HAMILTON AFFAIRS.

Two Fishermen Browned—A School for Detectives Proposed—Broke His Leg. HAMILTON, Dec. 3.—The rumor that two fishermen had been drowned in Lake Ontario, off Bronte, during the storm on Wednesday afternoon, has been confirmed. A postal card from Mrs. Laborator stiff.

Johnson of the steamer Undine, says that the utmost excitement prevails in the village in consequence of the sad occurrence. A report is on the street to-day that one of the Joyce brothers—there are four of them, all fishermen—also perished in the terrible gale, but this has not yet been confirmed.

At 5 o'clock this morning Constable Hallisy discovered an ash barrel blazing up against a wooden building in rear of the Victoria Hotel, King-street east, owned by the Mayor. With the assistance of the engineer of the Electric Light Company he extinguished the fire and prevented what might have been a disastrous bonflagration.

Among the applicants for a vacancy on the police force is Thomas Bishop of Lynden, who at one time exhibited as an eight-foot Canadian giant. He is about seven 'feet in height, heavily built and clumsy looking.

At the meeting of the Police Commissioners to-day Judge Sinclair suggested that the detective system should be remodeled, and a sort of school for detectives formed. Eight intelligent and trustworthy men might be taken and put on in turns, for say a couple of mouths at a stretch, so that they would learn the business and become more efficient officers. He thought the chief might consider this question.

Yesterday morning the failure of R. C. Hecker, a prominent broker, was announced, but it had small effect on the market. Early in the afternoon, however, came the news of the failure of S. B. Frankel & Co. of Virginia City for \$915,000, carrying with them their San Francisco agents, Greenbaum & Strauss, who failed for \$400,000. These failures demoralized the street, and stocks tumbled, California and Virginia falling to 42 and the others declining in the usual proportion. Still, the leading stocks showed so much strength that no one could tell what: a day might bring forth.

A despatch from Virginia City says: The following persons are the heaviest losers by the Frankel failure: S. Jones, Superintendent of the Crown Point and Belicher mines, \$205,000; General Keating, Superintendent of the Savage and Hale and Norcross mines, \$20,000, and E. D. Boyle of the Alta mine \$20,000. The list of losers includes several clerks and niners and a number of women. L. B. Frankel, the senior partner, retired from business several years ago. It is said he is a millionaire, and as he still retains an interest in the business the creditors of the firm hope to recover a portion of their losses through him. The three younger Frankel brothers, the active members of the firm, fied early pesterday morning. They are said to have secured a large fortune by retaining every cent deposited with them since the rise in mining shares began. Their business was enormous, their receipts being about \$60,000 a day. Great excitement prevails over the suspension, and if the three members of the firm had not fled.






