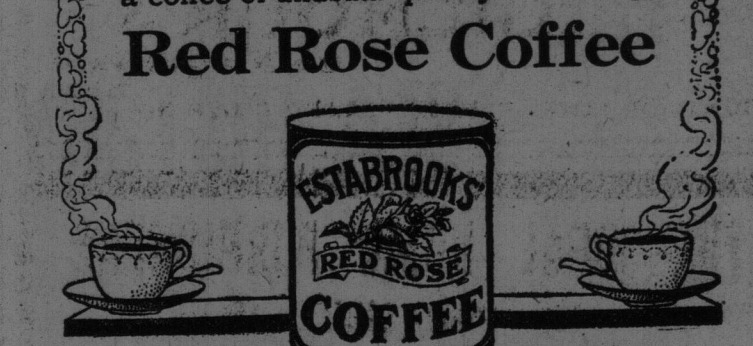
Mrs. Brokaw Testifies in Suit Against Her Husband

THE OCEAN GRAVE

An ocean grave has swallowed up the latest pride of man's ingenuity in his efforts to make the sea his servant, and with the giant steamship have gone down more than twelve hundred people and much treasure.

The news that even thousands of persons had been killed in a battle would not cause such a thrill of horror as this story of a palatial steamship, filled with people of all classes, including persons of great wealth, and men of power and influence...

A dispatch from Toronto states that despite the largely increased dry area in Ontario there is an increase in drunkenness. It is stated that there were 757 more commitments for drunkenness last year than in the previous year, and that there has been a steady increase since 1890.

The legislature of Ontario has passed what is called the City and Suburbs Planning Act. This act applies to the large cities in the province, and provides that when a subdivision of lots is proposed on any tract of land within five miles of a city...

PAINTING OF CORONATION NEARLY DONE

Bacon Has Enjoyed Task That Abbey Found Difficult - Declares King and Queen Ideal as Sitters

(Times' Special Correspondence) London, April 6.—It is now almost certain that the great canvas depicting the coronation of King George, nearing completion in the studio of J. H. F. Bacon, A.R.A., will be shown at the coming exhibition of the Royal Academy before finding a permanent home in Buckingham Palace.

Bacon's experience is in sharp contrast to that of the late Edward A. Abbey, an American painter who was commissioned to prepare the official canvas of King Edward's coronation. Abbey has left on record an account of the immense difficulties he had to overcome in completing his great picture. Peers and princesses are said to have openly rebelled against sitting to him and it is recalled that there was considerable feeling against the commission being given to a foreigner when there were so many English painters about as well qualified to do the work.

Bacon, however, seems to have had his enjoyable time. His canvas measures eighteen feet in length and about three hundred figures appear on it. He has been working nine months on it and has had as sitters the king and queen and all the important participants in the gorgeous event. Speaking of the king and queen, he says: "Without doubt, the king and queen are two of the very best sitters I have ever met. It is a common idea to suppose that reigning monarchs are impatient and impetuous, and that they inspire you with the feeling, when in their presence, that your business must be transacted with breathless speed. This may be with certain monarchs, but it certainly is not the case with our own. King George's courtesy and patience is a lesson to all who come under his personal influence, while Queen Mary's charm and kindly interest place all who are with her entirely at ease."

SAVING THE CHILDREN. A number of states have enacted laws this year regulating nightwork by children. The most notable being New York's provision that no one under 21 years of age may be employed as a night messenger after 10 o'clock p.m.

In New Jersey, after five years' battle with the glass manufacturers, the child labor committee has secured the night work bill, which prohibits the employment of children 18 years of age between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.

In Maryland nightwork for children under 16 years of age has been prohibited, and employment by day for children under 14.
