Congress expires peremptorily by effluxion of time. During the interval there will be much hurrying to add for and during the closing hours some business will be done.

The Senate will have an extra session, also a new Secretary of the Treasury and other fresh appointments. Whether the President will call the extra session of the Fifty-fifth Congress, by calling an extra session of both Houses before December next is a question rather anxiously debated.

One of the exciting topics of the day is the Dependent Pensions Bill, as it has been called, which was vetoed by the President. An attempt was made to pass it over the veto, but it failed.

The House of Representatives passed the bill on Thursday by a vote of 179 to 123 against it. The bill was sustained by the Republicans, and the veto by the Democrats, though there were exceptions.

Senator Ingalls of Kansas, the renowned oil-weller, the son of whose voice caused the British lion to creep into his hole in the ground, is to be President of the Senate pro tem.

What the Senate will do with the Retention Bill, as amended by the House on Wednesday, still remains to be seen. A New York paper says that "there is one consideration which ought to have supreme weight in determining the Senate's decision respecting this measure."

HOW A PLAY IS MOUNTED.

THE WORK OF A THEATRICAL STAFF.

Making a Stage Ready of Manu-... The First Scene—The Property Man's Business—Illustrations—Study of the Parts—The Rehearsal.

Very few of the people who sit in the auditorium of a theatre have any idea of the vast amount of thought and labor that has been expended in obtaining a "smooth" performance.

When a manager has accepted a play and has, with the assistance of his stage manager, his literary adviser and possibly the author, made such alterations as he deems advisable...

After the models have been finally approved the artist submits the stage carpenter, the electrician, the painter, the carpenter and his assistants...

A list of everything required in the play is given to the property man, and it is his duty to make, hire or buy the necessary articles...

The gas and calcium plate stage how much light is required on different parts of the stage or points of action at which those lights are to be changed...

After the parts have been copied out and distributed to the actors and actresses a preliminary rehearsal is held...

As soon as they begin to stumble through their lines by memory—a condition known as being "rough"—the fine details of the "business" are attended to...

At last, if the scenic artist contrives to be ready, there are one or two rehearsals at which everything except the dress of the actors is tried as carefully as a performance.

Probably the rehearsal has been called at 10 p.m. It is very likely nearly a week before it is over. Then the company runs off to get some last trials for costume or "make-up," and are back at the theatre before 7 o'clock.

When the curtain goes up after the performance, when they can generally make a pretty shrewd guess as to whether they have done well or not.
