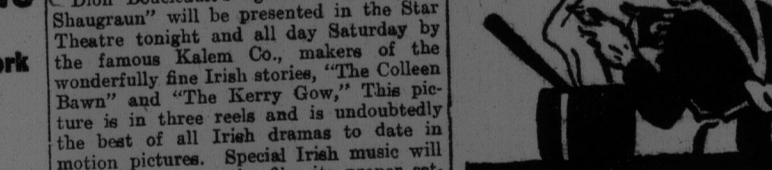

GERMAN CITY PLANNING

The Land Laws There Explained To Halifax Board of Trade

(Halifax Chronicle) Ewart C. Culpin, the expert city planner gave another excellent address at the board of trade rooms last night before a fair sized audience, but one that was keenly interested in the description which the lecturer gave of the German city plan-

ning and the land laws of the cities of that country.

One of the ideas brought out by Mr. Culpin from the many excellent illustrations of the subject, was that of getting away from building straight streets, but allowing the arteries of commerce to follow grades of less resistance.

By doing this, convenience is not only assured, but the appearance of the town is enhanced.

The speaker also described various systems prevailing in progressive cities, notably, that of the zone system or the limiting of certain districts to certain buildings, of certain height and for certain purposes.

In this connection particularly was emphasized the benefit of having the factory

district so situated that prevailing winds would blow the smoke away from the city.

In connection with the land laws, 200 German cities had enacted them. It was the system of the municipality owning the land and renting it to the citizens.

In many of these cities, the rentals obtained from that system were sufficient to obviate the necessity of raising taxes, and in others, there was a good surplus.

In England 145 cities had adopted the comprehensive city plan. These cities ranged all the way from 5,000 to 800,000 population, and many of them were the size of Halifax.

Of the land in these places, about one-third to one-half was placed under the comprehensive scheme for de-

velopment. To further this movement and assist the various towns and cities in carrying it out, the government at Westminster had a board appointed specially to study the conditions.

In Halifax there are 2000 acres of land available for this planning. Every day the city waits to adopt a comprehensive plan, so much nearer a difficult situation to solve is she becoming.

In England the idea is to get a workable plan as soon as possible.

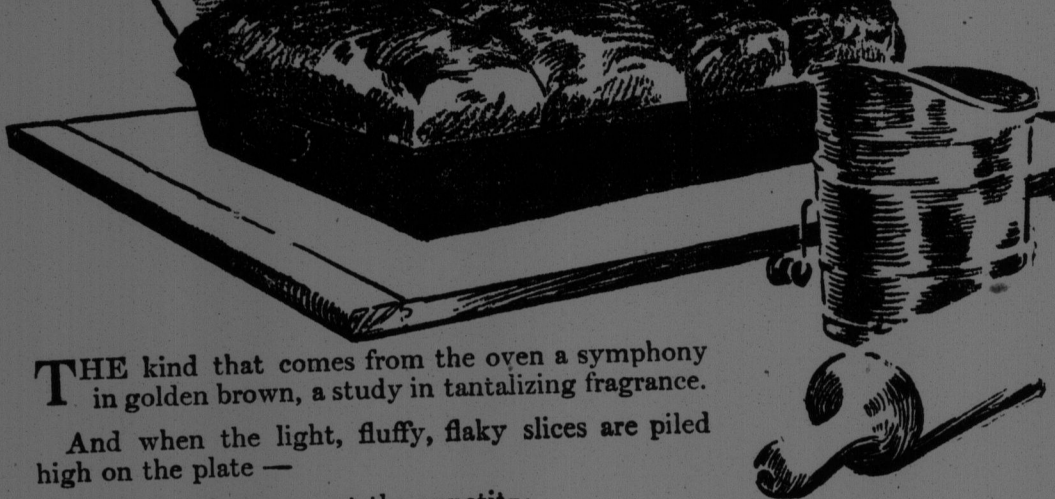
