MR. WELLS KNOWS HOW TO REPLY.

A Pitty Recolider to Mr. Thomson on the Great Question of the Water Front at Toronto.

Editor Wells: In my last letter I quoted a passage from one of Mr. Thomson's letters in which he refers to the "enormous cost of the proposed land dam."

The exaggerated statements which have been so persistently made upon this subject, without foundation and without proof, doubtless made a deep impression upon the public mind, and one of our leading newspapers went so far as to state that over a head bridge would cost nearly two millions of dollars.

I was glad, therefore, to catch Mr. Thomson repeating the statement and with reference to four of these bridges, I said: "It is all very well for Mr. Thomson to talk platitudes about 'enormous land damages,' but in order to bring his case, if possible, to something specific, I challenge him to say what properties would be damaged by the erection of a head bridge."

I knew perfectly well that Mr. Thomson would be unable to do so. He does not attempt it. Why? Because, while the public will often believe the statements which are made, if a specific statement is made which it has some practical knowledge.

Mr. Thomson is still of the opinion that the city should afford to buy the old Great West station at the foot of Yonge-street from the Grand Trunk Company.

Mr. Thomson repeats: "The Joint report says nothing about using the property as a park."
