provided always that no duty shall be imposed for Hawking or Peddling any goods, wares or merchandize, the growth, produce or manufacture of this Province, not being Liquors within the meaning of the law relating to Taverns or Tavern Licenses.

Penal clause.

10. That any person or persons guilty of any infraction of any of the provisions of this By-law, shall upon conviction thereof before any Justice or Justices of the Peace for the Counties, or of the Municipality in which the offence was committed, on oath or affirmation of any credible witness, forfeit and pay at the discretion of the said Justice or Justices convicting, a penalty or fine of not more than twenty dollars, nor less than four dollars for each such offence, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment thereof, it shall be lawful for the said Justice convicting as aforesaid, to issue a Warrant under his hand and seal, or in case two or more Justices are acting together therein, then under the hand and seal of one of them, to levy the said penalty and costs or costs only by distress and sale of the offender or offenders' goods and chattels, and in default of sufficient distress to satisfy the said penalty and costs, it shall and may be lawful for the said Justice or Justices, or one of them convicting as aforesaid, to commit the offender or offenders, either to a Lock-up House within the United Counties or to the Common Gaol of the United Counties, with or without hard labor for any period not exceeding twenty days unless the said penalty and cost or costs be sooner paid.

Auctioneers, &c.

A By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, for licensing, regulating, and governing Auctioneers and other persons selling or putting up for sale, goods, wares, merchandize or effects by Public Auction.

[Passed 12th October, 1877.]

Whereas, under the Municipal Acts the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, has from time to time passed By-Laws for licensing, regulating, and governing, Auctioneers and other persons selling or putting up for sale, goods, wares, merchandize or effects by Public Auction :

And whereas it is expedient to consolidate all the Acts and By-Laws of the

said Corporation, heretofore existing that in any way relate to the said subject, and to incorporate them into one By-Law, and to add certain amendments thereto:

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, enacts as follows:—

1. That from and after the passing of this By-Law, the following By-Laws of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, that is to say, By-Laws numbers one hundred and fifty-eight, three hundred and seven, four hundred and seventeen, and all other By-Laws and parts of By-Laws relating to the matters herein enacted.

2. That no Auctioneer or other person shall sell or put up for sale goods, wares, merchandize or effects by Public Auction in these United Counties, without first having taken out a license therefor as hereinafter required.

No Auctioneer or other person shall sell without a license.

3. That any Auctioneer or other person or persons wishing to obtain a license to sell or put up for sale goods, wares, merchandize or effects by Public Auction in any one County of these United Counties, or in any one Township, Town or Village in these United Counties, shall first pay to the Treasurer of these United Counties the fees herein set out, which fees the said Treasurer shall receive and shall grant a receipt therefor, specifying the person or persons to whom, and the particular County, Township, Town or Village for which said license is to issue, which receipt the said Auctioneer or other person or persons wishing to obtain said license shall present to the Clerk of these United Counties who shall forthwith issue said license to said applicant.

Auctioneers and other persons wishing licenses shall pay Treasurer and apply to Clerk.

4. That the sums to be paid for said licenses shall be as follows:—

(a) For a license to travel and sell by Public Auction in any one County of these United Counties, the sum of twelve dollars.

(b.) For a license to sell by Public Auction in any one Township, Town or Village within these United Counties, the sum of six dollars.

5. That each such license so granted shall be in force for one year from the date thereof and no longer.

6. That said Clerk shall keep a proper record of all such licenses so granted.

7. That the terms goods, wares, merchandize or effects shall not be held to include printed books not of an immoral tendency.

8. That every Auctioneer or other person selling or putting up for sale goods, wares, merchandize or effects shall exhibit to any Constable or other Peace Officer asking to see the same, his license.

9. That any person or persons guilty of any infraction of any of the provisions of this By-Law, shall upon conviction thereof before any Justice or Justices of the Peace for the Counties, or of the Municipality in which the offence

was committed, on oath or affirmation of any credible witness, forfeit and pay at the discretion of the said Justice or Justices convicting, a penalty not exceeding the sum of fifty dollars for each such offence, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment thereof it shall be lawful for the Justice convicting as aforesaid, to issue a Warrant under his hand and seal, or in case two or more Justices are acting together therein, then under the hand and seal of one of them, to levy the said penalty and costs or costs only, by distress and sale of the offender's or offenders' goods and chattels, and in default of sufficient distress to satisfy the said penalty and costs it shall and may be lawful for the said Justice or Justices or one of them convicting, as aforesaid, to commit the offender or offenders either to a Lock-up House within the United Counties or to the Common Gaol of the United Counties with or without hard labor, for any period not exceeding twenty-one days, unless the said penalty and costs or costs be sooner paid.

Fines and penalties.

A By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, for inflicting reasonable fines and penalties in certain cases.

[Passed 12th October, 1877.]

Whereas, under the Municipal Act, Counties are permitted to pass By-Laws inflicting reasonable fines and penalties upon persons for the non-performance of their duties who have been elected or appointed to any office in the Corporation of these United Counties, and who neglect or refuse to accept such office or offices, unless good cause be shown therefor, or to take the declaration of office and afterwards neglect the duties thereof, and for a breach of any of the By-Laws of the Corporation, and for collecting such penalties, and for inflicting reasonable punishment by imprisonment in case of non-payment, and there being no distress out of which such fine can be levied :

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, enacts as follows :—

Repealing By-Law No. 185.

1. That from and after the passing of this By-Law, the following By-Law of the Municipal Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry shall be, and the same is hereby repealed, that is to say, By-Law number one hundred and thirty-eight.

Person elected or appointed to any office not performing duties.

2- That any person who has been elected or appointed to any office in the Corporation of these United Counties who does not perform his duties, and who neglects or refuses to accept such office, unless good cause be shown therefor, or to take the declaration of office, or who takes the declaration of office and afterwards neglects the duties thereof, shall be liable for every such neglect to a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than fifty dollars, exclusive of costs.

3. That any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the By-Laws of the Corporation of these United Counties, whether heretofore passed, or hereafter to be passed, in force at the time of such breach in which specific pro-

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vision is not made therefor, shall be liable to a fine for every such breach, of not less than one dollar nor more than fifty dollars, exclusive of costs.

4. That said penalties shall be levied upon conviction of the offender or offenders before any Justice or Justices of the Peace for the United Counties, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment thereof, it shall be lawful for the Justice convicting as aforesaid to issue a warrant under his hand and seal, or in case two or more Justices are acting together then under the hand and seal of one of them, to levy the said penalty and costs, or costs only, by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender or offenders, and in case of non-payment and there being no distress found out of which such fine and costs or costs only can be levied, it shall then be lawful for the said Justice or Justices or one of them convicting as aforesaid to commit the offender or offenders either to a lockup house in some town or village in the in the Township or in the County Gaol or House of correction with or without hard labor, for any period not exceeding twenty one days, unless the said penalty and costs or costs only be sooner paid.

[Passed 12th October, 1877.]

5. That for the purpose of paying the Grand Jurors of the said several Courts of General and General Quarter Sessions, there shall be assessed and levied on all the real and personal property in the said United Counties, the sum of six hundred and twenty-five dollars annually.

A By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, for the payment of Petit Jurors.

[Passed 13th October, 1877.]

Whereas the County Councils in Ontario are authorized to provide for the payment of Petit Jurors.

Therefore, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, enacts as follows :

1. That from and after the passing of this By-Law, the following By-Laws of the Municipal Council of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, that is to say: By-Laws numbers one hundred and sixteen, and four hundred and twelve.

3. That no such Jurymen shall be paid for any day at such Court or Courts on which he shall neglect to attend and answer to his name when the names of the Jurors are called.

4. That the Sheriff shall receive and be paid the sum of two dollars per day every day on which any one or more of said Courts shall be held for performing the duties required of him, in respect of the payment of Jurors.

5. That to provide the funds necessary to pay such Jurors and Sheriff, there shall be assessed and levied upon all the real and personal property in these United Counties, the sum of one thousand dollars annually, at the same time and in the same manner as other rates and assessments are levied.

No. 558.

A By-Law of the Municipal Council of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, (Line between Edwardsburgh and Matilda.)
[Passed 13th October, 1877.]

Whereas, upon petition of the rate-payers of Edwardsburgh, Matilda, Mountain and South Gower, to open out the boundary line between Edwardsburgh and Matilda from the rear of said Townships, South to the Nation River Road.

And whereas the said petition being laid before this Council during the present Session, and the Township of Edwardsburgh neglecting to comply with the request:

Be it therefore enacted a By-Law of the said Municipal Council of these United Counties, that the said Road be opened out between Edwardsburgh and Matilda from the rear of said Townships, South to the Nation River Road and that Charles Bowen of Matilda, be, and he is hereby appointed a Commissioner to open out said Road.

A By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, to authorize the Warden of these United Counties with the Treasurer, under the seal of the Corporation, to borrow a sum of money to meet current expenditure.

[Passed 13th October, 1877.]

Whereas, by the three hundred and third Section of the Municipal Act of 1873, it is enacted that "the Council of every Municipality may authorize its head, with the Treasurer thereof, under the seal of the Corporation, to borrow from any person or Bank such sums as may be required to meet the then cur-

rent expenditure of the Corporation until such time as the taxes levied therefor can be collected, and the Council shall by By-Law regulate the amounts to be so borrowed and the Promissory Note or Notes to be given in security therefor:

And whereas it is necessary for the Council of this Municipality to raise the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars to meet the now current expenditure of the Corporation of these United Counties:

Therefore, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, enacts as follows:—

1. That this Council do authorize and doth hereby authorize the Warden of these United Counties, with the Treasurer, under the seal of the Corporation of these United Counties, to borrow from the Bank of Montreal, Cornwall, or from some other Bank or person the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars to meet the now current expenditure of this Corporation.

2. That the said Warden and Treasurer are hereby authorized to borrow said sum of money until such time as the taxes levied therefor, can be collected, and to give as security, therefor, the Promissory Note of this Corporation under the seal thereof and signatures of the said Warden and Treasurer.

No. 560.

A By-Law to authorize the loan of three thousand dollars on the credit of the Municipality of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, for the purpose of paying the High School Board of the Stormont High School District the amounts due to them by the Town and Township of Cornwall, composing part of said High School District, and to provide for the levying of a special rate by the said Town and Township of Cornwall for the purpose of repaying such loan and interest.

[Passed 13th October, 1877.]

Whereas the Stormont High School District is composed of the Town of Cornwall and the Townships of Cornwall, Roxborough, Osnabrock and Finch.

And whereas the Trustees of the said High School District duly authorized the erection in the Town of Cornwall of a new High School building to be paid for by a *pro rata* assessment on the District aforesaid.

And whereas it is necessary in order to enable the said Town and Township of Cornwall to meet the proportion of the assessment aforesaid to borrow the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for the Township of Cornwall, and fifteen hundred dollars for the Town of Cornwall.

And whereas the whole rateable property of the Corporation of the Township of Cornwall for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven amounts to eight hundred and thirty six thousand six hundred and fifty seven dollars, and the whole rateable property of the Corporation of the Town of Cornwall for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven amounts to six hundred and forty thousand five hundred and fifty dollars.

And whereas for the payment of the said principal sum of fifteen hundred dollars and interest thereon at eight per cent. per annum in two years from the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven by the Corporation of the Township of Cornwall, it is necessary to raise and levy the rate or sum of one mill on the dollar annually for two years, as a special rate in addition to all other rates and taxes whatever.

And whereas for the payment of the said principal sum of fifteen hundred dollars and interest at the rate aforesaid from the first day of November next, by the Corporation of the Town of Cornwall, it is necessary to raise and levy the rate of one mill and one quarter of a mill on the dollar annually for two years, as a special rate in addition to all other rates and taxes whatsoever.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, and it is hereby enacted by the same, that from and after the time that this By-Law shall come in force the Warden of the said United Counties for the time being shall have power and authority, and he is hereby authorized and empowered for the purposes aforesaid to borrow for and on account of and in the name of the said Municipality from any person or body corporate the sum of three thousand dollars or any part thereof for a period not to exceed two years from the day on which this By-law shall come into force, with interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum, payable annually, and to make and issue conjointly with the Treasurer of the said United Counties to any person or body corporate, a promissory note or promissory notes for the amount so borrowed, or any part thereof, with interest as aforesaid, payable as aforesaid, and at such place or places as he may think proper.

And be it further enacted, that for the payment of such promissory note or notes and the interest as aforesaid, there shall be levied on the whole ratable property of the Township of Cornwall, over and above and in addition to all other rates and taxes whatsoever, a special rate of one mill on the dollar in and for the years one thousand eight hundred and seventy eight and one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine, and for the like purpose and for a similar period as aforesaid there shall be levied on the whole ratable property of the Town of Cornwall, over and above and in addition to all other rates and taxes whatsoever a special rate of one mill and one quarter of a mill on the dollar, and that the Clerks for the time being of the Municipalities of the Township and Town of Cornwall be and are hereby authorized, required and directed to levy the aforesaid rates and place the amount thereof on the Collectors Roll or Rolls of each of their respective Municipalities in each and every year last aforesaid.

Be it further enacted that this By-Law shall come into force and have effect on, from and after the first day of November next following the passing thereof, and not before.

No. 561.

By-Law of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, establishing certain rules and regulations governing the proceedings of Council.

[Passed 13th October, 1877.

Whereas, under the Municipal Acts, County Councils are empowered to establish rules respecting regulating proceedings in Council, therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, enacts as follows:—

1. That from and after the passing of this By-Law, the following By-Laws of the Municipal Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, shall be, and the same are repealed, that is to say, By-Laws numbers one, and five hundred and twenty-five, and all other By-Laws and parts of By-Laws relating to the matters herein enacted

2. That the following rules shall be and the same are hereby adopted as the standing rules of this Council.

STANDING RULES AND REGULATIONS, MEETINGS, ADJOURNMENTS, AND ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS.

1. That the Council do meet at 9 a. m. in Summer, and 10 a. m. in Winter, unless otherwise specially provided; adjourning at twelve noon, meeting at two p. m.; if there is no quorum the Warden or Chairman may take the chair and adjourn with the consent of the majority present.

2. A quorum shall be a majority of all the members.

3. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the Warden or Chairman shall take the chair and the members called to order.

WARDEN.

4. That in the election of Warden for this Council, the course to be pursued shall be that the names of all candidates shall be given to the Clerk immediately after the new members shall have taken their seats, and in case of more than one name being given, then the Clerk shall name two scrutineers from those present, and shall proceed to take the vote by ballot: he shall check the vote after being counted by the scrutineers and shall declare the number of votes cast for each candidate, and should no one obtain a majority of those present on the first ballot, the vote to be continued until some candidate shall obtain such majority, and the person obtaining a majority of the number present, shall be declared elected. In case of a tie, the question shall be decided as provided by Section 122 of the Municipal Act.

5. In case the Warden shall not be in attendance, the Clerk shall call the meeting to order until a Chairman be chosen, who shall preside until the arrival of the Warden.

MOTIONS AND QUESTIONS.

6. Every member who shall be present when a question is put in Council, shall vote thereon, unless the Council shall excuse him.

7. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received unless to amend or commit, or postpone the question already before the Council, or for adjournment of the debate, or adjournment of the Council.

BY-LAWS.

8. That every By-Law shall be introduced by a motion for leave, specifying

the title of the By-Law, or on the report of a Committee.

9. That every proposed By-Law shall receive three several readings, and not more than two on the same day, except on the last day of the Session, if any member objects.

COMMITTEES.

10. In the first Session of the Council in each and every year, standing Committees composed of three or more members each, shall be appointed for such special purposes as the Council may deem right, to whom all matters relating to such special purposes shall severally be referred.

11. The rules of the Council shall be observed in Committees as far as may be applicable, except the rules limiting the number of times of speaking.

PETITIONS &c.

12. No petition for leave to bring in a By-Law whether for the erection of a bridge or bridges, for the making of any turnpike Road, or for the alteration or receiving of any Act of this Council for the like purpose shall be received by this Council, unless notice of such application shall have been given in one of the newspapers of the United Counties during one month at least before any such petition is presented.

13. All petitions, memorials, and other papers addressed to the Council, shall, after the same have been received and read, be at once referred by the Warden to the appropriate Committee without motion, unless the Council shall order the same to be referred to a special Committee.

14. All By-Laws and reports of standing Committees shall be printed in the appendix to the minutes, but no other reports or documents shall be printed unless so stated in the resolution adopting the same.

15. In all unprovided cases the rules and usages of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario as in force at the time, shall be followed.

No. 562.

A By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, respecting the arrangement, revision, and consolidation of the By-Laws of the Corporation of these United Counties.

[*Passed 13th October, 1877.*]

Whereas, it has been found expedient to revise, consolidate and arrange the By-Laws of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of these United Counties :

And whereas a Committee of the said Council was appointed at the June Session of this present year to undertake the said work :

And whereas the said Committee has reported to this Council a Schedule of By-Laws properly numbered in which all By-Laws effete and repealed are noted, and all By-Laws in force or effect, are written or printed at length properly consolidated where necessary :

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, enacts as follows:—

1. The Schedule of By-Laws reported by the Committee of this Council, appointed at its June Session in this present year, to revise, consolidate and arrange the By-Laws, in which all By-Laws are numbered, and those effete and repealed so noted, and By-Laws in force and effect written or printed at length, properly consolidated where necessary, shall be held to be the original thereof, and shall be attested as such by the signatures of the Warden and Clerk of this Council, and shall be deposited in the office of the said Clerk for safe keeping, but the marginal notes thereon form no part of the said By-Laws, and shall be held to have been inserted for convenience of reference only, and may be omitted or corrected, and any clerical error in the said Schedule may also be corrected.

2. The By-Laws of this present Session shall be incorporated with the said Schedule inserted in their proper places according to number, and form part thereof.

3. The By-Laws set out in the said Schedule shall take effect and come into force under the designation of "the consolidated By-Laws of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry."

4. On from and after the day of the passing of said consolidated By-Laws, the same shall come into force and effect, and shall not be held to operate as new laws, but shall be construed and have effect as a consolidation and as declaratory of the law as contained in the said Acts and parts of Acts repealed and for which the said consolidated By-Laws are substituted, but if in effect upon any point, the provisions of the said consolidated By-Laws are not the same as those of the repealed By-Laws for which they are substituted, then as respects all transactions, matters and things subsequent to the time of the passing of said consolidated By-Laws the provisions contained in them shall prevail; but as respects all transactions, matters and things anterior to the said time, the provisions of the said repealed By-Laws and parts of By-Laws shall prevail.

5. The insertion of any By-Law in the said Schedule shall not be construed as a declaration that such By-Law or part of it was or was not in force immediately before the passing of the said consolidated Acts or By-Laws.

6. The repeal of any By-Laws aforesaid shall not revive any By-Law repealed by them, nor shall the said repeal prevent the effect of any saving clause in the said By-Laws or the application of any of the said By-Laws to any transaction, matter or thing anterior to the said repeal to which they would otherwise apply.

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
