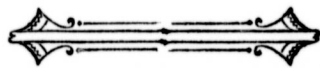

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

The importance of Sabbath School work in this colony cannot be too highly estimated. The training and instruction of our children and young people in the Word of God, and in the Spirit of His grace must ever claim the attention, the self sacrifice, and the earnest devotion of the educated portion of our church. Happily the importance of this work is as widely and strongly felt to day as it has been at any period of the past, and in proportion as this conviction grows and developes will be the prosperity and success of this department of the Redeemer's kingdom. As the Sabbath School is the channel through which must come the best and most devoted workers of the future church, because of the training and discipline derived therefrom, its importance and efficiency must be increasingly maintained.

It is a source of gratification to know that for purposes of extension and careful cultivation the landmarks of this godly work are being removed more or less, year by year, that it grows correspondingly with the growth of the Church, and although a Sabbath School is not connected with every church throughout the Conference, yet where the exception occurs, it is regarded as a great misfortune and a serious loss. We cannot too strongly urge upon both our ministers and members the necessity of forming a Sunday School in connection with every church and thereby manifest deep concern for the Lamb of the Saviour's flock as well as for the sheep of His pasture.

The spiritual aspect of this work is encouraging inasmuch as 840 conversions are reported to have taken place in the three Districts. The Temperance work as carried on among our youth forms an important factor in this sphere of labor, 2550 have signed the pledge, and are throwing the weight of their influence and example against the drinking customs that have so long cursed our land.

Of Sunday Schools there are 130, of teachers 1031 and of scholars 9124. While there is a slight diminution in our numbers owing in many instances to the want of clothing, there is for the work done, every reason to thank God and take courage.

III.—TEMPERANCE REPORT.

Your Committee begs to present the following report :—

Resolved.—1. That we rejoice in the successful operation of the Permission and Local Option Acts in various districts in this Colony, resulting in a marked absence of drunkenness, and an improved condition of the people, and would urge upon the friends of Temperance perseverance in the good work until the flag of Prohibition wave over all the land.

2. That we would urge upon all our Circuits the duty of increasing earnestness in the circulation of temperance literature, the holding of public meetings, and in making prayer to God for the success of our efforts.

3. The Committee recommend that the third Sabbath in December be observed as the day for preaching a special Temperance sermon and that the subject of Temperance be made a special topic for prayer at the preceeding week night prayer meeting.

4. That this Committee requests each District Superintendent to see that complete Temperance Statistics are obtained at the Annual District Meetings for every Circuit and Mission.

5. That the Conference having already ordered the formation of a Methodist Total Abstinence Society with special reference to the bringing about of a law prohibiting the importation, manufacture and sale of spirituous liquors, it is the imperative duty of every circuit and mission, to establish branch societies wherever practicable.

6. That these societies shall be directly under the control of the Church, supported voluntarily, and utilized for the mutual improvement of our people.

There shall be in use a single and double pledge—the one pledging a total abstinence from strong drink and tobacco, the other pledging to total abstinence from strong drink alone, members having the option of taking either pledge.

The Superintendent of the Circuit shall be ex-officio chairman of the Committee of management but may if he shall see fit delegate his authority for this purpose to one of his colleagues.

The committee shall be elected at an annual meeting of the members from amongst the members of the Methodist Church, or regular attendants on the Methodist Ministry, who shall become members of the Temperance organization. The committee shall at its first meeting elect a Deputy Chairman [who shall preside in the absence of the circuit minister] a Treasurer and a Secretary, and shall meet as frequently as circumstances may require.

He commenced at Greenspond, thence journeying to Bonavista, Catalina, Trinity, then going North, he visited Twillingate, Bett's Cove, Tilt Cove, Little Bay, Moreton's Harbor, Exploits, and the other principal settlements in the Bay of Notre Dame, in all some eighty towns and villages, large and small. His total sales amounted to \$840 in these seven and a half months that he travelled, a shewing which, considering the terrible depression among the people last year, speaks well for his diligence.

This year Mr. William Sealey was engaged and proceeded to Twillingate about the middle of May. He reports that times are very dull, and that it is difficult to make sales.

In presenting this Report, I beg to say that it is impossible to keep this valuable educational and evangelistic agency in operation unless liberal contributions are made to its fund, to augment the working capital derived from the sale of books.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE METHODIST CHURCH WITHIN THE BOUNDS OF THE
NEWFOUNDLAND CONFERENCE.

BELOVED BRETHREN.—Permitted again by the kind Providence of Almighty God, to assemble together in Annual Conference, we greet you in the name of the Lord Jesus, and desire to address to you, words of instruction and loving counsel remembering the solemn obligation under which we are laid to “take heed to ourselves and to all the flock over which the Holy Ghost hath made us overseers, to feed the Church of God, which he hath purchased with His own blood.” “God is our record how greatly we long after you in Jesus Christ, and this we pray that your love may abound yet more and more, in knowledge, and in all judgement, that ye may approve things that are excellent, that ye may be sincere and without offence, till the day of Christ, being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ, unto the praise and glory of God.”

We are devoutly thankful to God, that our ministerial ranks have not been broken by death during the year, neither has any accident befallen your missionaries, in the prosecution of their arduous toil. True, affliction hath entered some homes, and severe prostration has been the result, but the presence of the Master, who comforteth in all tribulation, has been felt, and pain has been borne with exemplary fortitude for His sake.

The year has been unprecedented for disaster and depression, and will be historic as having witnessed two of the fiercest gales that ever swept our shores, the first by which much damage was done to property, the latter by which many met with watery graves. It is consoling to know that some were prepared to meet their God, and we doubt not they are with those who have come out of great tribulation, before the throne of God and the Lamb.

The failure in the fishery has clouded the horizon and been the cause of deep anxiety, and although we “see not the bright light which is in the clouds” we have unshaken confidence in Him who doeth all things well believing that the cloud is “fringed with covenant love”, and that ere long we shall behold the dawn of better days. We have remembered you dear brethren earnestly in our prayers, and sympathised with you, in all your losses for “we are one with you.”

Our island home two, has been bereaved of its late Governor, Sir. John Hawley Glover, an able and wise administrator who during a visit to England, in search of health was suddenly called to his reward. Thus have we been reminded that death knocks impartially, at the palace, as well as the cottage gate. We would accept the summons of the Master, “Be ye also ready.”

In connection with the work of our Church we rejoice to be able to report prosperity. We can say with our venerable Founder “The best of all is, God is with us.” Gracious revivals of religion have been witnessed on several circuits and missions, notably on fields that have been long barren and unfruitful, and hundreds have testified to the saving power of Jesus, and to the preciousness of the blood, which cleanseth from all sin. God’s servants have been endued with power from on high, believers have been quickened afresh; they have girded themselves, with the whole armour of the Lord, and sought to bring their friends to Jesus. The voice of joy and thanksgiving has been heard throughout the land, “Praise ye the Lord, for He is good, for His mercy endureth forever.”

Our membership now stands at 8669 with 1972 on trial.

The increasing importance of our Sabbath School work, is felt by us from year to year, and the tabulated results are such, as to call forth gratitude to the Great Head of the Church. There are in connection with the Conference, 130 schools, 1031 teachers, and 9124 scholars, of whom 840 have been converted during the year. This is to be regarded as most promising in relation to our future prospects. From these young people we expect mainly to recruit our ranks, and if they are well prepared by spiritual instruction, we may reasonably suppose them to become intelligent and useful members of the Church. We cannot speak too highly of the self-denying efforts of our Superintendents and teachers, who so willingly give their time to the training of the lambs of the flock. May God reward them an hundredfold.

Our Day Schools under the efficient supervision of Rev. Dr. Milligan, have accomplished much good, and are now farther advanced than heretofore, but we lament that as yet, we are far behind the times in the matter of education. The returns from some districts, manifest a spirit of indifference on the part of parents to the interest of their children. Excuses for non-attendance at school are both numerous and frivolous, and meanwhile the mind remains a dark void, instead of being allowed to develop in that knowledge, so essential in these days. We trust dear people that you will lay this matter seriously to heart, and co-operate with us in giving to this subject, the attention which its importance demands.

We note with pleasure the laying of the foundation stone of our New College in St. John's in May last. This institution when complete will furnish increased educational facilities for the most thorough training of our young people.

Four young men, who have passed through the usual term of probation with credit to themselves and the Church, have at this Conference been admitted into full connection and ordained.

Two Students still remain at Sackville Institution where they are seeking to equip themselves fully for the responsible duties of the Ministry.

Bro. Lister who has laboured with much acceptance on several of our Circuits, is necessitated to leave our shores on account of domestic affliction. We follow our brother with earnest prayers that the Divine blessing may accompany him wherever his lot may be cast.

The General Conference is appointed to meet at Toronto in the autumn of this year, when questions of deep importance will be considered, in the interest of the now united and extensive Church. We ask you to join with us, in earnest prayer that its sessions may be under the guiding hand of the Almighty, and that the various deliberations may tend to promote the glory of God and the welfare of Zion.

Now, dear brethren, suffer the word of exhortation, and here we address ourselves as well as you. There are certain duties incumbent upon you which if neglected, or are triflingly dealt with, will not only prevent a growth in grace, but imperil the soul's salvation. On Mount Sinai, the command was given, "Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy," and it is still binding upon this generation. Do not spend the day in indolence or in paying complimentary visits to your neighbors and friends. Remember that indolence is not rest neither is pleasure in this particular. The claims of the Sanctuary are deeply important, and cannot be overlooked with impunity. Cultivate a love for the House of God, and be found regularly in your place there. Beware of following the fashion, to be content merely with attendance at one service on the Lord's Day. The truly hungry soul will delight to wait upon its God, whenever opportunity

presents. We commend to you the spirit of the Psalmist, who said, "My soul longeth, yea even fainteth for the courts of the Lord, my heart and my flesh crieth out for the living God." "I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord."

The week-night services will be found exceedingly valuable and refreshing to the weary soul, amidst the daily cares and anxieties of life. Prize them. Your ministers frequently feel something of discouragement when they have to preach to empty instead of well-filled pews. We rejoice that there has been a marked improvement during the past few years, and trust that it will be more apparent in the year upon which we now enter.

Do not despise the Prayer Meeting. Eternity alone will reveal how many received their first impressions for good, while godly men and women were pleading for the salvation of precious souls. "The prayer-meeting is the thermometer of the Church. It is impossible to conceive the benefits that have been conferred upon our Israel, by this means of grace,—it has proved "a well of salvation" to millions on the way to heaven, and we shall find it so, if we enter heartily into its service.

We deeply regret that there should be a desire manifested on the part of some to remove this ancient landmark, or to disregard it as a test of membership. This seems to indicate declension in the spiritual life, and a "lowered" tone of piety. Remove it, and the life of our church is endangered at once. Strange that our own child should be undervalued by us, and other denominations, recognising its immense advantages, are seeking to introduce it in connection with their societies. As a Conference we are loyal on this subject and to would-be destructionists we say ;

"Woodman, spare that tree,
Touch not a single bough,
In youth it sheltered me,
And I'll protect it now."

We would affectionately invite you to regard the necessity of regularly partaking of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. It is impossible to neglect this ordinance without violating the command of the Master. He himself said "This do in remembrance of Me, and we are bound to render obedience. "For as oft as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do show the Lord's death till He come." A right apprehension of St. Paul's words in reference to the Corinthian Church, (see 1 Cor. 11. 27 30.) we are persuaded would remove a serious difficulty. All are welcome at the Table who, "truly and earnestly repent of their sins, and are in love and charity with their neighbors, and intend to lead a new life" These are the only conditions to be observed.

In the great Temperance movement our Church is fully alive to its duty. The prominence which has been given to this subject, has awakened general sympathy and brought earnest bands of workers to the front. Encouraged by past success our motto has been "Onward," and with the help of the Almighty, we are determined not to rest until the "enemy that oppresses us" is driven out of the land.

We exhort you, dear brethren, to secure a consciousness of your acceptance with God, and having secured maintain it. The Word of God distinctly declares it possible for believers to know on earth their sins forgiven, and to continue in the love of Christ. Whilst we praise God for those who have passed "from death unto life," we are deeply humbled at the thought that the results obtained are not nearly commensurate with the efforts put forth. How much more might have been accomplished if all had proved faithful unto their Lord. Cases of backsliding are frequent

The greatest difficulty experienced, is not in obtaining disciples for the Master, but in retaining them. There is far too much fluctuation in the spiritual life. Winter religion fervent, summer religion cold and formal, Brethren, these things ought not to be. Your light should shine steadily all the year through. Your religion like the fire on the Jewish altar, should be ever kept burning. Do not recede we beseech you, but advance, for there is land yet to be possessed. You have not exhausted the Divine resources. Press forward. The reward promised to those who by "patient continuance in well-doing seek for glory, and honor, immortality and eternal life." Let your Christianity be practical "Faith without works is dead." Seek to have "conscience void of offence toward God and man," Be strictly honest in all your business transactions. Have nothing to do with those things that are questionable and will not bear the light.

Let your homes be religious, permeated with the hallowed influences of the Holy Spirit. Erect your family altar, and from it let prayer and praise ascend morning and evening. You will find it "a rod of strength" in your efforts to train your children aright. Look well to your families, your responsibility is tremendous. Think not that your duty is done, when you have clothed and fed your offspring. Alas, we fear that too many end here. Let it be your concern to have your families decidedly Christian. Take time to question and instruct them with regard to vital godliness. See that they choose suitable companions who will not be hinderances to them on their way to heaven. Make home attractive and pleasant, and this will tend to bind each heart closer to the other. Jesus will then be a constant visitor, and the "trees of righteousness, shall stand in the courts of the Lord, and flourish in the house of our God," when you have finished your course, and gone to your reward.

Seek to have literature of a healthy moral and spiritual character only on your tables and shelves. The publications of our Book Room, and the beautifully illustrated papers of our Sabbath School have done much towards counteracting the baneful and pernicious influence of the frothy works, that have already had too large a circulation on our shores.

It is a matter of regret that our financial condition is not as satisfactory as we could wish. We have many evidences of your liberality, and would still urge upon you the necessity of contributing to the cause of God as your means will allow. Give cheerfully, and as the Lord hath prospered you.

Our Conference gathering has proved to be a season of refreshing. We have seen each others face in the flesh, and enjoyed sweet counsel together. Whilst there have necessarily been differences of opinion, in the various matters brought forward for discussion, there has been no disturbing of harmony or brotherly love. We have learned to regard the Apostolic injunction. "In honor preferring one another." The public services and anniversary meetings have been blessed to our souls.

And now dear brethren we part in peace. We go to our respective spheres of labor with strength renewed, determined to accomplish great things for God. We are conscious of our responsibility, and often when contemplating the stupendous work in which we are engaged we ask "Who is sufficient for these things?" We beseech you pray for us, that the Word of the Lord may run and be glorified. We need continually the baptism of the Holy Spirit, and rejoice that the promise is ours. Prayer for the Holy Ghost must be offered regularly and devoutly, then shall ministers and office bearers be sanctified to God, and we shall be prepared to "spread Scriptural holiness through the land."

Christian life. His manly virtues made him conspicuous and outspoken in the denunciation of intemperance and evil of every kind, while his intimate acquaintance with the general business of his native colony made him a wise counsellor in both social and public affairs. He did good service to Newfoundland for years in its highest councils and while he recognized his duty to his fellow men in the State, he failed not to keep in view his obligation to God and His Church. As a member, class leader, trustee, and otherwise, as he had opportunity he strove to respect the name of Methodist for whom he cherished sincere regard. Having lived the life of the righteous he died his death. He had long and humbly served his Heavenly Master, and having waited and watched for the summons to go up higher, when it came he bade it welcome, and his end was peace.

(2) The Conference desires to assure his aged widow and family of its heartfelt and prayerful sympathy, and in token thereof begs to forward a copy of the above resolution.

14—Whereas our esteemed brother Rev. Joseph Lister is compelled by the painful and protracted illness of his beloved wife to reside for a season at least in England.

Resolved, That the members of this Conference desire to assure Bro. Lister of their sincere respect and love for him personally of their appreciation of the valuable and faithful services which he has been enabled to render to our Church in this country during his connection with us for twelve years, of our deep sympathy with him and his in the painful circumstances in which they are placed, and their fervent prayer that the blessing of Almighty God may rest upon him and them, wherever in His Providence their lot may be cast.

15—That this Conference desires to express its deep sympathy with Bro. Atkinson in the protracted affliction of his beloved wife, and earnestly pray that she may speedily be restored to health.

16—That the hearty thanks of this Conference be presented to the Ex-President Rev. G. J. Bond, B.A. for the masterly charge delivered by him at the Ordination Service last evening, and further that it be printed.

17—The Conference regrets that no definite report has been received from our Book Room at Halifax.

18—That the General Conference be requested to retain the legislation of 1874, in relation to the Children's Fund.

19—The Conference has great pleasure in expressing its thanks to Joseph Laurence Esq., of East Keswick, Yorkshire Eng., for the deep interest he still continues to take in the work of God in this Conference.

20—Any brother not expecting to be at next Conference shall inform the minister when the Conference is to be held that he will not require a home, at least one month before Conference.

21—That the best thanks of the Conference be presented to the President and Ex-President of Conference for the earnest, faithful and eloquent sermons preached on the past Sabbath.

22—The Committee on New College and Ministers' Childrens' Home, beg to report that a contract has been entered into for the erection of the proposed College, and for adapting the building now used as an academy for the purpose of a commodious and comfortable home. It is hoped that the College will be finished and equipped by the end of the current year, and the Home by the time next Conference meets. Your committee begs to commend this great and important work to the sympathy and support of our ministers and people generally.
