HE City of St. Catharines, the county seat of Lincoln, is beautifully situated on a level plateau, below the mountain, and is the centre of one of the most fertile and thickly settled agricultural districts of the Province. It is the principal point on the Welland Canal, which unites the great chain of lakes, and forms an unbroken line of communication by water from Lake Superior to the Atlantic seaboard. It is distant from Toronto, by water, 33 miles; by rail, 72 miles; from Hamilton, 32 miles; from Niagara Falls, 12 miles; from Buffalo, 35 miles, and from Rochester, 87 miles.

The business streets are lined with many fine blocks and stores, devoted to the varied departments of trade and commerce, while numerous elegant mansions adorn the subur-

ban portions.

A street railway connects the city with Merriton, from whence it is intended to extend it on to Thorold. A branch of this road is also being constructed from St. Paul street down Geneva to the Welland Railway station. A good system of water works supplies the inhabitants with an abundant quantity of pure, wholesome water, for household purposes, while for emergencies of fire, hydrants have been constructed at convenient points on the principal streets. The reservoir is erected above Decew Falls, on the brow of the mountain, about four miles distant.

St. Catharines contain a number of fine public buildings, among which may be mentioned the Town Hall, an elegant cut-stone building, erected at a cost of \$16,000, having a large uniform addition, used as a Court House and county offices, the aggregate cost of the building being about \$32,000; St. Joseph's Convent, the Protestant Home and Refuge, Marine Hospital, the Allan Block, Grand Central

block, Broadway block, Masonic Temple, with many others of lesser note. The churches of the city, 12 in number, representing the usual phases of religious belief, are mostly substantial brick or stone edifices, ornaments to the city, and finished after the modern styles of church arthitecture. The school buildings are also substantial brick structures, and comprise a collegiate institute, central school, and six ward schools, thoroughly officered, with an efficient corps of teachers, and liberally patronized. There are besides, five separate schools and the St. Joseph's convent, which are also well sustained.

St. Joseph's Convent, located on the corner of Church and James streets, was erected in 1874, at a cost of over \$20,000. It is an elegant white brick building, consisting of three storeys, mansard roof and stone basement. There are 17 sisters in connection with the Convent, who are employed in teaching the Separate schools. An academy for young ladies is also sustained, with an average attendance

of 70 pupils.

The Protestant Home and Refuge on Ontario street, near Welland Avenue, is a handsome brick building, of four storeys, designed for the purpose of affording a temporary refuge for the homeless and destitute. The building was erected in 1877, and opened in November of that year. The site for the building was the gift of Thos. R. Merritt, Esq., who also contributed \$1000 toward the erection of the building, which was supplemented by other liberal contributions of the citizens generally. The institution continues to be supported by private donations and the usual Gov ernment grant, and is under an efficient management of leading ladies of the city. At the time of our visit the Home contained 26 inmates.

The St. Catharines General and Marine Hospital on Queenston Street is the noble outgrowth of a movement started in 1865 by Dr. Mack and others by the collection of subscriptions of from five to fifty cents each for the establishment of what was termed a "Cottage Hospital." These sums were subsequently augmented by the proceeds of bazaars and public entertainments, liberal donations from charitable societies and private individuals, and finally by Government grants, until in 1870 the present eligible site

was purchased and a suitable building erected. The hospital is fitted up with all modern improvements and conveniences adapted to the nursing of the sick, several hundred of whom are treated annually. In connection with the hospital is a training school for nurses which has

proved an important auxiliary.

Several of the manufacturing industries are also of an extensive character, prominent among which may be mentioned the "St. Catharines Saw Works," a substantial stone building, employing from 50 to 75 hands; the knife works of the "Whitman & Barnes Manufacturing Co.," employing from 70 to 80 hands, the axe and edge tool manufactory of the "Welland Vale Manufacturing Co.," employing 85 hands; the extensive flouring mills of James Norris, Esq., and S. Neelon, M.P.P. and others of lesser note, a fuller description of which will be found under the head of *Principal Manufactories*.

Several first-class hotels, notably the Welland House, Murray House, Russell House, International and Grand Central, with others of more humble pretensions, supply all the comforts of a home to the traveling public. Besides these there are also two of the largest hotels in the Province, viz., the Hotel Springbank and the Stephenson House, which were erected for the convenience of tourists and invalids who flock hither each summer to avail themselves of the waters of the mineral springs, the healing qualities

of which are renowned throughout the continent.

The enterprise of ship building is one of considerable importance to St. Catharines, although the commercial depression of the last few years has to some extent affected this branch of industry. A very large number of lake vessels and steamers are owned here, and there is no doubt that with the completion of the new canal this important enterprise will be still more largely extended.

The city supports two ably managed daily papers, viz., the News and the Journal, both of which are liberally

patronized.

In her railway facilities and water communication St. Catharines is rendered easy of access from all points. The Great Western Railway passes through the city from east to west, and is intersected by the Welland Railway, run-

ning north and south, parallel with the canal, from lake to lake, connecting with the main line of the G. W. R., the Canada Southern, the G. W. R. Air Line and the Grand Trunk, while by means of the canal the traveler can go or come by steamer in any direction. A daily line of steamers connects the city with all upper and lower ports, while daily communication is also had by steamer with Toronto

during the season of navigation.

The land upon which St. Catharines now stands was owned at one time by a Captain Robinson, who was commander of a vessel on Lake Ontario. The town took its name from his widow, who brought this with other property to her second husband, the Hon. Robert Hamilton, from whom it was purchased by the Hon. Mr. Merritt. The conveyance from the Hamiltons bears date the 27th of March, 1816. It would appear from official returns that during a period of forty years, from 1784 to 1824, the year in which the canal was commenced, the population of the township of Grantham did not increase more than one dozen families, the returns showing that in 1784 the township contained 236 heads of families, while in 1824 it contained 248 heads. The amount which Mr. Merritt agreed to pay for a large portion of the land on which St. Catharines now stands was \$6,000. In the year 1819 St. Catharines was visited by a severe conflagration, which swept away the forest and such buildings and inflammable material as were within reach. At this period money was much more difficult to obtain than it is now, trade and commerce being carried on almost exclusively by bartering produce for merchandise, and vice versa. So scarce indeed was the circulating medium that the proprietor of the first team of horses owned in the neighborhood, failed in raising \$1.50 on a load of oats, with which to pay the taxes assessed against his property. The property comprising the land between King, Church, Queen and Academy streets, was, the year before the canal was commenced, offered to a man then carrying on business, in exchange for a suit of clothing and a barrel of whiskey, and declined. Now the sameproperty is worth about a million of dollars.

CORPORATION BOUNDARIES.

The City of St. Catharines is divided into Six Wards, as follows:—

1. St. Thomas' Ward; 2. St. Andrew's Ward; 3. St. George's Ward; 4. St. Paul's Ward; 5. St. Patrick's Ward; 6. St. James' Ward; and these are severally divided and bounded as follows:—

St. Thomas' Ward contains all that portion of the city lying within the following limits: Commencing at a point where the centre line of the Welland Avenue intersects with the production of the centre line of William Street; thence south forty degrees east on centre line of William Street, to the Montebello Gardens, thence across the Montebello Gardens to the centre of William Street, as it exists east of Lake Street, thence south easterly on centre line of William Street to St. Paul Street; thence across St. Paul Street to the centre line of an alley passing between the lands of E. McArdle and John Crysler; thence south-easterly on the same course as the southerly side of E. McArdle's brick block, abutting said line across the Canal, to southerly side of Welland Canal lands; thence on a southerly direction on limit of Canal lands to southerly boundary of the Hon. J. R. Benson's property; thence in a south-easterly direction on the said southerly boundary of the Hon. J. R. Benson's property, to allowance for road between Lots 16 and 17 of the Township of Grantham, thence south on west limit of said road to the south-east angle of Lot number 17 in the 7th Concession of Grantham; thence westerly along the road allowance between Concessions 7 and 8, to the south-west angle of Lot No. 20 in the 7th Concession; thence north along the road allowance, between Lots Nos. 20 and 21, following the road to its intersection with the production of Welland Avenue, across the Canal; thence easterly along Welland Avenue to the place of beginning.

St. Andrew's Ward contains all that portion of the city lying within the following limits; Commencing at a point where the centre line of Tames Street intersects the centre line of Welland Avenue, thence south sixty-five degrees west on centre line of Welland Avenue to its intersection with the production of the centre line of William Street,

thence south forty degrees east on the centre line of William Street to the Montebello Gardens, thence across the Montebello Gardens to the centre line of William Street as it exists east of Lake Street, thence south-easterly on centre line of William Street to St. Paul Street, thence across St. Paul Street to the centre line of an alley passing between the lands of E. McArdle and John Crysler, thence south-easterly on the same course as the northerly side of E. McArdle's brick block abutting said line, across the Canal to the southerly side of the Welland Canal lands, thence in a southerly direction on limit of Canal lands to southerly boundary of Hon. James R. Benson's property; thence in a south easterly direction on the said southerly boundary of the Hon. James R. Benson's property to the allowance for road between Lots 16 and 17, Grantham; thence north on west limit of said allowance for road to a point fifteen chains south of the northern limit of the 7th Concession of Grantham, thence north sixty-five degreeseast to centre of said allowance for road, thence north on centre of said Government allowance for road to the north limit of the Welland Canal lands, thence westerly on said north limit of Canal lands to the west boundary of what was formerly known as Sanderson Lot, thence north fortysix degrees to the westerly limit of said Sanderson Lot to St. Paul Street, thence to the centre of James Street at its junction with St. Paul Street, thence north-westerly on centre line of James Street, to the place of beginning.

St. George's Ward contains all that portion of the city lying within the following limits: Commencing at the intersection of the centre line of the Government allowance for road between lots number 16 and 17 of Grantham, known as Geneva street, with centre line of Welland Avenue, thence south sixty-five degrees west on centre line of Welland Avenue, until it intersects the production of the centre line of James street, thence along the centre line of James street to St. Paul Street, thence to a point on the southerly side of St. Paul Street, where it is intersected by the westerly limit of what was formerly known as the Sanderson Lot, thence south forty-six degrees east on the westerly limit of the Sanderson Lot to the Welland Canal lands, thence easterly along the northerly limit of the Welland Canal

lands to the centre of the allowance for road between lots 16 and 17 of Grantham, thence north on centre line of said Government allowance for road to the place of beginning.

St. Paul's Ward contains all that portion of the city lying within the following limits: Bounded on the west by the centre line of allowance for road between lots 16 and 17 of the Township of Grantham; on the north by the centre line of Welland Avenue to the Welland Railway; on the north-easterly and easterly by the Welland Railway, and the west side of Township lot 12; and on the south by the city limits.

St. Patrick's Ward contains all that portion of the city lying west of the Welland Railway, and north of the centre line of Welland Avenue.

St. James' Ward contains all that portion of the city lying east and north of the Welland Railway.

Each of these Wards return three Aldermen to the City Council. For this current year the Council is composed as follows:



Mr. A's Reason:

Were I sure of living 20 to 25 years, I would even then insure, as my cash premiums, otherwise uvested, would have to be improved at six to seven per cent. compound-interest to equal the faze of my policies. This interest is over three times the average compound-interest-increase of values in this country. In the event of earlier death there can be no investment for my family or estate in the mercantile world, that can, in any way, compare with my \$65,000 of life insurance.

Mr. B's Reason:

With my life insurance, I have solved the greatest problem of life—how to be truly happy.

Mr. F's Reason:

I am one of the partners in a young, but rapidly growing and successful each of my two partners, insured to the full amount of our respective interests in the firm Should one of us die, the firm is not crippled by the withdrawal of a partner's interest. Forth first ten years we charge the premiums to expense account; after that period is passed, the policies revert to our families.

Mr. G's Reason:

It costs me \$3,000 per year to support my family. To make this support interest on that amount of money, which would give them the needed \$3,000 per annun. We premiums are now less than \$1,100 per year and decreasing; and by one or more payment during life, as the case may be, I secure \$3,000 annually for my family, for an unlimited time I cannot see how duty and investment can be more happily blended.

Mr. I's Reason:

Sensible people universally insure against loss from fire, and are perfectly satisfied that the premiums paid year after year are never returned to them. In a mutual life insurance company, all premiums are returned with a high rate of interest at some time, for death is certain. Besides, the monetary value of my life to my family, in what I daily produce for them, is worth far more than houses, store or goods, saying nothing of the fact that there are about five chances of my dying during the year to one of my house or store burning.

Mr. J's Reason:

Vanderbilt during this conversation. Now, I (Vanderbilt) like you, and like your family, and I would not like to see them suffer through any mistake of yours. Now, I will loan you \$50,000 for their own use at your death, if you will pay me an average of, say 2} per cent. interest annually—a little higher on the start, but decreasing year by year: and you need never repay me the \$50,000—all I want is this low rate of interest: and I will further say that you need not pay the interest only while you are alive to earn it. If, however, you fail in business and cannot pay this interest longer, why it will be all right—a proportion of the \$50,000 loan will be your family's anyway. Do you desire to borrow \$50,000 to \$75,000 on these conditions?" This was only one way of putting several life insurance arguments, all of which were unanswerable—hence my carrying \$60,000 in three companies.

Mr. K's Reason:

In 1873, with my business affairs decidedly unsettled, I became suddenly and seriously ill. My two eldest sons were at Ann Arbor, and my two daughters at Vasarr. In my enfeebled condition the thoughts of what my wife would do, and how my children would take it to have all the plans of their future life changed, their education unfinished, with a hundred other fears that I had never thought of till then, nearly drove me crazy. I believe many aman in the condition I then was is killed by these very troubles; and, I believe that had I been insured to the amount I now carry, the only severe illness of my life would have been of a day or two only, instead of a drag of weary weeks, and the loss of thousands of dollars consequent upon it. As soon as I became strong enough for the medical examinations. I insured for the amount I now carry. You may think it large, but it's good medicine for very sick men.

Mr. L's Reason:

From 1864 to '68 I insured my life for \$25,000. Had I been compelled to take paid-up insurance at the time of my financial troubles two years ago, my family would have had nearly \$9,000. Had I not taken this \$25,000 life insurance when I did, I would have had nothing to show for it—the premiums paid to the companies would have gone as everything else went. Mr. N's Reason:

I carry life insurance because every prominent banker, manufacturer, merchant, lawyer or clergyman that I know is heavily insured. These men know a great deal more than I do. The man who decries life insurance places himself on record as against the judgment of the best financial brains of the country.

Mr. O's Reason:

Life insurance offers to every man a fortune "on time," and non-forfeitable at that. My \$61,00 in life insurance cost me on the average \$134,00 per month the past year. I am purchasing this fortune in this easy manner for a special purpose—my family, the settlement of my estate, and for some of my clerks who have been in my employ over five years. One payment secured the fortune—though I owe some decreasing payments on it, which, however, are to cease at my death

Mr. P's Reason:

The annual interest on the amount of my life insurance will give my family m income nearly equal to my salary, which has been a large one for years. We cannot save and live as we desire; and I have taken this plan to live as well as the best and die wealthy.

The plan is a good one for every man whose profession is his capital or for any salaried man without exception.

Mr. Q's Reason:

Real estate that cost me \$88,000 has depreciated to below \$50,000 since 183 My \$50,000 in life insurance cost me nothing but the asking, is not subject to depreciation, and the annual premiums are less than the taxes upon the real estate. Considering the first cost of the two investments. I believe I would rather have the life insurance.

Mr. R's Reason:

It is my desire to endow certain educational institutions with a liberal sum of money at my death. It is better to leave \$75,000 of my wealth in this shape than in any other no one

Mr. T's Reason:

I have just been placed upon my feet again by friends who have confidence in me and to whom I owe a good deal of money. They believe they are perfectly safe if I live, and I intend they shall be safe should I die—hence I carry life insurance in my own name to the entire amount of my indebtedness.

Mr. U's Reason:

The tendency of the races of interest is downward. We cannot secure the same rates that we could a few years since, while the trouble of investing, danger from loss etc., remains the same. The endowment policies of the best companies give me a good compound interest. When you take into consideration the taxes, repairs, fire manrance, bad debis, attorneys fers, etc., on ordinary investments, the endowment policy investment is not a bad one. As you have a life insurance in addition, this endowment plan commends itself as a most excellent investment, and gives a rate of interest sufficiently high for any safe and can thous men to ask

Mr. V's Reason:

It took nearly three years and quite fifty life insurance agents to make m see the benefits of my first \$5,000 endowment policy. Since then I have taken \$17,000 on the same time. I am simply purchasing gold coin or U.S. bonds on 20 years' time, with interest allowed on my payments—i.e., I am paying for \$52,000, a much less amount—the difference being a good interest on my twenty payments. My life is also insured for \$72,000 from the date of the first payments; and should I fail to keep up my policies, a large propertion of the amount is secure. I don't ask any better plan for obtaining \$52,000 than this.

Mr. W's Reason:

My experience is my capital—that is, my business is a very remunerative one, because I thoroughly understand the management of it. In the event of my decease, I doubt if my sons could manage the business without more capital. This I have supplied by my I fe insurance.

Mr. X's Reason:

After 18 years of hard work my family is without the home I would like them to have. The life companies offer to provide this home-purchasable with the amount of my life insurance—if I pay about the annual taxes on it in premiums while living, even if but a year tonger—I think most men should accept homes to be paid for in this way.

Mr. Y's Reason:

Life insurance averages the savings and wealth of the nation. I insurance upon principle—If all men were to insure for such amounts as they could easily carry, poverty would be greatly lessened, home conforts would be common to the masses, and minds endowed by nature for grand pursuits in life, could be educated to successfully follow them. A miversal life insurance would secure and promote a universal progress. The extreme temperance advocate would compel the adoption by the peopl of his principles through legal massures. I would compel by legal enactment a sure provision for every family by the system of non-forfeitable mutual life insurance.

Mr. Z's Reason:

I insured largely because, while there are very many reasons why I should do so, there is not one reason why I should not—at least I could never and one that an intelligent at d experienced life insurance man could not utterly demolish in three minutes. Without life insurance, we fail to appreciate it; with it, we would not be without it



MERRITTON.

THE Village of Merritton is situated on the Welland Canal, immediately adjoining the City of St. Catharines, its south boundary adjoining the corporate limits of the Town of Thorold. It owes its origin to the excellent water privilege afforded by the waste water from the Welland Canal, which has been utilized to a large extent by the erection of a considerable number of manufacturing establishments, several of them being among the largest manufactories in the Dominion, chief among which may be mentioned the Merritton Paper Mill, the largest paper mill in Canada, employing 130 hands; the Lybster Cotton Mills, employing 250 hands; the Lincoln Paper Mill, the Canada Wheel Works, the extensive lumber mills of N. & O. J. Phelps and McLeary & McLean, besides other industries of more humble dimensions. These industries give employment to about 1,000 operatives.

The Village has a healthy, steady growth, and now

contains a population of 2000.

The Great Western and Welland Railways pass through the Village, which, with the facilities of the Welland Canal, brings it within easy communication with all parts of the country. A street railway also connects it with St. Catharines, and a stage running in connection with the same, connects it with Thorold.

The spiritual interests of the population are supplied through the medium of four church organizations, viz., Methodist, Presbyterian, Episcopalian, and Roman Catholic, each possessing a neat frame church edifice. The

schools also are flourishing and well sustained.

A handsome village hall was erected in 1850, at a cost of \$4,500. It is a fine stone building, two storey and basement, and contains, on the main floor, a council room, offices for the police magistrate and village clerk, and a room designed for the accommodation of a fire engine. The upper floor is fitted up as a public hall, while the basement is used as a lock-up.

The Village was named after the Hon. Wm. Hamilton

PRINCIPAL MANUFACTORIES.

The Lybster Cotton Manufacturing Co. was incorporated 10 or 12 years ago. Capital \$250,000. The Company employs 250 hands, 261 looms and 11,500 spindles in the manufacture of sheetings, checked and striped shirtings, tickings and Denims, turning out from 225,000 to 250,000 yards per month. This is the pioneer cotton mill of the Dominion, and the first mill in Canada that manufactured tickings and Denims.

The Canada Wheel Works were established in 1867. Capital between \$30,000 and \$40,000. Thirty hands are employed in the manufacture of carriage wood work of all descriptions. H. Patterson & Co.

The Merritton Paper Mills have been established 18 years, and employ 130 hands in the manufacture of printing and wrapping papers, bags &c., turning out eight tons of paper per day. These are the largest paper mills in the Dominion. J. Riordon.

The saw mill of McCleary & McLean has been established over 30 years, and employs from 15 to 20 hands.

The Merritton Foundry and Machine Shop has been established two years, and employs from 10 to 12 hands in general machine work. James Wilson.

The Merritton Cotton Mills employ 100 hands in the manufacture of cotton bags, warps, yarns, twines, battings, waddings, colored shirtings &c. King & Dolan.

The Lincoln Paper Mills were established in 1877. Fifty hands are employed in the manufacture of manilla paper, white print, paper bags &c., turning out two tons of paper and 50,000 grocer's bags and flour sacks daily.

The Merritton Woolen Mills were established in 1857, and employ from eight to ten hands in the manufacture of all kinds of woolen goods and yarn. W. V. Disher.

The saw mill of N. & O. J. Phelps has been established 22 or 23 years, and employs 25 hands, turning out 5,000,000 feet of lumber, besides lath and shingles, annually.

The Merritton Mills (flouring) were established in 1845. There are two runs of stones, with a capacity of 125 barrels a day. W. B. Smyth.

PORT DALHOUSIE.

THE Village of Port Dalhousie is prettily situated on a level plateau overlooking Lake Ontario, and is distant four miles from St. Catharines, thirty-one miles from Toronto, by water, and seventy-six by rail. The Welland Canal here empties its waters into the Lake. It is also the northern terminus of the Welland Railway, which here has a large elevator, with a storage capacity of 100,000 bushels. The waste water from the Canal affords a first-class water privilege, but it is not utilized very extensively. There are, however, two flouring mills run by this agency. The most important manufacturing industry is the ship yard of A. Muir & Bros., which employs a large force of men.

The harbor is safe and commodious, and here vessels may find refuge in all seasons. During the season of navigation daily communication is had with Toronto by steamboat, running in connection with the Welland Railway.

The village is well laid out, and contains a number of fine residences and many comfortable houses. There are several substantial church buildings, the school accommodations are ample and the schools well sustained. A handsome brick schoolhouse was erected in 1877, which is an ornament to the village and a credit to the citizens.

The village was named after Lord Dalhousie, in commemoration of his exertions in behalf of the Welland Canal. It was incorporated in 1863 and has a population of 1,200.



THOROLD.

THE Town of Thorold is admirably situated on the brow of the mountain, four miles distant from St. Catharines, and commands a fine view of Lake Ontario and the surrounding country for at least 20 miles. It is distant from Welland, the county seat, 12 miles; from Niagara Falls, 8 miles; from Buffalo, 32 miles; from Toronto, 75 miles; and from Hamilton, 36 miles. It is regularly laid out, and contains a number of excellent business blocks and many handsome residences. Being on the Welland Canal, the hydraulic power thus afforded has been taken advantage of to some extent in the erection of a number of mills and factories, which, considering the advantages afforded for manufacturing enterprise, might be increased indefinitely, as the water power is practically unlimited.

The Welland Railway passes through the town, and connects with the G. W. R. at Merritton, one mile distant; and with the C. S. R., G. W. Air Line, and G. T. R. on the south; thus, with the canal, affording every facility for shipment. An omnibus line also connects the town with the St. Catharines Street Railway at Merritton. It is intended to extend the street railway to Thorold the present

year (1881).

There are four churches in the town, viz: Presb., Cath., Meth. and Epis., all substantial buildings, handsomely finished and comfortably furnished.

The school facilities consist of a high school and two ward schools, all good brick buildings, well officered and

liberally patronized.

The High School is a handsome two-storey brick building, occupying a prominent position on elevated ground, and is well fitted up with every appurtenance necessary to institutions of this character. The building was erected in 1875, at a cost of \$5,000. The grounds are over two acres in extent and are to be handsomely laid out with lawns, shrubbery, &c.

St. Joseph's Convent, on Mill street, is also a fine brick building, two-storeys in height, and is in charge of

the Sisters of St. Joseph, who are employed in teaching the Separate schools, visiting the sick, &c.

The *Press* is represented by the *Thorold Post*, a well conducted and influential weekly paper, published by Mr. W. H. Bone.

The population of Thorold numbers about 3,500.

Services at 10:30 a.m. and 7 p.m. Sunday school at 2:30 p.m. Prayer meeting on Thursday. There are 150 members. Rev. W. R. Parker, M. A., pastor. The Society also owns a comfortable brick parsonage, with half an acre of ground, on the corner of Pine and Metcalfe streets.

THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH is a brick building, seating 260. It was erected in 1859. Services at 10,30 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sunday school at 2.30 p. m. Prayer meeting on Thursday. There are 180 members. Rev. C. D. McDonald.

The Roman Catholics are erecting a commodious church edifice, dedicated to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, at an expense of about \$14,000. The building is of stone, 116 x 50 feet in dimensions, exclusive of the tower, and will have a seating capacity of 700. The walls are completed, and it is expected to be opened for public worship in the fall of the present year (1881). In the meantime services are held in the old church, adjoining, at 8.30 a. m. and 11 a.m. in winter, vespers at 4 p.m. In summer at 8.00 a. m. and 10.30 a.m. vespers at 7.30 p.m. Sunday school at 3 p.m. There are about 200 families. PRINCIPAL MANUFACTORIES.

The Thorold Foundry was established in 1859, and employs 25 hands in the manufacture of agricultural implements and general machine work. A. Dobbie.

The Thorold Planing Mill has been established six or eight years, and employs from 10 to 12 hands in the manufacture of sash, doors, blinds, and a general building business. R. Commarford.

The Fife Mills (flouring) have been established 15 years. There are three runs of stones, with a capacity of 1,000 barrels a week. John Band.

The Thorold Grist Mill has been established 10 or 12 years. There are two runs of stones, with a capacity of from 200 to 300 bushels daily. D. Cooper & Son.

The Thorold Basket Manufactory, just established, will employ from 30 to 40 hands in the manufacture of fruit, market and other baskets, cheese boxes &c. Williams & Housser.

The cooperage of Thos. Bell has been established 15 or 20 years, and employs five or six hands in the manufac-

ture of flour, cement and fruit barrels.

The Thorold Pottery has been established over thirty years, and employs four or five hands in the manufacture of all kinds of earthenware, sewer pipes, &c. Matthew Booth.

The Welland Mills (flouring,) have been established thirty-five years. There are seven runs of stones, with a capacity of 250 barrels a day. Howland & Spink.

The Cooperage of Wm. Pike has been established about twenty years, and employs from four to six men in the manufacture of flour, cement, and apple barrels.
