THIRD SESSION OF THE NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Tuesday, July 8th, 1817.

GREEABLE to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor's Proclamation, the House met.

" A Message from His Excellency, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, requiring the attendance of this Honorable House, immediately in the

Council Chamber."

The House accordingly attended, and having returned, the Speaker reported, that when the House attended this day in the Council Chamber His Excellency was pleased to deliver to both Houses of Assembly a Speech, of which, to prevent mistakes, he had obtained a Copy, which being read, is as follows, viz.

"Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council,

"Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

time which has elapsed since I last met you in General Assembly, has been productive on the public Theatre of the World, of events that surely never before occurred within the same period.

"Their magnitude and importance has been such, as must have brought them within the knowledge of every man, and however regular it would be, in addressing you collectively to name them, yet the certainty of their having so completely reached you individually, induces me briefly to allude to them in general terms.

"The Series of most extraordinary circumstances which has led to the pacification of the World, to describe in adequate terms, is a task, which the pen of the most brilliant future Historian will with difficulty accomplish; suffice it now to say that the storm of War which has so long raged, with destructive violence, has ceased, and that so suddenly, after the most glorious but sanguinary Victory which purchased the blessing, as to leave an agitated and troubled political Sea, even yet to subside into a calm: we may however humbly hope, that the same Almighty arm, which so powerfully upheld and supported the Mother Country, through the long protracted period of her trial, will not cease to protect her under any circumstances, but will enable her to surmount every difficulty, and if she be sufficiently grateful for her past unexampled prosperity to the hand from whence all blessings flow, extend it to a long futurity.

"The speedy and signal success against an African piratical State, which has added to the splendour of her arms, should again remind us forcibly of the giver of all Victory; let us ever receive such favours with more of thankfulness than triumph, of gratitude than exultation, and then future confidence may be indulged,

and cannot be considered as presumption.

"The Annunciation of the Marriages which have taken place in the Royal Family, will of course, be received by you with sentiments of equal satisfaction, with those which have been telt and expressed throughout the British Dominions: such is the importance which every Loyal Subject must attach to whatever can in any degree, tend to maintain, the security of the established Succession to the Crown.

" Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the Assembly,

"I have directed the Public Accounts to be prepared and laid before you, and on this subject, I am happy to announce; that the Debt which existed at the

time of your last Session has been discharged.

"I invite your examination of the Public Expenditure, as such an investigation cannot but produce, in you, a full confidence in the just and occonomical application of such future supplies, in addition to the existing Revenue, as it may appear to you necessary to provide.

- " Mr. President, and Gentlemen of the Council,
 - "Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

"The Season of Scarcity which has lately affected so many Countries, has to a certain degree, extended to this Island, so much so, that a restraint for a limited time became expedient, last Autumn, on the Exportation of certain articles of Provision; it has since been matter of anxious consideration whether it ought not to be continued in the Spring, and it was not without deliberate debate, that I hazarded the experiment of leaving export unrestrained, being desirous of aiding the necessities of the neighbouring Colony, and of encouraging the Agriculturist here, if that could be done consistent with prudence. Hitherto no serious evil has been experienced, and the Season is fast approaching, when through the Bounty of Divine Providence, it is to be hoped plenty will return.

"The importance of Roads and Bridges for Communication in general, and the Conveyance of Agricultural Produce in particular, is obvious; every attention has been paid to them, that the very insufficient means the Colonial Revenue afforded the power of doing: it is superfluous to say, if they had been more ample,

the Public would in that proportion have been more benefited.

"The wants of the Colony are in all respects so well known to you that I shall on the present occasion for bear to mention any, leaving it to your own unbias'd judgment to consider of, and propose all such salutary measures, as may appear to you likely to promote the general welfare."

July 8th, 1817.

Ordered, on Motion of Mr. Goff, seconded by Mr. Bagnall, that a Committee be appointed to draw up an Address in answer to His Excellency's Speech: Mr. Goff, Mr. Bagnall, Dr. M. Aulay, Mr. M'Neill, and Mr. Dockendorff, were accordingly appointed for that purpose.

Ordered, on Motion of Dr. M'Aulay, seconded by Mr. Goff, that a Committee be appointed to revise the Journals of the House, each day immediately after the adjournment thereof: Dr. M'Aulay, Mr. Goff, and Mr. Nelson, were appointed for that purpose.

Ordered, on Motion of Dr. M'Aulay, seconded by Mr. Nelson, that the Clerk do furnish his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with a fair Copy of the Journals, each day as soon as possible, after the adjournment of the House, and that he also furnish the Printer with a fair Copy of the same.

Ordered, on Motion, of Mr. Bagnall, seconded by Mr. M'Neill, that the Speaker do direct the Serjeant at Arms, to call on LEMUEL CAMBRIDGE, Esq. and to require his attendance in this House.

Ordered, That the Clerk do notify the Chaplain, to attend the House, each day, as usual.

Adjourned till 10 o'clock to-morrow.

THE House met pursuant to Adjournment.

The Chaplain attended agreeable to Orders and said Prayers.

Mr. Goff, Chairman of the Committee appointed to draw an Address in answer to His Excellency's Speech, at the opening of this Session, reported a Drast of the same, which was ordered to be read.

On Motion, of Mr. Murray, seconded by Mr. Cossin, The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, (Mr. Murray, in the Chair,) to take the said Address into consideration, and after some time spent therein, the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported, that the Address was approved of by the Committee.

Ordered, on Motion of Mr. Bagnall, seconded by Mr. Hyde, that the Address be agreed to by the House, and that the same be engrossed which is as follows, viz.

"To His Excellency CHARLES DOUGLASS SMITH, Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief, in and over his Majesty's Island Prince Edward, and the Territories thereunto belonging, Chancellor and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

"The Address of the Lower House of Assembly, in General Assembly convened,

" May it please your Excellency,

This Majesty's most dutiful and Loyal Subjects the Representatives of Prince Edward Island, in General Assembly convened, beg leave to return your Excellency our Thanks for your Speech at the opening of this Session,

"The notice which your Excellency is pleased to take of the unparalleled public Events, which have occurred since we had an opportunity of regularly and collectively addressing your Excellency, and the glorious conclusion of the unexampled contest in which the British Empire has so long been engaged, fully accords with our feelings, and demand the most sincere and devout acknowledgements of gratitude to that power which has so signally protected and crowned its efforts.

"The prompt and effectual chastisement of that piratical unprincipled State of Algiers, so long the terror of the Mediterranean Commerce, by the splendid bravery of his Majesty's Arms, in conjunction with that of his Allies, presents a further proof of the unabated spirit of our beloved Country, in the common cause of Mankind, which must be highly grateful to the feelings of every loyal heart, and anadditional cause of thankfulness to the great disposer of human events.

"The Marriages which have recently taken place in the Family of our August Sovereign, we in concurrence with all his Majesty's Loyal Subjects rejoice in, humbly trusting that the union of such distinguished Personages may insure to them individual happiness, and to the Nation a fixed and permanent Succession to the Crown.

"We thank your Excellency for directing the Public Accounts to be prepared and laid before us: they shall have our prompt attention, and we beg leave to congratulate your Excellency as well as our Constituents upon the happy circumstance of the Public Debt of this Government being discharged, and the con-

sequent great advancement of its credit.

"We return your Excellency our sincere thanks for the attention you have paid to the Exigencies of this Colony in the present time of scarcity, which has been felt here in some degree in common with our neighbours, and we rejoice in your Excellency's wise determination in avoiding to restrict the operation of Export, being convinced that contrary measures most materially tend to damp the exertions of the *industrious* Agriculturist.

"We fully coincide in the sentiments your Excellency is pleased to express relative to the importance of good Roads and Bridges throughout the Colony; that subject shall claim our early attention, and we trust some improvements may

be made to the present existing Laws on that subject.

"The confidence your Excellency reposes in our judgment regarding the General wants of the Colony, demands our warmest thanks, and we shall accordingly consider and propose the most salutary and efficacious measures which the state of the Country can admit of to promote its general welfare.

" JAMES CURTIS, Speaker.

" Assembly Room, July 9th, 1817."

Ordered, on Motion of Mr. Goff, seconded by Mr. Murray, that a Committee be appointed to wait on his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor to know when he would be pleased to receive the Address of this House, in answer to his Excellence's Speech at the opening of this Session; Mr. Goff, Mr. Murray, Mr. Montgomern, Mr. Nelson, and Dr. Malay, were appointed a Committee for that purpose.

Mr. Goff Chairman of the above Committee, having returned, reported, that they had waited on his Excellency, and that he was pleased to say, he would be

ready to receive the Address, to-morrow, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

The Serjeant at Arms appeared at the Bar, and reported that he had called at the Store of Messrs. Cambridges agreeable to the Order of this House; and that the Clerk in the Store informed him, Mr. Lemuel Cambridge had lest Town for Murray Harbour, and as far as he knew, was to go to Antigonishe, to see about the Ship Mary.

Ordered, on Motion of Dr. M'Aulay, seconded by Mr. Murray, That the High Sheriff be called to the Bar of this House, to give information whether Mr. Cam-

bridge had been duly notified to attend the House:

The Sheriff accordingly appeared at the Bar, and informed the House, that Mr. Cambridge had been duly notified, but had fignified to him, that he could not or would not attend.

Mr. Gardiner, informed the House that being in conversation with Mr. Cam-

bridge some time ago, he told him, he never would attend this Flouse.

Mr. Murray likewise declared, that he heard Mr. Cambridge express himself to that effect, which was also corroborated by the testimony of Mess. Montgomery, Townshend, and Cossin, to all of whom, he had expressed the same sentiments.

Moved by Mr. M'Neill, seconded by Mr. Hyde, that Lemuel Cambridge, Esq. be expelled this House for contemptuous conduct in continually absenting himself without leave from this House, and depriving his Constituents of a Representation.

Moved by Mr. Goff, seconded by Dr. M. Aulay, that the decision of the House upon the Motion of Mr. M. Neill be postponed to a later period of the Session, to give Mr. Cambridge an opportunity of explaining his conduct to the House, The Question being put, the House divided, and there appeared,

For the amendment, Against it, Mr. Goff, Dr. M'Aulay, Mr. Bagnall, Mr. Hyde, Mr. Nelson, Mr. Montgomery, Mr. M'Neill, Mr. M'Larren, Mr. Coffin, Mr. Murray, Mr. Clark, "Mr. Townsend, Mr. Gardiner, Mr. Dockendorff,

So it passed in the affirmative.

Adjourned till 10 o'clock to morrow.

THURSDAY, July 10th, 1817.

THE House met pursuant to adjournment,

On Motion of Mr. Goff, seconded by Mr. Dockendorff, The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House to take into consideration the state of the Colony, and to report the opinion of the Committee relative to existing Laws which require amendment; and of fuch Laws, as appear to them falutary to propose for enacement, (Mr. Goff, in the Chair,) and after some time spent therein, the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported Progress, and asked leave to fit again.

The Honorable Robert Gray, Colonial Treasurer, presented to the House the Public Accounts, from 22d November 1813, to the 10th July 1817, which were ordered to lie on the Table!

On Motion the House again resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House to take into confideration the state of the Colony, &c.' (Mr. Goff, in the Chair) and after some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chair. man reported progress and asked leave to fit again.

The House waited on His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with their Address, and having returned, the Speaker informed the House, that his Excellency had been pleased to make the following Answer, which was read and ordered to be entered on the Journals, viz.

".Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

" THAVE to express my perfect satisfaction at receiving the present dutiful I and Loyal Address; it conveys sentiments of great Political propriety, and I rejoice to find they harmonise so much with mine.

The Committee further state, that two Petitions referred by the House, viz.

That of Laughlin McQuarry, and that of James McNutt, have been confidered, but they deem it their duty to state, that the subject matter of these Petitions, do not properly come under discussion in a Committee on the state of the Colony.

The attention to Public Business, and the disposition to afford pecuniary supply for the exigencies of the Colony, which has been shewn are grounds upon which a well founded hope may rest as to its fu-

ture Prosperity.

"The ample opportunity which has been afforded for examining into the Public Expenditure, must have proved to a demonstration the watchful care with which it has been applied, and cannot but satisfy the most doubtful mind of the certainty there exists of its being equally attended to in future. The objects of Expenditure which have been suggested by both Houses, during the present Session, I am happy to find, are precisely those to which I feel myself most disposed to pay the earliest attention, whenever the means shall exist for the carrying the projected improvements into execution.

"The finally giving sanction to that, which, in consequence thereof, is to pass into a Law, I esteem a most solemn and sacred duty; in all I have done or abstained from doing, on the present occasion, I have allowed myself to be actuated by constitutional principle alone, and I am anxious that it should be publicly understood, that in those instances, in which I have felt it my duty to pause, before giving consent, I am nevertheless highly sensible of the ability and assiduity, which has been exerted in the formation of what has been laid before me, which, when it shall have undergone further modification may meet with my future concurrence.

"I now hasten to pay regard to the reasonable wish expressed by the Lower. House of Assembly, in particular, of being released from further attendance at present, and trust we shall meet again with increased confidence, in the upright intentions of all.
