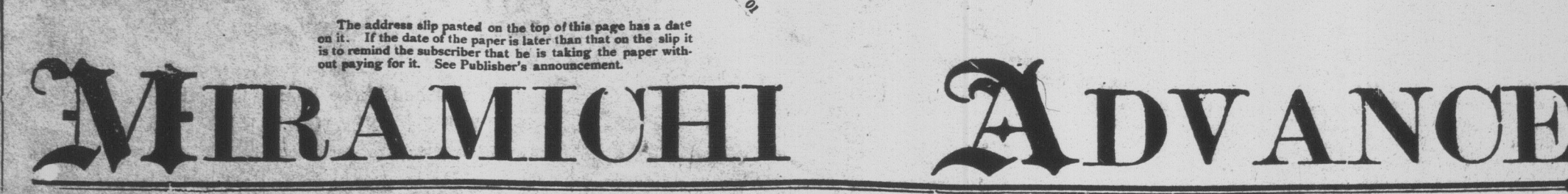

England's Stately Homes

Some Account of Kenilworth and Warwick Castles

No county in England is more beautiful than Warwickshire, or contains more celebrated towns and castles. It is a splendid domain, lying in the heart of the land, and everywhere filled with great historic interest and association.

Leamington is an ancient town, and passed its early days through many vicissitudes. In the old book of records, called the "Domestic Book," is found the earliest mention of the place. Here, in the year 1086, it is the Warwick family, who were the lords of the manor, owned by the Earl of Warwick.

DISCOVERY OF THE SPRINGS. These old buildings date back to the end of the eighteenth century, when the discovery of saline springs in the town. Everything was at that time on a very small scale, and the visitors came in great numbers.

When sulphur and other mineral springs were discovered in 1784, the town was built, and Leamington grew rapidly into the well known watering place.

Among the modern parks of Leamington, the most beautiful is that of the "Father of Leamington," the Earl of Warwick. It was created by his grace, and has since that time increased the reputation of the town, and now an imposing monument stands as a memorial to his name and public spirit.

It is a beautiful drive from Leamington to Kenilworth, and a day spent in visiting those historic places is full of interest. The roads are all English highways, and in fine condition, and tall trees, full of singing birds, border them for many miles. Occasionally the note of a nightingale is heard, and the air is full of the scent of the old-fashioned roses that bloom in the cottage gardens.

The first view of the ruins of Kenilworth Castle is somewhat disappointing, and it is necessary to invest the redoubt stone structure with all the romance that Sir Walter Scott has created before its real charm and inspiration can be felt. In many places the projecting ivy has thrown its green mantle over decapitated towers and broken columns, and rendered beautiful the remains of a once imposing castle.
