ordinance makes it an offense punishable by fine or imprisonment for such animals to be left astray during the winter season unless they are in good condition. It also provides that wate and feed shall be available for their use. It seems somewhat remarkabl
that such a law should be required particularly in this country, where horses and cattle have such high value. Experience of the past proves, however that there are men who are sufficiently regulation be passed and stringentl enforced.
