## CANADA WELCOMES HIS EXCELLENCY TIAN JIYUN

VICE PREMIER OF THE STATE COUNCIL OF THE

## PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

MAY 17-22, 1988

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Right Honourable Joe Clark, today announced that His Excellency Tian Jiyun, Vice Premier of the State Council of the People's Republic of China will visit Canada May 17-22, 1988.

"The visit of Vice Premier Tian comes at an opportune time," Mr. Clark said, "as it follows successive major Party and National People's Congress sessions where far-reaching decisions were taken on expanding China's modernization and 'open door' programs. Canada has taken important steps to build stronger economic relations with China. During a visit to China in 1986, the Prime Minister announced the establishment of a concessional line of credit and a doubling of the bilateral development assistance programme. Last year, two-way trade, increasingly diversified, grew by 32% to a record level of \$2.2 billion.

Mr. Tian is one of three Vice Premiers of the People's Republic of China with responsibilities for trade, commerce and agriculture. His visit to Canada provides an opportunity to lay the basis for expanded bilateral trade through meetings with senior Canadian industrial, commercial and government leaders.

During his visit Mr. Tian will visit Toronto, Niagara Falls, Ottawa, James Bay, Montreal, Vancouver and Vancouver Island. This is Mr. Tian's first visit to Canada.

The highlights of his visit include a meeting with the Prime Minister, an official dinner for business leaders hosted by the Deputy Prime Minister, bilateral discussions with the Minister for International Trade, calls on the Governor General and the Speakers of Parliament, as well as meetings with the Premiers of Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia (the latter four at the annual Western Premiers Conference). Industrial visits will include a Northern Telecom production facility and the de Havilland aircraft plant in the Toronto area, the LG-2 dam site at James Bay, the Vessel Traffic Centre at Vancouver Harbour and the Vancouver Skytrain control centre.
