ALDERMEN STAY BY CHIEF AGAINST FIREMEN'S UNION

Board of Trade Representatives Say It Would Increase the Insurance Rates—Fire and Light Committee Send a Recommendation to the Council.

"We recommend to the City Council that the chief of the fire brigade be instructed and authorized to take such action as he considers wise, having in view the public interest and the efficiency of the fire department." The above is the declaration of the Fire and Light Committee in regard to the trouble over the firemen forming a union, which is strongly opposed. Ald. Spence fathered the motion, and he was supported by Ald. Lynd, Fleming and Ramsden.

Ald. Bell and S. W. Burns opposed it. This leaves the matter to the City Council as a whole to say what shall be done with the recommendation, and it is easy to anticipate a number of aldermen worrying quite a little bit as to whether they must stand out for the efficiency of the fire department or consider the interests of the firemen as a union. The firemen would only tend to cause a rise in the insurance rates and the fire brigade as well.

Industrial Protests.
When the Fire and Light Committee assembled yesterday afternoon there was every sign of a quiet session to take up the estimates and report in regard to the fire department. A deputation from the Board of Trade was present to consider the firemen, and they made a good case, particularly pointing out that it might mean a raise of 25 per cent. in insurance rates on about \$50,000,000 worth of property.

Later on representatives of the various unions happened in, and their side of the case was heard, but they were not sufficiently persuasive to persuade the majority of the committee that the union should be endorsed.

Some of the aldermen were perceptibly dubious when it came to a vote on Ald. Spence's motion to recommend to Council that the chief of the fire brigade should have control of his men. They looked sheepishly at the big labor deputation which had been invited to attend a mainly stand and expressed their plain and sensible. Ald. Lynd, however, was not so easily satisfied.
