MINING IN THIS PROVINCE

Commercial Value of Hastings Cor-
undum

As Computed by Government Offi-
cials—Report of the Ontario Bureau

of Mines—Mineral Yield of
the Province for First Six Months
of 1898—Lily May Deal.

Director of the Ontario Bureau of

Mines has given out Part III. of his much
appreciated serial report for 1898. In a
preliminary note Mr. Blue gives a table show-
ing the output of the various metalliferous
mines of the province for the six months
ending June 30, this year, together with the
total output for 1897. The table reads:

Comparing the second three months of the

present year with the first three months of

1898, there is a considerable falling off in the

production of gold, a result of unfavorable

circumstances. The Regina mine was closed

down on April 1, in order that a 30-stamp

mill might be erected to replace the former

10-stamp mill; it is expected that the new

mill will be completed during the present

month. The Foley mill has been

shut down, pending the transfer of

the property to the English grad-

ing. The Doro mill was destroyed by

fire about three months ago, but it is un-

derstood that a mill of much larger capac-

ity will be built in its stead. These circum-

stances account for the lessened gold pro-

duction of the province during the second

quarter of the year. It is noteworthy, how-

ever, that the value of all metal pro-

ducts for the first six months of this year

(\$ 89 cent. of the value of products for

the whole of last year.

Eastern Ontario Corundum.

Extensive reports are submitted regard-

ing the corundum deposits of Eastern Onta-

rio, and the following general conclu-

sions are appended:

"It thus appears that the market price of

corundum runs steady at 7 cents per

pound, and of emery at 3 1/2 cents per pound.

From the conditions under which the Has-

tings county corundum is found it may be

stated that the cost of mining on a suffi-

ciently large scale should apparently not ex-

ceed \$1 per ton. The cost of milling should

be considerably less than \$1 per ton of

crude rock. Taking the average percentage

found by practical concentration, viz., 14.67

per cent., this would yield 286.4 lbs. of

corundum per ton. It is evident that the

corundum could be mined and milled at a

cost so low as not only to compete easily

with the present output of that article, but

could compete successfully with emery,

even if the price of emery should be re-

duced to the present rate. It is therefore

concluded that the cost of mining on a

scale of 100 tons of rock daily. Small

plants would meet the requirements of

the market, and the cost of production

might lead to financial disaster. Practical

tests of wheels made from this corundum

showed a thorough investigation into the

market has been made, and a prelimi-

nary to any consideration of operating

mines and mills on the Ontario deposits."

one of the principal stockholders, is in charge

of the property for the new owners. He has

been instructed to let contracts at once for

the wood and other supplies needed around

the property and to call for tenders for sink-

ing the shaft 100 feet deeper.

Our own home harvest looks like being secured in excellent condition, the courage of holders of wheat notes and any other who hear that Lincolnshire farmers are offering their bread wheat at 25s per 504 lbs. This is equal to about 25s 9d for American quarter of 480 lbs.

Wheat in France.
The Corn Trade News shows that the net deliveries of wheat and flour for consumption in France for the year ending July 31, 1898, amounted to 81,744,000 bushels, of which 41,702,000 bushels, or over one-half, were taken in the three months of May, June and July. The Minister of Agriculture estimated that nearly 30 million bushels of wheat were carried over from crop of 1897, 244 million bushels. The stocks of foreign and domestic wheat at harvest of 1898 were reduced to a minimum. It is evident that notwithstanding the high prices of 1897-98, the consumption of wheat was about of average quantity. This is the same experience as in 1891-92, a former year of poor wheat crop and high prices.

Primary Market Receipts.
The deliveries of wheat at the primary markets in the west during last week amounted to 6,468,785 bushels, as compared with 6,098,748 bushels in corresponding year 1897. The deliveries of flour were 22,450 barrels larger than last year.

In Nebraska.
The Nebraska Grain Dealers' Association makes the wheat crop of that State from 45 to 55 million bushels. The Washington estimate in August was 32,000,000 bushels.

Grain and Produce Markets.
Chicago wheat puts to-day 6 1/2c, calls 6 3/4c. On the Liverpool board to-day spot red winter wheat declined 1/4d per cent; this month's delivery, stationary and the December option dropped 1/4d. Maize fell 1/4d to 1/2d per cent at Liverpool to-day. Lard is 6d lower in Liverpool. Pigs rose 1/4d in Liverpool.

India wheat shipments the past week 12,000 quarters. Russian shipments the past week were: Wheat 137,000 quarters, maize 31,000. Danish shipments the past week: Wheat 100 quarters, maize 54,000 quarters.

Imports into the United Kingdom the past week: Wheat 226,000 quarters, maize 280,000 quarters, flour 150,000 bags.

Big Crop in Australia.
Sydney, N.S.W., Sept. 5.—The area sown to wheat in New South Wales is shown by complete reports to be 1,500,000 acres, which is an increase of 20 per cent. The area devoted to that product last season. It is estimated that the total yield will be 15,000,000 bushels, which will allow of substantial exports.
