THE COAL STRIKE. Important events may result from this week's convention of American soft coal miners called to consider taking action in sympathy with the great anthracite coal miners' strike.

It is hardly likely, however, that the soft coal men will go to the length of striking. They will more probably content themselves with contributing financially to the support of the hard coal men who are now out.

DANGERS OF OVERHEAD WIRES. In my last report I called the attention to the committee to the serious obstruction the department had to contend with in the network of overhead electric wires in the centre of the city.

LOSS IN COAL STRIKE. Wilkes-Barre, July 13.—Two months ago the anthracite coal miners' strike began, and the following figures show the estimated losses to operators in price of coal (normal) \$22,500,000.

HORSE IMPORTATION. The trade and navigation returns for the last three months show that of \$176,788 were imported into Canada free of duty from the United States during the eleven months ending May, 1920.

STUCK THE BAY BRIDGE. Belleville, July 13.—While coming down on her regular trip this morning, the steamer Corcoran of the R. and O. Navigation Company struck the Bay Bridge, which connects Belleville with Prince Edward County and knocked out of the water the pier into the Bay of Quinte.
