RUSSIAN DEFEAT AT NEUCHANG

FORTS DISMANTLED BRIGANDS INFEST LIANGTUNG PENINSULA

Lioutung Peninsula—Japs Sweeping Onward.

Newchwang, May 8.—There is every indication that the Russians have decided to evacuate Newchwang. Troops have been leaving here all day long. Forts have been dismantled, and all artillery has been placed on board trains. All the local transportation has been commandeered by the Russian authorities.

There is current here a native rumor that Japanese troops are in Poochau Bay on the west coast of the Liangtung Peninsula and about 60 miles north of Port Arthur, but this report lacks confirmation.

The fear is held here that if the Russians leave and the Japanese do not at once take possession of Newchwang, the brigands, who are now pillaging the place, will not only pillage the place, but will also capture the forts and the guns.

The Russian consul has requested that a gunboat be sent to Newchwang. The Japanese probably will destroy the gunboat. It is reported that the Japanese troops fired on what probably was the last train out of Port Arthur as it passed near Port Adams. They used artillery and small arms and killed or wounded several Chinese.

It is reported here that Viceroy Alexief was slightly wounded prior to his departure from Port Arthur. He barely escaped from the Japanese. The Japanese closed the lines of communication. 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WAR BULLETINS.

Vienna, May 8.—Alarming rumors regarding the internal condition of Russia are current here. A conspiracy is said to have been discovered in Russia in Poland, with the object of the overthrow of the government. It is reported that the conspirators have taken place in Finland, and an infernal machine is said to have been found in the Winter Palace in one of the czar's living rooms.

St. Petersburg, May 7.—The Vladivostok says that the garrison of Cronstadt was recently summoned to extinguish a fire of wood and shavings in the fortress, which was blazing near where pyroxyline and shells were stored. It was afterward discovered that the shavings had been soaked with petroleum.

Shanghai, May 8.—It is reported that the Japanese captured Tallenwan yesterday. Tallenwan, which the Russians call Dalny, is on the eastern shore of the Liangtung Peninsula, just above Port Arthur. The position of the Russians has been to maintain a garrison in the center. To that end they spent over \$20,000,000 in building docks and warehouses there. The bay is deep and well protected from storms.

NEWS OF DEFEATS DEPRESSES RUSSIANS HEAR OF REVERSES

Fall of Fengwangcheng and Loss of 2397 at Yalu Battle Makes St. Petersburg Sad.

St. Petersburg, May 8.—Two official despatches calculated to increase the depression existing among all circles in Russia were given out last night. From the point of view of the progress of the campaign the most important is the news that the Japanese have captured the fortress of Fengwangcheng, which is situated on the Yalu river, about 100 miles from Port Arthur. The second despatch concerns the killed, wounded and missing among the troops under the command of Lieut.-Gen. Zassalitch as the result of the fighting on the Yalu, the number of which totals 2397 officers and men.

Gen. Kurupatkin forwarded a message from Lieut.-Gen. Zassalitch, who has been left in command of the Russian forces here, will not talk of the situation for fear that they may impart some information. They do not seem to be subjecting to a maltreatment at the hands of the brigands.
