DEVOTES HIS LIFE TO CATCHING RATS

Official Appointed by London County Council—Challenges to Catch 1,000 in Three Nights

John Jarvis, of Campbellton who has just been appointed official rat catcher to the London County Council at a salary of £48 12s 6d per annum is a ratcatcher not by profession but by vocation.

Since 1863 each male member of his family has devoted his life to catching rats and so it was with the great confidence that yesterday Jarvis issued a challenge to all the rat catchers of the kingdom to catch more of the vermin in a given time than any man living, provided that neither dogs nor ferrets were employed in the hunt. Furthermore he said that with the aid of his uncle, Mr. Dalton, he would undertake to catch 1,000 rats in three nights.

As Jarvis made this challenge he furnished half a dozen tame white rats, while his seven year old daughter and her younger sister both know pretty well all there is to know about catching rats. Kit often accompanies me on my hunting expeditions and she very rarely makes a mistake. You see anyone can kill rats but very few understand how to catch them. RECORD REVENUE FOR THIS YEAR

Figures Hardly Likely to Reach the Hundred Million Mark.

LARGE INCREASE

OTTAWA, Jan. 31—It now looks as though Canada's revenue for the year would not quite reach the hundred million dollar mark, as was hoped. For the ten months ending with January the customs revenue totaled \$48,907,113, a gain of \$10,290,951 over the same period last year. The revenue from customs, which has been increasing at the rate of a million a month, this month shows a gain of only \$467,295. This is not because the January revenue of \$4,529,252 is small, but because the revenue of the previous January was large, the turn toward good times which set in some time before having reached the custom house, and the very rarely makes a mistake. DIRECT SERVICE ST. JOHN TO GASPE

Quebec Man Makes Arrangement with N. B. Telephone Company—Discusses Rates

John Hall Kelly, M. P. for Bonaventure, in the Quebec legislature, was in St. John last week. Mr. Kelly, who is president of the Bonaventure and Gaspé Telephone Company, was in St. John to complete arrangements for signing a contract with the New Brunswick Telephone Company to have direct telephone service between St. John and Gaspé. Negotiations in this matter have, Mr. Kelly says, been on for some time. The Bonaventure and Gaspé Telephone Company, at present extends from Gaspé to Mataneville. Speaking of the matter in the Quebec legislature, Mr. Kelly said that the telephone rates are arranged by the province of Quebec. Mr. Kelly said that his company came under the jurisdiction of the railway commission at Ottawa. He thought that was the most satisfactory way for there was no chance then of any company exercising a monopoly, as they so often do when they are under provincial charter. The railway commission practically rules and before a company can either increase or decrease its rates they must have the consent of the commission.

Among the many matters to be considered by the Quebec legislature at their next session, said Mr. Kelly, is the question of the telephone. The people of Quebec feel much the same over the matter as you do in New Brunswick, and they are going to take active steps to have the telephone in their own province. The government will bring in a bill in the next session a bill to provide entirely the expense of any public work that is taken of the Crown lands. I think this will be a means of having pulp mills situated in our own province. Mr. Kelly, who is a graduate of St. Joseph's University at Memramouc, is one of the leading politicians of Quebec. Although an Englishman, he speaks the French language fluently, and is one of the ablest debaters in the Quebec house.

FRENCH FLOODS ARE SUBSIDING

Two Weeks Yet Before River Reaches Natural Level.

RESTORING SERVICES

PARIS, Jan. 31—The Seine is now falling but it will be some weeks yet before Paris is free of the flood. In fact in some of the despatches received on Sunday were worse than at any time since the flood commenced. A stream of water, 12 feet deep, rushed through Gennevilliers and Colan, making the work of rescue and repair difficult. Several houses collapsed and many persons were taken off the roofs of their houses where they had been clinging for days. Hundreds were without food or shelter and an army of troops and civilians worked relentlessly in the flooded territory. Although there is no intention on the part of the government to declare martial law, the completely submerged districts, such as Javel are in the hands of the militia to prevent pillaging. The soldiers have orders to give short shrift to the animals caught in the act of looting.

Outside of Paris many deplorable instances of hardship have been reported. A regular band of thieves have been at work in the vicinity of Charbonnet but the soldiers have been shooting them at the pits. The Zouaves killed two of the plotters at Charbonnet and at this.

Nova Scotia now has nineteen New Brunswick fifteen and P. E. Island six members. They face a prospect of a considerable reduction through the next census. There has been an increase of about 150,000 in the maritime provinces, while Quebec has increased 500,000, which will increase the unit of representation by about 8,000. On this basis the maritime provinces stand to lose four or five of their twenty five seats.

The three prairie provinces, which have increased 800,000 since 1901, will gain about ten seats, seven having been added through the special census five years ago.

British Columbia will show a gain of 125,000 and will probably get three more members.

FOR TECHNICAL SCHOOLS IN CANADA

OTTAWA, Jan. 29.—Doubts of furthering by every means in their power, the movement looking to the establishment of a system of technical education, adequate to the needs of Canada, the government proposes to appoint a commission not only to investigate the requirements of the Dominion, but to visit other countries, with the view of ascertaining the methods of industrial training pursued there. An announcement to this effect has been made at a conference held yesterday by Hon. Mr. Mackenzie Bowden.
