WATCHING THE PATIENTS.

NEW YORK DOCTORS' EXPERIENCE
WITH SCOURGE OF THE

Should Rise in Temperature Noted in
Some Cases, but Not in All—More
Deaths Reported in St. John.

New York, Dec. 12.—Physicians who
have been spending most of their time
in the hospitals in New York, are
beginning to report the results of their
treatment of the patients who have
been suffering from the disease.

Not because it is possible yet to know
whether any of the patients treated are
going to be cured. Dr. Jacob said today
that he did not expect scientific results
from the treatment of the patients, but
that it would be impossible to do so.

The doctors are beginning, however,
to get results from their experiments.

Altho German hospital probably
the most interesting case is that of
Wilhelmine Kohnert, a charity patient,
who has been for years a sufferer from
hups on one side of the face.

A visiting physician, in describing the
case to the reporter, said that it was a
rare case in some respects, but that the
rise in temperature is the result usually
observed four or five hours after the in-
jection.

In this patient's case the temperature
went down about 2°. This was not re-
markable though rare, but it was noted
that the temperature did not rise above
the normal even in this negative reaction.

The temperature had become normal
today. Most important, however, was
the result observed of the woman's dis-
ease. Upon the injection of the vaccine,
which was given at first, and then at
intervals of three days, the patient
was able to get up and walk.

This was the condition of the patient
yesterday, and it is expected that the
slight improvement in the exterior of
the swelling and the condition of the
skin on the back, which will follow the
first injection of the vaccine, will be the
first indication of the cure.

The case has been reported from the
German hospital.

skin on the back, which will follow the
first injection of the vaccine, will be the
first indication of the cure.

The case has been reported from the
German hospital.
