The city council met last night in regular session, Mayor Howell in the chair.

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Among the communications read were ones from Mr. John Rollins, city clerk of St. Catharines, enclosing a copy of a memorial to be presented to the Ontario legislature.

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Petitions were presented from about 50 ratepayers in the neighborhood of St. Andrew's market, praying that the assessment of the market should not be granted for the tramps to break stone in.

Ald. Baxter made inquiry if it were true that the telephone or electric light system was to be sold to the city.

The council went on to report 32 of the executive committee and other committee reports.
