

## The Evening Chit-Chat By RUTH CAMERON

URING a recent big strike, one of the favorite comments of the bystanders was a criticism of the policy of the labor leaders. "They lash on the workmen," said the critics; "they talk to them about their wrongs and work them all up until they get unreasonable and hurt their own cause."

How much of that accusation is true, I don't know. I hope very little, for if there could be any meaner act than to misguide and mislead these poor folks in their struggle for betterment, and to exploit them for personal gain, I cannot conceive of it. But this is not a talk on strikes or of labor leaders. What I want to bring home to you is this—how often you and I treat ourselves, as the labor leaders are said to treat the workingmen.

Suppose that your good friend has said something to you which seemed unjust, and your friendly feeling for her has gone on strike, what does your reason, the leader, as it were, of your whole being, do? Does it tell the part of you which which feels aggrievel and resentful that perhaps your friend did not mean that remark in quite the sense you are inclined to take it; that she had some good grounds for speaking as she did; that you hrve often criticised her harshly; that probably she spoke hastily and is sorry now, just as you have often been; and that she has shown forbearance towards you a great many times?

Or does your reason lash you on? Does it remind you

in some way or other?

If it does, are you any better than than the labor leaders, who lash on their followers by magnifying their wrongs and ignoring their rights?





Matter of Penny Banks and Other

will prevent the operation of the penny savings system in the schools during school hours the trustees, at their monthly meeting last night, decided to postpone the introduction of the system until after the summer holidays. Authority will be asked to issue \$40,000 bonds for permanent work. The matter of a pupil, who lives in the Isolation Hospital, attending the Sand Point School, was left to Superintendent Bridges to get a physician's advice.

Applications for positions on the teaching staff were received from J. Roy Bell, Herbert L. Logan, Miss Beesie Marthers, Miss Frances Trainor and Miss S. A. Mullin. The applications were referred to the teachers' committee.

It was decided to confer with Dr. Carter, chief superintendent of education, in regard to manual training and domestic science schools.

The committee which has charge of the fitting up of a new department for manual training reported that the new room was about ready.

Dr. Bridge, was given authority to ask

Dr. Bridge was given authority to ask the advice of a physician and act in regard to the attendance at the Sand Point school of a pupil who lives at the Isolation Hospital. It seems that the child has been kept out of the school on account of viving in the hospital where there are two smallpox cases. The trustees expressed the opinion that no chances should be taken in cases of this kind.

The report of the truant officer showed that there had been 72 irregular attendants and 15 truants reported during the month.
