### ANNUAL MEETING.

A number of ladies and gentlemen who take an interest in this very deserving institution assembled in the Board-room on the evening of June 7th, for the purpose of hearing the Report for the year just ended. The chill, damp state of the weather, together with the prospects of rain, no doubt deterred many who otherwise would have been present from attending. The room was tastefully decorated for the occasion with flowers and evergreens, while on a raised platform behind the chair were seated about seventy of the little waifs who there find a comfortable home, and are prepared to make their own way in the world. No shadow on the bright faces reminds one of the misfortunes which have placed so many of the little ones here. The girls, attired in neat blue dresses, with white pinafores, and the boys in their dark tweed suits, looked remarkably well, while their conduct during the evening could not have been better. His Worship Mayor McMurrich occupied the chair, while the Bishop of Niagara and Rev. Mr. Cayley occupied seats on the platform. Rev. Mr. Cayley opened the meeting with prayer, after which the Chairman called on Alderman Boswell to read the Annual Report, which was of considerable length, and referred minutely to the affairs of the Home for the past year. During that time 30 children were admitted, 7 apprenticed, and 2 died, and 108 are at present in the Home.

The children are making steady progress in their studies. The projected workshop has been abandoned for the present, owing to the tenders received greatly exceeding the amount in hand. The opportune bequest of the late Mr. Andrew Wilson, amounting to \$1,000, enabled the managers to tide over what otherwise would have been a very trying season in September last, the funds being very low just then; and the increase of \$250 in the civic grant enabled the Board to set aside, as the nucleus of a building fund, the net proceeds of the Calico Ball, amounting to \$536; also \$64 due to a concert, the joint effort of the matron and the Toronto Teachers' Choral Society.

The 24th of February being the twelfth anniversary of Miss Wheel-wright's installation as matron, the managers decided on presenting that lady with a substantial recognition of her faithful services, and she was accordingly made the recipient of a handsome bedroom suit and carpet, which, with an annual increase of \$100 in her salary, was a gratifying evidence of their entire satisfaction.

During the year the institution has been remarkably free from sickness.

Among the gentlemen who contributed to the amusement of the children were the captains of the several ferry boats, Mr. Fleming, of Brampton, and the cabmen of the city, the little ones being treated with excursions to Lorne Park, the Island, and High Park. This, with the continued liberality of the butchers, bakers, market-gardeners, and confectioners, is gratefully acknowledged in the Report. The Treasurer's Report was then read, showing the disbursements for the current year to be \$6,408.72, which includes repairs to the building, amounting to over \$500, salaries, etc., while the receipts, including a balance of \$701.32 carried forward from last year, a balance of \$182.92, on hand, besides money in bank and otherwise invested, amount to \$6,593.91.

After reading the Report, Ald. Boswell made a few remarks, and referred to the workshop, which he hoped would yet be established. He then moved the adoption of the Report, which was seconded by Mr.

Godson, and unanimously adopted.

A vote of thanks was then moved by Ald. Boswell to the managers and office-bearers of the past year, and Ald. McMurray one to the Orangemen of Ontario and other kind friends for the interest they have

taken in this Home.

Archdeacon McMurray, of Niagara, then stated that of the 1,600 children brought out by Miss Rye not three per cent. had gone astray,

and this was certainly very gratifying.

During the evening the children rendered several amusing songs, Miss Ritchies presiding at the organ; and after the singing of the national anthem, prayer was offered by the Rev. Mr. Cayley, and the meeting closed.

JUNE 7TH, 1881.

The Managers of the Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society have much pleasure in laying before the public their Thirtieth Annual Report.

During the past twelve months thirty children have been admitted—fourteen girls and sixteen boys—seven have been apprenticed, thirteen removed by relations, one adopted, and two died, leaving at present 108 in the Home; the average number for the year being 107, an increase of seven upon the previous year ending June, 1880.

As in past years, several boys and girls have fulfilled their terms of service, but having gained the good will of their employers, and become as one of their family, they have either remained with them at stated wages, or have been assisted by them in recurring new employment. The money earned by these children while bound is placed by the Managers in the Savings Bank, and that, with the interest, is sent to them upon the expiration of their term of service, when they so desire it, thus giving them the advantage of a small capital to begin life upon. The Managers feel they have much cause for congratulation in the teacher allotted to them by the Public School Board. Under her careful training the children are making steady progress, especially in a most useful branch of study; as an instance of this, on a recent official visit of the Mayor and City Clerk, the children gave evidence of the thoroughness of the present system, and astonished their examiners by their rapidity in calculation. Several of them also were awarded Jesse Ketchum prizes in September last, and two lads received prizes of merit from Mr. Hughes, the Inspector.

The projected scheme for building a workshop for the boys, which had been deemed advisable, has been abandoned for the present, as many tenders received greatly exceeded the amount in hand.

In December, when the funds of the institution were at a low ebb, the opportune bequest of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) from the late Mr. Andrew Wilson, of Toronto, enabled the Managers to tide over what otherwise would have been a very trying season.

Thanks are due Alderman Boswell, who so kindly used his influence with the City Council, and secured for the Home an increase of \$250 in the annual civic grant, enabling the Board to set aside, as the nucleus of a building fund, the net proceeds of the Calico Ball, amounting to \$536; also \$64, the returns from a Concert, due to the joint efforts of the Matron, Miss Wheelwright, and the Toronto Teachers' Choral Society. The present building has been long felt to be insufficient to accommodate the increasing demands of so large a city; not a matter of surprise when one recalls the date of its origin, October of 1851, when it stood almost alone as a refuge for homeless children. Its establishment was mainly due to the thoughtful benevolence of Jenny Lind, then on a professional visit to Toronto, and whose

liberal gift of \$500 was at once doubled by the generosity of some of our prominent citizens.

His Worship the Mayor, accompanied by the Mayor of Halifax, paid a visit to the Home on Saturday, February 14th, when both gentlemen expressed their surprise and pleasure upon finding the order and arrangements of the Institution so complete.

The 24th of February being the 12th anniversary of Miss Wheelwright's installation as Matron of this Institution, the Managers were desirous of giving a substantial recognition of her faithful services, and decided upon presenting her with a bedroom suit and carpet; this, with an increase of \$100 per annum upon her previous salary, was a gratifying evidence of their entire satisfaction.

As in preceding years, the Committee of Management have to thank Dr. Ogden for his care and attention to the inmates of the Home, who under the Divine blessing have been singularly free from illness; also Dr. McDonald, who so kindly responded to the ladies' appeal that he should act for the future as Dr. Ogden's coadjutor; Mr. Huson Murray, the Solicitor, to whom they are greatly indebted for the judicious management of legal matters; and kind friends who have each Sunday given their services in the religious instruction of the children; to the Orangemen for their united contributions; and the *Mail* newspaper for gratuitous advertisements.

Among the many kindnesses to be remembered, are those of Mr. Fleming, of Brampton, the captains of the several ferry boats, and the cabmen of the city, who so thoughtfully contributed to the amusement of the children by excursions to Lorne Park, the Island and High Park; at the latter place an abundant supply of ice cream from Mr. Carlyle, baker, added largely to the enjoyment of the little folks.

This, with the continued liberality of the butchers, bakers, market gardeners, and confectioners, is gratefully acknowledged by the Board.

Annexed will be found the Treasurer's Report, containing a satisfactory statement of the financial management of the Home.
