



The town of New Glasgow, Nova

man" as typical of many towns and

The writer then refers to New Thatgow in particular, tracing its development from the days when it rods along the waves of prosperity as a shipbuliding centre, dropping into depression as the wooden ship was displaced by the steel vessel, built elsewhere. Sallors and their families moved away and the agricultural classes suffered accordingly. Associated with the building of wooden heats, however, were some infant industries, one of which had to do with the manufacture of fron knees used to fasten the frames to the deck stringers on the wooden ships.
