In answer to a question, the whole fishery service is in a state of complete chaos. Existing laws have been pronounced unconstitutional in some respects, and the efforts of the Dominion Government to remedy matters have proved abortive. Ottawa Telegram.

Buffalo Courier.—The session of the Canadian Parliament which has just closed has shown in a marked manner the tendencies toward centralization prevailing in the Dominion. The present Confederation of the North American Provinces is not yet sixteen years old, and the central Government already undertakes to do things which few persons in this country would think of entrusting to the Government at Washington. At the last session of the Ottawa Parliament a law for the regulation of the liquor traffic for the whole Dominion was enacted. From our point of view such legislation seems foolish, even if the Act of the British Parliament which is the constitution of Canada has empowered the Dominion Parliament to make laws of this kind. In our federal constitution powers are vested in Congress which are now dormant, though the General Government has been in existence nearly a hundred years. Respect for state rights in this country grows greater than it is now after the Republican party has been expelled from power, and it is even to be feared that that party in opposition will adopt extreme views of the extent of State rights and the limitations of federal power. Against the centralizing tendencies of the Dominion Government the Toronto Globe utters words of warning. The Globe points out that between the Canadian Province there are greater differences in point of race, religion, and social and political customs than there are between the several States of our Union. Situated as the Canadians are they cannot build up a "strong" central government at the expense of State or Provincial rights without undermining their confederation and preparing the way for its early dissolution.

There is a report that Mrs. Langtry is to be married to Mr. Gebhardt as soon as a legal divorce can be obtained on the ground of abandonment on the part of her husband, Mr. Langtry. Mrs. Langtry, is now staying at Albemarle, and a reporter to-day handed her a slip containing the latest report affecting her most private and confidential life. 
