### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS

ONTARIO.

The unanimity of manufacturers is doing much to keep the white pine lumber market firm. Here and there weak spots are to be found, but the action of the large manufacturers in refusing to yield to any demand for lower prices has made it almost impossible for the market generally to weaken. Purchases of lumber have been made in exceptional cases at reduced prices, the reason for which has been the necessity of the holder to realize rather than a fear that a higher price could not be obtained if he were to hold on until later in the season. By comparison, it seems that prices of white pine lumber are higher in Ontario than in the producing districts of the United States. For instance, 2x12 in 16-foot lengths is selling at Duluth for \$14, whereas some manufacturers on the Georgian Bay are asking \$15 for this class of stock. Inch mill culls range from \$11 to \$12 at the mills, according to the standard of grading adopted by the manufacturer. Good lumber and mill culls are more enquired for than the common grades. A Georgian Bay manufacturer reports that sales this year have been 35 per cent. more than for the same period of last year, and that better prices have been obtained. The mills in that district are finding a market for their stock in the United States. Hemlock lumber is in exceptionally good demand, and is stronger than it has been for years, bringing from \$12 to \$14 per thousand. Reports regarding the hardwood demand are rather contradictory, but the opinion seems to be that the demand is expanding. Basswood is much sought after, and orders for maple are being placed more freely. We would not be surprised if the fall months should witness a brisk demand for hardwood lumber, as the stocks of consumers will by that time have been greatly reduced. Further, the hardwood manufacturers are likely to take out a still smaller quantity of logs during the coming winter than was taken out last season.

### QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Several manufacturers in the eastern provinces report an active demand for pine boards and spruce and pine box shooks, but European specifications are dull and prices comparatively weak. White pine and spruce suitable for the West Indies, South Amer-

ican and other tropical countries, are being purchased quite freely, and the bulk of the stock to be cut for these markets this season has already been contracted for, while buyers are still in the market. A steady trade is doing for local account and for shipment to the Eastern States, where boards and frames are scarce. Cedar shingles are firmer and are referred to at greater length in another column. The latest news from the Upper St. John river is more satisfactory with respect to the lumber drives. Most of the logs that were hung up have reached corporation limits, but the driving this year has been expensive and will compel manufacturers to get pretty high prices for their lumber in order to avoid a loss.

### UNITED STATES.

The white pine market in the Lake Superior district seems to be getting stronger each day. A statement has been compiled by the Mississippi Valley Lumbermen's Association showing that the shipments by seventy-four of the leading white pine concerns of Wisconsin and Minnesota for the first six months of this year were 1,104,205,912 feet, an increase of 200,000,000 feet over the corresponding period last year. This large trade has naturally been conducive of higher prices, and at the present there is every indication of a strong market throughout the season. At Lake Superior buyers are now offering \$14 for 2x12, in lengths from 12 to 16 feet. The only weakness pertains to No. 4 and No. 5 boards, the stock of which is heavier than of the other grades. At eastern distributing centres the volume of business has been restricted by hot weather, but inquiry continues as brisk as at any time within the past two months. Prices are firm all along the line. In the Saginaw valley log run is held at \$18 to \$22, box lumber at \$15 to \$16, and mill culls at \$12. Very little Norway is offering, quotations being \$13 and upwards. The hardwood market shows little improvement. Some lumber is being purchased, but there is no activity. The lower grades of white oak are weaker, as is also thick maple. A scarcity of shingles and lath is reported from Buffalo.

### GREAT BRITAIN.

The year 1901, up to the present, has been one of dullness in the timber trade of Great Britain, and the situation now is somewhat perplexing;

yet we find that the imports of both timber and sawn lumber exceed in quantity those for the corresponding period of 1900. The quantity of sawn lumber imported has been 1,951,522 loads, as compared with 1,565,898 loads for the similar period of last year. The result is that an unusually heavy stock is on the market at the leading importing centres. In London the stock of Baltic and White Sea deals and battens on hand is more than three times as great as it was at this period last year, the increase being 4,841,340 pieces. It may clearly be seen why prices have been depressed and the difficulty of closing contracts at a price which would show a reasonable margin of profit to the shipper on this side. The consumption has been about up to the average, but the import has largely exceeded the demand. The better grades have sold fairly well, but the common grades have been very heavy and may sink to even a lower level. Considering the decline in the price of Baltic lumber, Canadian pine has remained firm. The stocks of regular sizes in London are moderate, and providing that imports are not too heavy, a better tone may be expected later in the season. The tendency of spruce prices has been towards further weakness, and doubt is expressed whether the bottom has yet been reached. Square and waney timber are slow of sale, but there is a good demand for special stock for tool handles, chairs, and wood-working purposes. In the Wanted and For Sale Department of this issue there appears an announcement of a timber merchant who desires to import chair bottoms of birch or other suitable wood.

**STOCKS AND PRICES**

The Str. Sahara left Quebec last week for Greenock, with 2,600 loads of hardwood timber.

The Harris Tie & Timber Co., of Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., have a three years' contract with the C.P.R. for the supply of ties.

Lumber property at Sheet Harbor, N.S., belonging to the Estate of Hon. Thalassa took from the Hastings mill, Montreal recently for \$54,200.

The str. Guernsey, from Portland, is loading a cargo of 2,000,000 feet of

bridge timber at the Hastings mill, Vancouver, to be transported to Vladivostok, to be used in building bridges on the trans-Siberian railway.

Maitland, Rixon & Company recently received a raft of timber from the north shore containing 25,000 pieces, entirely cedar and pine. They are cutting large quantities of cedar timber and have contracts with the Grand Trunk Railway and for harbor improvements.

What is believed to be the last shipment of native-grown walnut was made from Dutton, Ont., a few days ago, when a car of walnut was shipped to England. The timber is said to have been almost equal in size and quality to that grown in the locality many years ago.

At a recent sale held by Churchill & Sim, London, Eng., a small quantity of fourth-quality pine deals from Montreal sold at £9 10 to £10 per standard, and first-quality pine deals, from Quebec, at a range between £11 10s and £15 10s. Spruce deals from St. John, N.B., ranged from £6 10s to £7 5s for mixed specifications. Birch planks brought from 10d to 1s 3d per cubic foot, the latter price for 3" x 12 to 15 ft.

Messrs. Clairmonte, Man & Company, in their Barbadoes market report of July 6th, say: There is still a fair inquiry for white pine lumber, but the demand for spruce has fallen off. There have been three arrivals of white pine during the fortnight, the "Anora" from Annapolis, N.S.; the "Boston Marine," from St. John, N.B.; and the "William S. Green," from Calais. The latest sales for local use have been at the following prices: White pine, merchantable, \$24; second quality, \$19; and a spot sale of a small lot at \$24.05 for boards and \$23.30 for plank. Spruce has sold at \$16.87 for merchantable, \$12.87 for second quality, and \$13 for scantling. Gaspe cedar shingles are in supply and sell at \$3.75 per M, and cedar laying at \$2.27, although the sale is reported of 1,500,000 from Calais at \$1.80.

A fire which is supposed to have started in the engine room destroyed Dyer & Howard's planing mill at Exeter, Ont., on the 3rd inst.; loss \$6,000, no insurance.

For the fourth time in ten years fire has completely destroyed Alfred Dickie's mill at Stewiacke, N.S. The last fire occurred on the afternoon of the 4th inst.

**NEW BRUNSWICK CEDAR SHINGLES.**

Cedar shingles are higher, there can be no doubt about that. It is no longer possible to buy from the smaller mills at less than \$2.85 for extras, on basis of Boston freight, and \$2.85 shingles, we believe, are in short supply at that; in other words, the market is now stiff, with \$2.85 as bottom, when three weeks ago it was weak at \$2.75. It is known that there are but very few shingles at points of manufacture, and that all mills have orders booked for as many or more shingles than they have on hand. All reports from consuming centres indicate light stocks in retail hands, with an extremely good demand for midsummer. Retailers have been waiting for August weather, thinking that prices would then sag off and that they could replenish their broken stocks at their own figures. They are now obliged to admit that shingles are higher instead of lower, and that they may be compelled to pay the manufacturers' price instead of adjusting it to their own ideas. They will be obliged to buy largely inside of six weeks, and if prices continue to stiffen as indications warrant, so that no extras are offered at less than \$3.00, practically the entire retail trade of New England would hasten to place their orders at once for fear of being obliged to pay \$3.25 in the fall. There is nothing that will induce buyers to place large orders like a radical advance in the market. Prices have stiffened enough already to induce a feeling that shingles at present prices may be a good purchase. Another 10 cent advance would insure to a certainty the fact that shingles should be bought now, as present prices are believed to be lower than later quotations will be.

Those manufacturers who are refusing to accept any orders at less than \$3.00 basis, would seem to be showing good sense. It is also believed that if Washington red cedars continue to be as scarce and as high as at present and there seems no

reason for anything else, by October 15th New Brunswick extras will command \$3.15. The attention of manufacturers is called to the fact that three weeks ago we predicted higher prices than were then ruling, and this in the face of the fact that shingles usually weaken in midsummer. We are just as certain now that prices will shortly rule still higher than at present. The present market may be quoted as stiff at following prices, Boston rate of freight Extras, \$2.85 to \$3.00; clears, \$2.60 to \$2.70, 2nd clears, \$2.20 to \$2.30 saps, \$2.00 to \$2.25, extra No 1, \$1.70 to \$1.80.

**FOREIGN MARKETS.**

Messrs. Edmiston & Mitchell, of Glasgow, in their monthly report dated June 20th state:—One of the noticeable features is the shrinkage in stock of waney pine, which is only 2,500 loads, or a half of what it was at 31st March, and considerably less than a third of the stock as at 31st December last. Square pine is also very much reduced, and red pine logs are a third less than at 31st March. Oak logs are less than a half of the stock at that date, while elm is about 450 loads less. The only item in which there has been a very noticeable increase is pitch pine, the stock having doubled itself during the past three months, and now amounts to over two million cubic feet, which is sufficient to supply all probable requirements of the market for a considerable period. In pine deals, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quality are all somewhat heavier than at this time last year, while 4ths are 75 per cent. less. Spruce and red pine deals are much about the same as last year, and the only noticeable exception is pine sidings, which are double what they were a year ago. Business during the last month or two has been on rather a restricted scale while the tendency of prices has been on the whole a downward one. There has been a considerable import of deals, etc., into Glasgow from Montreal, etc., and the

bulk of these shipments has found its way into store. Ruling prices for various kinds of woods imported from Canada are given as follows: Oak (logs)—Really prime large logs are wanted, and for such a good price would be obtainable; for usual class of logs current prices are about 2s. to 2s. 1d. per cubic foot. Planks—Consigned parcels; current prices have been about 1s. 9d. to 1s. 10d. per foot. Quartered oak boards—The current value of 6 inches and up by inch is about 3s. to 3s. 3d., and for 10 inches and up 4s. per foot. In half-inch boards there have been a few sales at from 2d. to 2 1-4 d., and in 5-8 inch from 2 1-2 d. to 3d. per superficial foot. Above quotations are based upon 1's and 2's white oak, there being very little enquiry for red oak.

C. F. McKendrick, lumberman, of Fredericton, N.B., is reported to have assigned.

Joseph Morneau, saw miller, Notre Dame du Lac, Que., has arranged with his creditors to pay 40 cents on the dollar.

The assignment is reported of Charles LeBreton, of Tracadie, N.B., who has conducted a general store and lumber business.
