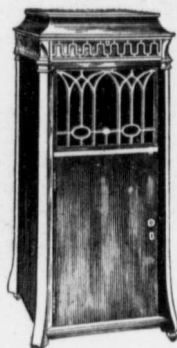

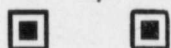

OUR SOLDIER PRINCE

THEY christened him Albert, Edward, Christian; he is Prince of Wales, Knight of the Garter, and carries a host of other titles with his name; but to the people of Canada he is "the Prince" in the truest sense of the word.

Young, fair-haired and smiling faced, he at once wins the hearts of all who come in contact with him. His whole bearing is typically reminiscent of his Royal Grandfather, royalty combined with true graciousness being marked characteristics of both Edward VII and Edward of Wales, the Prince, "our soldier Prince," whom we acclaim today.

Is there one among us who will not, in years to come, proudly recall the day when we stood in the crowded streets of Montreal to cheer the Empire's Heir Apparent, and win a share of that royal smile which seemed to be meant for each and every one of us individually?

Despite his youthful appearance, he bears the great responsibilities of his position with the confidence of a seasoned man; and small wonder, for he has been doing a man's work for years.

His war record, from his early days as a subaltern in the Grenadiers until today which finds him Colonel of the Welsh Guards, is one which both he and the Empire may well be proud of. He is, indeed, a very real soldier, as every Canadian soldier who saw him overseas will readily testify, and returned men will cheer him all the more heartily for having done "his bit" and done it well.

His presence at the front was an inspiration to all ranks wherever he went. Cheerful and untiring, he was, as a Canadian "Tommy" once said, "a soldier first and a Prince afterwards," a true exponent of royal chivalry, doing "his bit" with the best, in his own inimitably unassuming manner.

When he looks back over the long hours and weary journeys he put in during his active service, Albert Edward, one time Captain, attached to Canadian Corps Headquarters, may truly feel that every Canadian who saw him was proud of him, and proud to belong to the same Corps.

The frank, open face and cheery smile are the same today as they were on active service; just a little tired, perhaps, now as then, from long hours devoted to his duty, but just as popular and just as welcome, and the rousing cheers given by Canadian fathers and mothers during His Royal Highness's progress through the flag-decked streets of Montreal, will linger all the more sweetly in his ears as being the echo of the ringing shouts of their sons overseas, a few short months ago.

He met Canada's sons, and fought with them, during the greatest war of history, in a foreign land, made free by the blood of thousands of soldiers of the Empire; and now he has come to Canada, and Canada's great heart, smiling through the tears of the war's sorrows and joys, goes out to him, the streets resound with his name, and Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, is claimed by the Dominion for her own.

The khaki-clad figure driving through the streets and standing at the salute on the Lafontaine Park parade ground will long remain a memorable picture in the minds of Montreal's soldiers, and the memory of the same royal presence on the floors of the ball-rooms of the Ritz and Windsor Hotels will often be recalled by Montreal's sons and daughters in the ever-memorable story of the visit of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales to Canada.

Wherever he may go in the long journeyings of his royal career, he will carry with him the sincere good-will and love and loyalty of the City of Montreal.

He is, indeed, by inheritance, the Prince of Wales, but to us he will always be **the** Prince, "our soldier Prince," the pride of the Dominion.

From coast to coast, every Province of the Dominion has acclaimed him as "our soldier Prince," and he has won for himself the heartfelt admiration and staunch support of all whose privilege it has been to see him.

The Prince he was, **the** Prince he is, and "our soldier Prince" may he long remain.

NOTRE PRINCE SOLDAT

Altesse:

J'AI l'honneur de vous souhaiter la bienvenue à Montréal au nom de sa population canadienne-française. La tâche qui m'incombe est à la fois délicate et difficile. Il est toujours délicat de se faire l'interprète d'un peuple. Et si "ce que l'on conçoit bien s'énonce clairement", il n'en est pas ainsi de ce que l'on ressent profondément.

Le Canadien-Français, issu de Normandie, féodal dans l'âme, s'est toujours attaché plutôt à la personne du souverain qu'à sa couronne. Lorsque mourût votre bisaïeule, Victoria la Bonne, chacun de nous se souvient comme notre deuil fût personnel. C'était quelqu'un de la famille qui s'en allait. Nos anciens se rappellent encore le renouveau de loyauté provoqué par le gracieux tact de votre grandpère, qui s'exerçait déjà à être Edouard le Pacificateur. Nous avons nous-mêmes le souvenir de la tournée du duc d'York en 1908, au cours de laquelle nous avons pu apprécier la simplicité et la douceur toutes royales du roi regnant.

C'est aussi que, tous les trois, ils réalisaient l'idéal rêvé du Français: le roi bonhomme—entrevu pour un moment dans Henri IV.—le roi aimant son peuple et aimé de lui sincèrement, circulant dans la foule sans gardes, cuirassé par le sentiment populaire contre la bombe et le poignard. Et si, dans le krach mondial de la monarchie, le trône anglais reste debout, plus grand qu'avant la guerre, c'est qu'il est ancré sur le bien public, et n'est que le finial, le pinnacle, d'un "commonwealth" réel.

Ce que nous savons maintenant de vous nous assurent que vous continuerez la tradition. N'avez-vous pas toute suite pris contact avec nous? N'êtes-vous pas devenu pour ainsi dire notre intime? Le Canada se souviendra longtemps de celui qu'il se plaît à appeler le Prince Charmant, auréolé de jeunesse et de dévouement militaire.

Car vous avez pris à cœur votre devise, arrachée par votre glorieux prédécesseur à l'écusson d'un roi de Bohême,—"Je sers." Vous auriez pu,—d'après le protocole, vous auriez dû—rester en Angleterre, ou votre status d'héritier de couronne vous rivait. Rompant avec l'usage, vous avez endossé l'uniforme d'un capitaine d'état-major, et pendant quatre ans vous en avez admirablement fait le devoir. Ceux qui là-bas vous ont observé savent que vous ne boudiez pas plus le danger que le travail, et ils saluent en vous un véritable frère d'armes.

Et ceux-là comptent parmi nous. Il convient de rappeler ici que cette ville et ses environs ont fourni au corps expéditionnaire canadien un contingent de quelques soixante mille, dont un grand nombre dort du dernier sommeil en France et dans les Flandres.

NOTRE PRINCE SOLDAT

(Suite)

A part celà, il se peut, Altesse, que dans cette ancienne province vous trouviez un accueil plus essentiellement cordial qu'ailleurs. Votre personne est un symbole. Et cette province a toujours chéri l'idéal. Montréal, tout terre-à-terre et commercial qu'il soit devenu par la suite, a eu ses racines dans l'idée. Ceux qui le fondèrent n'étaient pas des aventuriers, avides de riches pelletteries ou de sables à pepites d'or. Ils n'établissaient pas une factorie, ils n'ouvraient pas un puits de mine. De propos délibéré, en connaissance de cause, ils se constituaient l'avant-garde des forces civilisatrices de l'Europe. Ils faisaient de Ville Marie le poste d'écoute d'abord, puis la tranchée d'assaut du progrès en Amérique.

La vague assaillante a roulé bien loin vers l'ouest. L'attaque s'est consolidée sur son objectif final. L'Amérique est au progrès. Mais ici, chez nous, la trace de la première préparation, ineffaçablement imprimée, se voit encore. Nous sommes encore du vieux monde, du monde auquel l'expérience a enseigné que, même au sens pratique, l'idée domine la matière — du monde dont vous êtes. C'est pourquoi nous nous comprendrons mieux.

Montréal a une autre caractéristique. C'est ici, à l'endroit où nous sommes, que passe la frontière entre deux races. Comme dans notre fleuve, près d'ici, l'Ottawa s'unit au St-Laurent et roule ses eaux dans le même lit tout en restant distinct — ici le Canadien-Français se mêle au Canadien-Anglais sans amalgame, sans perte de caractère intime de part ou d'autre.

D'aucuns ont vu à celà un inconvénient, voire un danger. Mais votre expérience personnelle vous fera voir plus clair que celà. Au front, l'armée alliée a eu tout bénéfice de l'union de génies différents. La France et l'Angleterre ont surgi invincibles de la coopération de leurs divergences. Il en sera ainsi de nous.

Depuis le moyen-âge deux peuples se sont mutuellement recherchés. Cette guerre les a enfin unis. A eux deux ils sont la meilleure garantie de la paix du monde. Vivant pour ainsi dire l'un dans l'autre depuis quatre ans ils ont appris à s'apprécier tellement qu'on aura beau souffler sur les cendres d'un passé plus lointain, l'on ne réveillera plus jamais les incendies qui désolèrent l'Europe.

Ce que la guerre a amené entre les pères, la "paix britannique" l'a amené entre les fils. Si ceux-ci ont eu des mésententes, c'est parce que, voulant atteindre au même idéal, ils ont pris par des chemins différents, sans se douter que, au bout de l'étape, ces chemins se rencontraient.

Prince, ce que La France vous a dit hier, la Nouvelle France vous le dit aujourd'hui: "Vous êtes le bienvenu parmi nous."
