For instance: first, in the fact that human nature was completely created only in and by the formation of two persons, man and woman, of a woman from a man; and secondly, sacramentally, in the case of those, as man and wife, of whom it was declared "the two shall be in one flesh."

Eve was created, humanly necessary for the completeness of Adam's fatherhood of man. Indeed, she became more than the Second Eve because she was co-ordinated to, she co-operated with One infinitely more than a mere Second Adam, in order to secure for humanity an infinitely higher fatherhood.

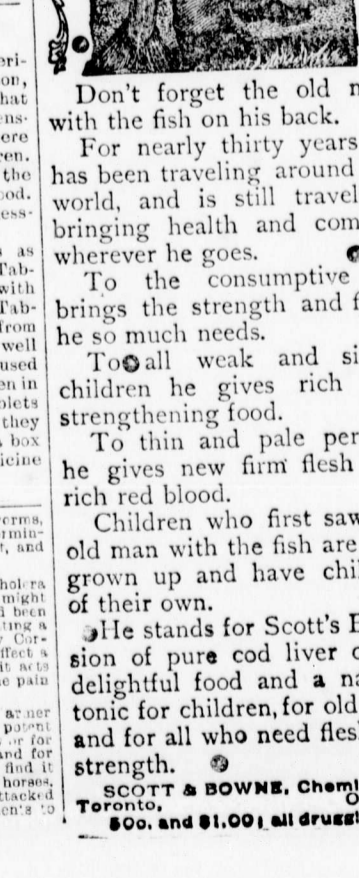
A Beautiful Custom.
