ANNUAL MEETING.

ST. ANDREW'S HALL,
KINGSTON, JAN'Y 18TH, 1888. }

The Annual Meeting of the congregation was held at 7.30 P.M. Rev. Mr. Mackie in the chair.

After devotional exercises, Mr. T. D. Minnes was appointed Secretary, when the

Session Report was read by Mr. Mackie.

Manager's Report, read by Mr. Craig

The Treasurer's S. S. Report, read by Mr. W. T. Minnes.

The Secretary's S. S. Report, read by Mr. A. Robinson.

The Women's Home Association Report, read by Mrs. McIntyre.

The Organ Fund Report, read by Mr. Craig.

The Building Committee's Report, read by Mr. James Minnes.

The above reports were duly received and adopted.

On motion of Mr. James Minnes, seconded by Mr. G. M. Macdonnell, it was resolved that a special collection be taken up at both services, on the first Sabbaths in March and November, for the funds of the Sunday School.

On motion of Dr. Strange, seconded by Mr. James Minnes, the four retiring Managers were re-elected.

The Benediction was pronounced and the meeting adjourned.

KIRK-SESSION REPORT.

Since the month of April, when the Annual Report was submitted to the congregation, the Kirk-Session and the Church have sustained a great loss in the death of Mr. George Davidson. Their feelings regarding him are expressed thus on the pages of their Minutes:—
 “The Kirk-Session desire to place on record the great loss which they and the Church have sustained in the death of Mr. George Davidson, who from his early manhood, was a zealous member of the congregation, labouring among the young, and leading in every work that tended to the promotion of truth and godliness; who was for many years a Trustee and Manager of the Church, advancing by his business abilities and liberality the temporal interests and prosperity of the Church; who for over forty years held a seat in the Kirk-Session, regarded by his fellow-elders and the whole congregation as in every respect worthy of his office, and of their highest esteem, affectionate regard and lasting remembrance.”

The necessity of filling up the vacancies in the Kirk-Session that had occurred through death and otherwise, became so urgent that in the month of June six members of the Church were ordained to the Eldership. With this strong accession, it is hoped that the spiritual interests of the congregation will be greatly advanced.

Since April the Sacrament of Baptism has been administered to 21 children. The Lord's Supper in April was celebrated by 244 communicants; in June by 196, and in October by 168. On profession of faith 12 were added to the Communion Roll, and 9 bearing Disjunction Certificates. The Communion Roll has just been carefully revised, no names being retained but of those who are bona-fide communicants. As it now stands it shows a membership of 330.

The poor of the congregation have been well attended to.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, 17TH JAN'Y, 1888.

The Managers ask special attention to the financial statement herewith. Compared with the previous year, the revenue shows a decrease for the nine months just closed, of nearly ten per cent by Envelopes, and about twenty per cent by Plate Collections. This is discouraging, but the figures are facts and the congregation should seriously consider them and at once apply the remedy, by increasing their subscriptions by at least twenty per cent.

Owing to the very liberal subscription received from Rev. Dr. Williamson, the total receipts, notwithstanding the above shrinkage, have been equal to the expenditure, so that the liabilities, which amounted to \$820.35 at the last Annual Meeting, have not been increased, but remain at about the same figure.

The Revenue requires to be increased so that the present liabilities may be paid off and that urgent repairs to property may be attended to promptly.

The retiring Managers are Messrs. Hamilton, McIntyre, Fraser and Mudie.

Hearty thanks are due Mr. Fairbairn for the kind manifestation of his interest in the school, and it is hoped that his good example may be followed by others.
