Ottawa, Feb. 13.—(Special.)—There is a nice little storm brewing between the Dominion and Northwest Governments. As is well known the Northwest Government claims jurisdiction over the Yukon district, and has sent one of its members, Mr. Bullock, to Dawson to assert Territorial authority.

Under his commission from the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Chief it will be Mr. Bullock's duty to see to getting matters organized so as to secure the proper control of the liquor traffic in the newly-opened portions of the Territories to which the gold finds are now attracting such a rush of people.

RIGHT OF WAY THROUGH TO THE KLONDIKE.

United States Senate Committee Remodelling the Bill.

Proposal to Extend the Bonded Districts for Canadian Goods - E. S. Wants to Cover Atlantic Fisheries in Any Reciprocal Proposal - Postal Arrangements Also Under Consideration.

Washington, D.C., Feb. 13.—The Senate Committee on Public Lands spent the entire day in remodeling the bill granting right of way to highways through Alaska territory.

Details it Apply to Atlantic Fisheries. It is also proposed to incorporate in the same amendment a provision making the granting of the extension dependent upon the existence of the fisheries to American fishermen engaged on the Atlantic sea coast.

Postal Arrangements. The Postoffice Department will take no action on the proposals submitted in reply to the recent advertisement of the Klondike route for the establishment of two mail routes between Juneau, Alaska, and the mouth of the Yukon, one going as far as the intersection of the Tanana and the Yukon Rivers, and the other from the mouth of the Yukon to the mouth of the Tanana.
