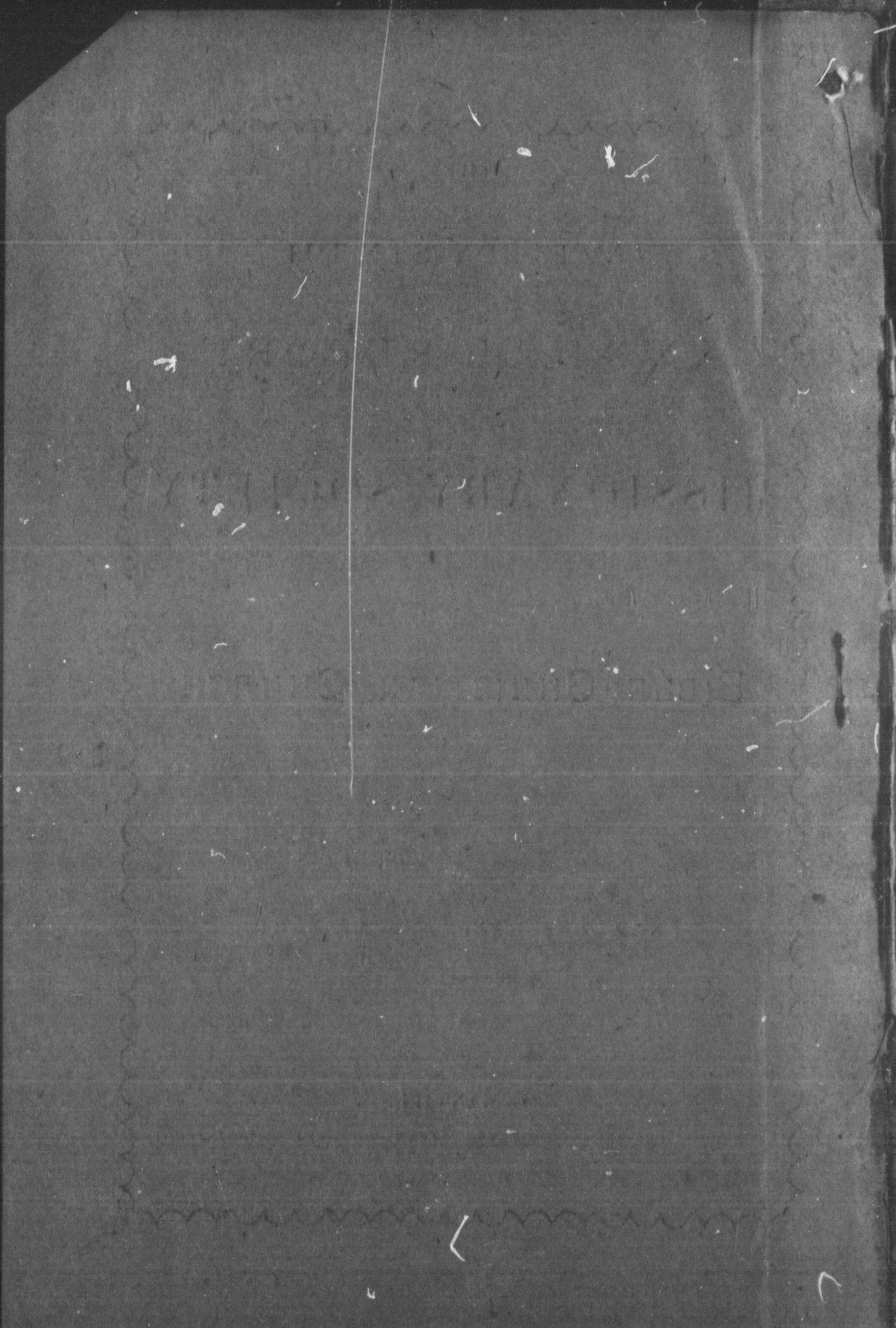

FORM OF BEQUEST.

To the Missionary Society of the Bible Christian Church in Canada.

I give and bequeath to the Treasurer or Treasurers, for the time being, of the Missionary Society of the Bible Christian Church in Canada, the sum of _____ Dollars, out of such part of my personal Estate, as shall not consist of Mortgages, Chattels real, to be paid and expended by them under the direction of said Society, in aid and support of the Missionaries upon the different Mission Stations of said Society; and the Receipt or Receipts of such Treasurer or Treasurers, for the time being, shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors; and the published Minutes of the Conference of the Bible Christian Church in Canada shall be sufficient evidence of authority for the said Treasurer or Treasurers, upon which to demand and receive payment of said Bequest.

N. B.—Money may be given by will, provided it be directed to be paid out of the Personal Estate, as is set out in the form of Bequest.

All Subscribers of Two Dollars, and upwards, at one time, are entitled to a copy of this Report.

ANNUAL MEETING.

The Anniversary of the Society was held on Sunday and Monday, June 5th and 6th. On Sabbath, two sermons were preached: in the morning by Bro. H. J. Nott, and in the evening by Bro. J. Kenner. In the afternoon a Children's Missionary Meeting was held, and addresses were delivered by Bros. W. Jolliffe and C. Barker. On Monday, at 3 p.m., services were resumed, and Bro. W. Hooper was called to the chair. After devotional exercises, Bro. R. T. Courtice presented the Annual Report.

That the report, extracts of which have been read, be adopted and printed under the direction of the Missionary Committee. We gratefully acknowledge the self-sacrificing efforts of our Collectors, and liberality of our patrons, but, at the same time, would earnestly request increased contributions, in order to do more effective work and diminish our indebtedness, was moved by Bro. A. Clarke, and seconded by Bro. L. W. Wickett.

was taught in promise and by prophecy during the Old Testament times, sacrifices offered, and incense waved, concentrated human thought upon the great coming Sacrifice, when God would provide Himself a Lamb. Those altars needed one common foundation, and those prophecies one fulfillment. He hath made Him to be sin for us, who knew no sin, that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him. That all men may be righteous, work righteously, bring forth the fruits of righteousness, is the ideal of Christian Missions. Calvary witnessed the closing scenes in our Saviour's model life, and heard His last words, ere He bowed His head and died,—“It is finished.” The great atoning work is complete. Man is redeemed by price, by power, to Divine relationship may be restored, and enter upon the sphere of duty and privilege connected with such hallowed life—born to a Brother's love, as well as to a Father's heritage: growing up to a Brother's sacred trust, as well as to a Father's confidence and love. “As I have loved you, so love ye one another.” Such is the spirit and aim of Christian Missions. Where, among the philosophies of centuries, can be found such God-honoring and man-enriching and glorifying truths? Where such elevating, perpetuating, beautifying powers to make earth in intelligence and enjoyment more and more like Heaven? God our Father, Christ's Brotherhood, the Holy Spirit, our comforter and guide, the Church of the living God, the divine institution in whose aid we toil, the world our harvest field. We prove it our Father's business to fulfill righteousness, by working the works of Him that sent us while it is day, knowing that “the night cometh when no man can work.” The duty of the hour should be ever present to our minds, and as unto the Lord all our talents, both of gift and grace, should be improved and consecrated.

The past year, in our own denominational work, proclaims God's goodness in extensive revivals, increased Missionary receipts, and also in the spirit of loyalty and liberality evidenced in the relief of the Exchequer, to the amount of \$30,000. Let us thank God, and take courage, hoping that both caution and liberality will increase, and our missionary ground will present the improving appearance of a field the Lord hath blessed.

Our Mission Fields are reported as follows:—

WHEATLEY RIVER—J. A. Dafoe, Pastor.—We rejoice in a year's labor spent in peace and brotherly love, and have been blessed with what appears to be a steady and reliable advancement. Our congregations continue good, and a fair interest is manifested in all our movements as a Christian Church. Sabbath Schools

are in a healthy condition, and evidently prove a blessing to many. Special efforts at Princeton Road, and ordinary Services at Wheatley River were attended with rich Divine blessings in saving sinners and building up the church. We are laboring, praying, and hoping for still greater blessings, and more marked advancement in all Spiritual things.

STURGEON AND MONTAGUE—W. Bryenton, Pastor.—This year has been one of toil, anxiety and prayer. At our Special Services, held for several weeks in the winter, the Master was graciously present, and four or five gave evidence of their decision to be on the Lord's side. Yet we need greater spiritual power among us. The Sabbath School was held during the winter months, though with somewhat diminished attendance. The Bible Class was kept up most of the year. It is difficult to keep up week-night Meetings with any degree of regularity, owing to the fact of many of our young men and women seeking employment in other places during the summer months. May the goodness of God lead many to repentance.

SUMMERSIDE—J. H. Collins, Pastor.—We thank God for what of wisdom the past year hath taught us. Human hopes oft bloom to fade. "Other foundation can no man lay than that is laid which is Jesus Christ." In our society, some of the fairest buds of promise were early blighted by the withering influences of misplaced affection and the semi-heroic fancies superinduced by reading those soul-dwarfing modern novels. Two of our members, through long and severe affliction, learned such lessons as are in the school of experience taught, and, with ripened faith and blooming hope, bade us good-bye, and went up higher. By some, considerable interest is taken in the cause of Christ; others are sadly careless. One aged Brother has lately sought the Lord, and found peace through believing in Jesus; and two or three others are enquiring the way to Zion. Our Sabbath School has been well sustained in numbers and interest. Financially: In Church Expenses Account, we have a balance in hand, and an advance in both Quarterly and Missionary Receipts.

WEST CAPE—J. Ferry, Pastor.—As on other fields, where the ensign of Jesus has been uplifted, the battle has gone hard and hot, but victory is on our side. Our Congregations are good, and, in some places, improved. We have taken an advance step in Sabbath School work. Social means of grace, where held, are pretty well attended. PORT HOPE—W. H. Butt, Pastor.—This has been a year of hard toil, severe trials, painful family afflictions, and yet, withal, measurable success. The Sabbath School is increasing in numbers and interest. Under the present management, with the blessing of God, it cannot fail to become a powerful auxiliary to the church. Well equipped with necessary furnishings, suitable literature, devoted teachers, and a full Exchequer. From official returns, we gather that Port Hope is the Banner School of the District. To God be all the praise. Public congregations have increased; a marked improvement also in attendance at Prayer and Class Meetings. These are seasons of great Spiritual profit. A better feeling of Christian harmony and brotherly love than has been manifest for years, obtains. For this we are devoutly thankful to God. Financially, we have done well, and the outlook is more hopeful than it has been for years. We toil on, praying for still further success.

HUNGERFORD—J. M. Tredrea, Pastor.—Cannot speak of large Congregations, of rich and numerous friends, yet there are some whose love for God perishing souls, and the Den in ination, constrain them to do their utmost to help on the work of God. With improvement in our organization, a more thorough co-operation with the means used, and strong faith in God, we see no reason why we may not have a living cause and be successful in winning souls. We have paid off Fifty Dollars of the Parsonage Debt through the exertions of Bro. S. Frost and the friends at Lodge Room. Several have been dropped from our list, because of non-attendance at the means of grace.

CAMPBELLFORD—J. G. Yelland, J. Pooley, Pastors.—The Lord has been our help in time of need. Amid many discouragements, we have much cause for thankfulness to God, who hath bestowed many blessings upon us, and favored us with a little prosperity. We want a richer baptism of the Holy Ghost to make us pure in heart, attentive to all the means of grace, patterns of piety, loving and kind towards each other, liberal in supporting the cause of God, and zealous in every good word and work. Congregations, on the whole, are good. A marked improvement is seen in our Quarterly Receipts. Debt on parsonage

is slightly reduced. In the Sabbath School Department, we report progress. Teachers seem deeply interested in their work, and most of the teachers and scholars have joined the Temperance and Tobacco Pledge. Our motto is, "Labor and Trust."

BELLEVILLE—W. C. Beer, Supt. of District.—The cause on this Mission has been in a somewhat unsettled state during the year, arising from unpleasantness between pastor and people. This resulted in the resignation of the pastor in the month of February. A supply having been secured for the balance of the year, things have assumed a more hopeful aspect, the congregations slightly improved and the Sabbath School increased. The Class and Prayer Meetings are moderately attended.

PRINCE ALBERT—R. Allin, T. Brown, Pastors.—We are much pleased to be able to say that peace and harmony reign throughout our borders. Congregations are moderately good. Sabbath School work is prosecuted with vigor. Class and Prayer Meetings, fairly attended, and the spirit of hearing, reverent and attentive. Special Services were held, for five or six weeks, on Scugog Island. A few professed conversion, but the unfaithfulness of some, removal of others, and the death of three, has more than equalled our increase.

PERRYTOWN—G. Smith, Pastor.—We found the Societies small, a great dearth of Christian workers, and no Sabbath Schools. Still, some loved the Master, this branch of his Church, and prayed earnestly for its prosperity. At Eden, a few have been led to the Saviour. Class Meetings are better attended. Congregation somewhat improved. A Sabbath School has just been organized with fair prospects of success. At Perrytown, membership increased, and nearly \$100 have been raised for church improvement. Providence proceeds on the even tenor of its way. The mission has suffered through removals. Success might have been greater had it not been for the illness of the pastor. We are not without hope. The long night will soon be past, and the shadows flee away.

PETERBORO'—E. Roberts, Pastor.—It is with unfeigned thankfulness to the God of all mercies that we see the termination of another year characterized by unity and peace in our Societies, and some degree of Spiritual and Connexional prosperity. Congregations are improving in numbers and regularity of attendance. A good spirit of hearing prevails throughout the Societies. Sabbath Schools are holding on their way, and would achieve a greater amount of good, had we a larger supply of teachers, and if the church generally took a deeper interest

therein. Our hearts have been gladdened by the conversion of a few of the scholars. Social means of grace, though attended well, as usual, might be more profitable, if more numerous and regularly attended. The heavy debt on our Town property has been reduced, and we hope, as times improve, larger reductions will be made; and, as several pews have recently been rented, we think our hopes are well grounded. At Bethel, the church building needs a stone foundation and a casement of brick, and if that were done, few stations in Canada would have neater and better church accomodation.

FENELON—M. Metherell, Pastor.—We have nothing very glowing, neither have we anything very discouraging to record. Peace and harmony, in good measure, yet not all we could desire. Congregations have increased a good deal, notably at Cambray and the Falls. Public Services are usually pretty well attended, whilst the other means of grace are more neglected than they should be, but there is an improvement in this. A Series of Special Meetings were held for 9 weeks at Zion with gratifying success, but not all we had hoped for. That God may quicken the older members, keep the younger ones steadfast, and convert sinners, is our prayer.

LINDSAY—R. T. Courtice, Pastor.—The hopes cherished at the beginning of the year have not been realized. Through removals and other causes, the list of members decreased, and the Sabbath School suffered seriously a lack of teachers. Of late, however, the school has improved in interest if not in numbers. Congregations have not decreased. Several have united with the Church, and Class and Prayer Meetings are better attended. Financially, we are about as last year.

MANVERS AND CARTWRIGHT—J. Whitlock, J. Hoskin, Pastors.—During the year, peace has dwelt in all our borders, and God's blessing has rested on our humble efforts. One of our members, ripe in years and rich in heavenly mindedness, has passed to his rest in glory. The Public Services, on the whole, have been well attended, and much of the Divine presence has been enjoyed. We have, however, a great number of families who scarcely ever attend the House of God. May God, in great mercy, visit them and us with an extraordinary outpouring of His Holy Spirit. Prayer and Class Meetings are not so well attended as they should be, hence the love of many grows cold. Special Meetings at Newry, Franklin, and Janetville, resulted in the quickening of the Societies and in gathering of souls to Christ

and the Church. Sabbath Schools are improving. May they become more and more the feeders of the Church. We have been vigorously opposed in some parts of our work, but, pursuing the even tenor of our way, we rejoice in the fact, "The Lord reigneth and maketh the wrath of man to praise him, and the remainder of wrath he doth restrain."

ASHBURNHAM—T. W. Blatchford, B.A., Pastor.—We regret that we are unable to give so favorable a report as could be desired. The location of the Church, in a village composed largely of Episcopalians, Presbyterians, Methodists, and Roman Catholics, and its close proximity to the wealthy and attractive Churches of Peterboro', militate against our securing as large a congregation as the capacity of the Church and its financial liabilities demand; nor has the year witnessed any marked improvement in the number of our hearers. The Religious Services have not been without tokens of the Divine presence and influence, and a few have professed faith in the Saviour. The Sabbath School still languishes, but may be improved by increased devotion on the part of the teachers and the Church. The heavy debt of \$1,000 on the property, has, in a measure, crippled our efforts; but, through the kindness of one of our members, the interest thereon has been reduced from 8 to 6 per cent. Arrangements have been made to put the finances of the Mission in a better condition, and we hope that next year the difficulties we have experienced will be entirely removed. What we want is more earnest prayer, a fuller consecration to God, and a richer baptism of the Holy Ghost.

TORONTO—W. Jolliffe, Pastor.—The year just closing has been one of trial and anxiety. The general interest of the Mission varies but little from that reported a year ago. Like all City Stations, we suffer from fluctuations, so that our numbers increase but slowly. One aged pilgrim (Bro. Marks) has finished his course peacefully in death. Spiritually, the love of piety is, we hope, increasing. Our Sabbath School sustains a fair interest. In support of our financial obligations and schemes, the ladies of the Church have acted a noble part as collectors for "Missionary," "Aid," and other departments of our work. Our people are willing and liberal to the extent of their ability. We hope the good time is coming, when the tide of a Spiritual and financial prosperity may favor us abundantly. "Lord, lift Thou up the light of Thy countenance upon us."

made to cancel our Mission debt. Nearly all has been subscribed, part has been paid, and we expect to pay the balance during the coming year. Quarterly Receipts have improved. So soon as our Mission liabilities are cancelled, we shall be able to wheel into the ranks of Self-supporting Circuits, and contribute freely to the General Missionary Fund. Special Services, held at Bethel and Duffin's Creek, have resulted in showers of blessings upon God's people, and in the conversion of many precious souls. To God be all the praise. Our Sunday Schools, on the whole, present an encouraging aspect. The Band of Hope, at Duffin's Creek, is what its name implies. The like institution should be organized in each of our places of worship. Most of our members are true to God, the Bible, the Church, and the Temperance principles, and give evidence of deep-toned piety.—May all seek and obtain that holiness of heart that alone can prepare them for Heaven. Greater liberality, entire consecration to God, richer baptisms of the Holy Ghost, more thorough Christian work, will make us—as a Circuit—a greater power for good in the future than we have been in the past.

HAMILTON—J. J. Rice, Pastor.—It has been a year of at least the usual amount of anxiety and toil; while the results do not, as yet, appear satisfactory, especially as to the ingathering of souls. A large number of our Society do not appear to take a deep interest in Spiritual things. Our Sabbath School is holding its own, with much improvement, as concerns its conduct and good order. By earnest and persistent effort, our Missionary Receipts have materially advanced. By means of regular revenue, our Interest Account has been met; and over \$300, raised as a special effort by the ladies, which enables us to meet, honorably, all claims for local and general Connexional purposes. Our position, both in regard to membership and pew-holders, is decidedly improved.

UXBRIDGE—A. Gordon, Pastor.—For His loving kindness, we offer unto our God the incense of grateful hearts. His Word has been light, strength, and comfort to our souls. Growing in grace, we are better prepared for life's duties and trials. Some have been won from sin by the loveliness they saw in Jesus—the greater number of these are young people in our Sabbath Schools. Bro. Collins, who was a member of Bethesda Society, has passed to the rest that remains for the people of God. For more than twenty years, he was subject of the severe affliction; but grace enabled him to say, "Thy wi'l be done." His hope of immortality was unclouded, and, we doubt not, his death was precious

in the sight of the Lord. Our Sabbath School is the most encouraging feature of our Church in Uxbridge. Financially, we have done what we could.

SUTTON—D. Williams, Pastor.—Amidst many opposing influences, we stand in our lot with about as fair a prospect of prosperity as at the beginning of the year. Death has removed two of our valued members, whom, we confidently trust, now realize the blessedness of the rest that remaineth to the people of God. Through other causes, a lessening of members has resulted. Accessions to the Church have about made up for such losses sustained. Congregations average about the same. We need a higher tone of Spirituality, and feel to prostrate ourselves before God, with humble confessions, in view of our many shortcomings; yet, with thanksgiving, we acknowledge the precious seasons we have, from time to time, enjoyed, in fellowship with God and each other. Financial cares, being allowed to rest chiefly upon the pastor, and heavy financial burdens, necessitating repeated appeals for assistance, has a tendency to divert attention from the Spiritual concerns of the Church. Larger contributions by our friends, when appealed to, would improve this feature of our work. A few have been brought into the fold by means of Special Meetings, in which many weeks of toil were spent. We enjoy continued peace in our Societies.

PALMERSTON—T. J. Sabine, Pastor.—We have enjoyed peace and prosperity within our gates. A spirit of cheerful liberality prevails. Congregations are encouraging. Class Meetings, well attended. Sabbath School, prosperous. Several of the scholars have recently given evidence of having chosen the good part. Our special effort in Town was not in vain, for the people had a mind to work. Twenty-six were admitted on trial, all of whom were, by the last Elders' Meeting, received into full membership. At Minto, two special attempts at Revival work were soon relinquished—the first, because of the state of the roads; the second, owing to the pastor's illness. Still, believing that some of God's elect are crying day and night unto Him, we expect Him to arise and have mercy upon Zion, so that those who sow in tears shall reap in joy.

WIARTON—T. H. Dry, Pastor.—We see many causes for much and painful anxiety; yet, with expectant hearts, we have sown the good seed, because God hath said, "My word shall not return unto me void." Union Meetings were held at Wiaraton; a few souls professed to find pardon, through faith in the Lord

Our hearts have been cheered to hear the voices of some young men leading in prayer, as the result or fruits, of our Special Services last year; and we are encouraged to hope that others, who have professed conversion, will become earnest workers in the Lord's vineyard. Our public services have been well sustained, and marked attention given to the ministration of the Word. TALBOTVILLE—S. H. Rice, Pastor.—While we cannot speak of large accessions, yet we think progress has been made, and, on the whole, things are more hopeful than they were twelve months ago. Congregations, at Talbotville, have somewhat improved; At Front Street, very encouraging. Special Services, at Talbotville, were the means of quickening those of the members who attended them, and added a few names to the Roll of Membership. Class Meetings are fairly attended, but Prayer Meetings are not prized as they should be. Great attention is given to the preached Word; but, O, that it might produce greater effect. A Sabbath School has been organized at Front Street, thus increasing numbers in this department of our work. The Bazaar and Festival, held at Talbotville, were very successful. While feeling grateful for the mercies of the past, more general consecration would have secured greater success, we feel assured. May the coming year be crowned with more abundant prosperity.

WINDSOR—W. Limbert, Pastor.—The year has been one of hard toil, great anxiety, and continued struggle with difficulties arising from various causes. Our Special Services were very thinly attended; some, enrolled as members, coming two or three times, and others not at all. May the few who joined our Society prove faithful to the grace given. We report diminished membership. This arises, in part, from incorrect returns last year, and partly from other causes. Some of those returned have not entered the Church during the year. Others, when spoken to, have denied uniting with the Church at all. Several have removed, some have withdrawn, and others have been dropped, through unfaithfulness. Finances look somewhat encouraging. Quarterly accounts are ahead, and Weekly Collections compare

favorably with previous years. Our debt has been consolidated, so that we pay $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. annually, instead of 9 per cent. quarterly. What we need is harmony and peace, with more devotedness to the Service of the Master.

COLCHESTER—W. Coombe, Pastor.—Our Circuit has suffered through removals, and the pastor's protracted illness. Our friends have done unusually well, financially; hence, we are, in this department, in advance of previous years. A Sabbath appointment has been taken up at McGregor's, in lieu of Essex Centre, and a few have joined our Society. Congregation, about 40 persons. Our field is large, preaching places somewhat isolated, but each in the centre of an improving locality. The whole Circuit needs, above all else, a genuine revival of religion.

WISCONSIN DISTRICT.

Since the Saviour has given the command to his disciples to "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature," a vast amount of missionary work has been done. Millions of sermons have been preached, exhortations given, lessons taught, prayers offered, dollars spent, and miles travelled. As the result of those efforts, the savage has been humanized, the ignorant instructed, the enslaved liberated, the impure made holy, and sinners, by millions, converted from the error of their ways and made meet for the inheritance of the saints in light. While much effort has been put forth, still there remains a great deal of work to be done ere the world is converted to Christ. The stone, cut out of the mountains, which Daniel saw in vision, has not yet filled the earth; the time predicted by the prophet that "the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea," has not yet arrived; the promise of the Father, that His Son shall have "the heathen for his inheritance and the uttermost parts of the earth for his possession," has not yet been fulfilled; nor has the prayer so frequently offered, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven," been answered in its fullest sense. The B. C. Church has, however, an unwavering faith in the declarations of the Bible respecting the conversion of the world to Christ. And, inspired by this faith, and believing that God has called her to assist in the accomplishment of this glorious work, she has sent forth missionaries into various parts of the world. The

labors of those missionaries are, from year to year, being blessed to the upbuilding of believers and the conversion of sinners. Our Missionary work during the past year, in connection with this District, has been moving a little onward. Shortly after last Conference a new Mission was opened at Waldo, a village about fifty miles north of Milwaukee, on the Wisconsin Central Railroad. The Missionary furnishes the following report :

WALDO MISSION.—We are happy to say that our work for the Lord in Waldo, for the past nine months, has not been in vain. The prospects were not very encouraging at first when we went among the friends. They felt disappointed at Bro. Haycraft not coming, as expected. But the Lord opened up our way so that we are enabled to move among the friends with feelings of pleasure and profit. The meetings have been well and increasingly attended, and the interest is steadily improving. The most pleasing feature is that so many who have not been known to attend a place of worship for months are regular in attendance at the preaching of the gospel and manifest a strong desire for its continuance. The attendance at the meetings has been surprising to the people themselves. We held special meetings for three weeks, but the severe weather prevented the continuance of the same. There was a blessed spirit of interest realized, and the attendance was large and very attentive, five or six stood up for prayer, and two have joined the Society. We greatly feel the need of a Church for society meetings and other kindred gatherings. A Church Committee has been composed of some of the leading persons in the community who, we expect, all being well, will push the affair to a happy issue. The building of a Church will greatly facilitate the Work of God in this place. We are happy to say that the finances have been well met. Two hundred dollars was promised to be raised, but they have raised thirty-four dollars over that amount. The people are very desirous that the services should be continued, and are quite willing to do their best to support the same. F. O'C. JONES.

The Pastor of the Burlington Mission reports of that field of labor as follows :—Although we cannot report any extensive revivals of religion for the past year, yet we are glad to say that five have been persuaded to flee from the wrath to come. Numerically, we are only four in advance of last year, those uniting with the Church having been nearly balanced by removals and unfaithfulness. The Class and Prayer Meetings have been regularly kept up, and have truly been times of refreshing coming from the presence of the Lord. The young peoples' prayer

meeting has, we think, under God, been the means of establishing them in the good way. The Sunday Schools are in good running order, and are, in a measure, what we think they should be—a nursery of the Church. The Congregations are somewhat improved over last year, but we need more consecration of time and talents to the service of God. On the whole, we think the prospects for the Mission are brightening.

The conferential year opened a little discouragingly upon the Little Prairie Mission, but the friends have been grappling with their difficulties, and the result is that hopes of complete success is a little in the ascendant. The Pastor's report reads, "The year commenced under very inauspicious circumstances. Everything connected with the cause of God was at a low ebb.—A very heavy debt on the Church tended to kill all spiritual life out of the Society, especially those who are responsible for the debt. By a great effort on the part of a few individuals, about \$540 of the debt has been paid, leaving a balance of about \$550 yet to pay. Circumstances over which the present pastor had no control, have militated against the prosperity of the cause. Eight of the members have removed, and the names of several have been dropped from the list. Yet, amidst all our discouragements, the Lord has been pleased to meet with and bless us, both in public and in private. We are sorry that some of the members do not feel it to be their duty and their privilege to attend to the Prayer and Class Meetings. The Sabbath School at Little Prairie is not so prosperous as could be desired; yet we are thankful that it is still alive and has been kept open during the winter. Our prayer is that the Lord "will revive us again, that we may rejoice in Him."

Each of those Missions, to enable it to support its Ministers during the past year, has had to receive aid from the Mission Fund. Burlington Mission has received \$100; Little Prairie, \$100; Waldo, \$92.12. Total, \$292.12.

The Missionary Receipts, from the several Circuits for the past year are as follows:—Palmyra, \$54.21; Lisbon, \$69.02; Yorkville, \$74.23. This leaves a debt on the Mission Fund of \$94.54. That there has been no extravagant expenditure in working those Missions, is evident when we consider the fact that the average salary per year of the Ministers laboring thereon has been only \$350. Our prayer is that Ministers and people throughout the District may be baptized with more of the missionary spirit to enable us to act well our part in this department of the Lord's work, that He who commissioned his Church to
