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PROSPECTUS.

White College has been established in order to meet the desire expressed by many earnest Protestant gentlemen to have a first-class education put within the reach of the Young Women of the City of Ottawa and vicinity. The basis of the institution, while decidedly Religious and Protestant, is Non-Sectarian.

A thorough training will be afforded in all the branches of an English, Classical and Scientific education, and in the Modern Languages and the Fine and Useful Arts to those who desire these accomplishments.

In the course of instruction and the use of text books, the faculty will conform as far as possible to the requirements and usages of the High Schools of the Province of Ontario, and University College, Toronto.

The College is the property of a chartered Joint Stock Company, (limited liability) controlled by a Board of Managers who are elected by the Stock-holders, at a meeting held on the first day of July in each year.

The College Building is situated in the western part of the City of Ottawa, in a high and healthy locality, with ample room for play-grounds, commanding a beautiful and extensive view of the river and surrounding country.

The Building, which was erected for the purpose, is a substantial stone edifice, four stories high, with airy corridors, and commodious school-rooms and sleeping apartments. Every attention has been given to ventilation, and the whole building is heated by hot water pipes. There, is accommodation for one hundred boarders, who will find every necessary comfort provided, with bath-rooms and closets on each floor.

There is a Gymnasium in connection with the institution, and regular Calisthenic exercises are provided for the pupils.

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Course of Instruction.

There are three departments in the Institution.

1. THE ELEMENTARY: Intended for pupils beginning the study of English, Arithmetic, and Writing.

2. THE INTERMEDIATE: Intended for pupils who are able to read and spell correctly, and to write, and who have mastered the four simple rules of Arithmetic. The Intermediate course usually extends over two years.

3. THE COLLEGIATE: Intended for pupils who can pass an examination in the Elements of English Grammar, Geography and History, and Arithmetic as far as Fractions.

CURRICULUM IN COLLEGIATE DEPARTMENT.

1st year.

English Literature, Physics, History and Chronology, Algebra and Geography, Latin and Greek, French and German.

2nd year.

Botany, Chemistry, Mental and Moral Philosophy, Mathematics, Astronomy, Latin and Greek, French and German, Italian, Geology and Palæontology, Physiology, Natural Theology and Christian Evidences, Logic and Rhetoric, Belles Lettres, Italian.

Classics and Modern languages are optional, and when taken in regular course are specially charged.

Instruction in the Bible forms part of the regular course in all departments.

Music and individual instruction in Singing, Painting and Drawing, Fancy Work and the Culinary Art do not form part of the course and will be charged extra.

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TERMS AND FEES.—Continued.

Non-resident pupils will be charged 50 cents per term for Schoolroom expenses.

Fees are payable regularly in advance at the beginning of each term.

Class Books and Stationary will be provided in the College at trade prices.

The music pupils have the benefit of the use of a large and valuable musical library, the property of Mr. Butler, which is open to his pupils free of charge.

The "Soirees Musicale" which have proved so valuable in stimulating the industry and developing the talent of the music pupils will be continued during the coming winter.

MEDALS.

. Professor BUTLER will give a gold medal to the best, and a complete set of Beethoven's Sonatas to the second best music pupil.

A Silver medal, called the Secretary's medal, will be given to the best speller. The proficiency to be tested by two examinations held at such times as the Secretary may direct.

Other medals will be offered for proficiency in the several departments—a full list of which will be published soon after the opening of the College.

The Principal and Teachers reside in the College, and take the oversight of the Young Ladies during study hours and out-door exercise, and are at table with them.

Every attention will be paid to the health and comfort of the Boarders, and the wishes of parents and guardians will be considered as far as consistent with the order and good conduct of the Institution. It is hoped that extravagance on the part of the Young Ladies will be avoided, and that simplicity of manners, with plainness of dress will be studied while attending the College.

Every room is intended to accommodate two Boarders, having a a separate bedstead for each, and all other conveniences.

In case of the withdrawal or expulsion of a pupil no money will be refunded.

General Regulations.

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l. No pupil shall be admitted into the College under eight years of age. \circ

2. Before entering the Intermediate Department, pupils shall pass an examination on the subjects taught in the Primary Department; and, before entering the Collegiate, an examination on the subjects of the Intermediate Department.

3. Pupils shall be furnished with the requisite text-books and stationery; arrangements are made for providing these things in the College at current trade prices, when desired.

4. The school opens at 9 o'clock, a.m., and closes at 3.45 p.m. There is an intermission from noon till 1.30 p.m. Pupils are required to be punctual in attendance; when absent or late they will be required to give an account to their teachers.

5. No pupil will be allowed to remain in the school whose conduct is improper, or who is disobedient. In such cases, it will be the duty of the Principal to suspend the offender and notify the parents or guardians of such action; nor shall the offender be restored until satisfaction has been given.

6. Fees are payable in advance; and at the end of each quarter the bill for stationery and books will be presented.

7. No day-pupil is permitted to go upstairs, except for music lessons, or by express permission of one of the teachers, and then only in company with the boarder whose room such pupil is visiting.

 All damage done to school property shall be repaired at the expense of the pupil doing the damage.

Regulations for Boarders.

 Every boarder is required to be provided with a pair of blankets, a quilt, two pair of sbeets, two pillow cases, six towels, and six table napkins with ring. If preferred, these articles will be supplied at an additional charge of twenty-cents per week.

2. Every boarder is required to have a pair of over-shoes, a waterproof cloak and an umbrella.

3. Every article of clothing must be distinctly marked with the owner's name.

4. The boarders are awakened at 6.30 a.m.; breakfast is served at 7.30, dinner at 12.30 p.m., and tea at 6 p.m. Family worship is attended immediately after breakfast and tea, when all boarders are prequired to be present. The time allotted for exercise is from four till.

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ved at nip is rs are ar till six p.m., and for study from seven till nine p.m. All lights in the bed-rooms are extinguished at 9.45 p.m., except in cases where special permission has been granted.

5. Boarders are not permitted to leave the College unless with one of the governesses, or their parents or friends, or by special permission of the Principal, with the consent of their parents.

6. One of the governesses accompanies the boarders each Friday afternoon, when they have opportunity of purchasing such articles as are necessary.

7. On Saturday permission is granted to boarders to visit such friends as their guardians may desire; they are required to return not later than 9.30 p.m.

8. No visitors are permitted to see the boarders unless they bring letters of introduction to the Principal, and no visitor is allowed to go to a private room without special permission from the governess in charge.

9. All correspondence shall pass through the hands of the Principal, and parents are requested to turnish the addresses of those to whom their daughters may write.

10. Boarders are required to keep their rooms in order, under the supervision of the governesses.

11. In cases of sickness, the best medical advice will be procured . at the expense of the parents of the invalid.

12. All the boarders are required to attend church regularly, and may not absent themselves without permission. Arrangements are made for their going to their several places of worship as parents and guardians may desire, under the direction of the governesses.

All boarders are required to attend the bible classes which are held in the College, unless permitted by the Principal to be absent.

13. The charges for board are payable in advance; all other charges are payable at the end of each quarter.

14. Special arrangements made for the accommodation of parlor boarders. Terms made known on application.

The College opens on Wednesday, September 3rd, at which time it is hoped that those purposing to attend will be forward.*
