PROSPECTUS.

Cette Institution fut fondée par la Congrégation de Sainte-Croix, en 1847, et incorporée par un acte du Parlement, en 1849. Elle joint au bienfait d'une éducation toute chrétienne, la garantie d'une instruction élevée et maintenue à la hauteur de l'enseignement public. D'ailleurs les positions que les hommes sortis de son sein occupent dans le monde, et le nombre toujours croissant de ses élèves, témoignent assez du soin que ses directeurs apportent à la formation intellectuelle et morale de la jeunesse.

OBJET ET DIVISION DE L'ENSEIGNEMENT.

Cours Préparatoire.

Ce cours est une préparation au cours commercial et au cours classique. Il se donne dans une maison spéciale, dirigée par la même Congrégation, Notre-Dame, Côte-des-Neiges. On y reçoit les enfants de cinq à onze ans. Des soins particuliers leur sont donnés, en rapport, autant que possible, avec les soins de la famille.

Cours Commercial.

Ce cours comprend cinq années. Il embrasse toutes les branches des sciences, et tout ce qui constitue la haute éducation commerciale. Les élèves y sont spécialement exercés à la pratique des affaires.

On délivrera des diplômes aux élèves qui auront subi un examen avantageux sur les matières d'enseignement de la classe d'affaires ; Arithmétique, Géographie, Grammaire, Littérature, Histoire, Algèbre, Géométrie, Calligraphie, Tenue-des-Livres, Affaires de Banque, Lois et Correspondance Commerciale, Logique, etc.

ST-LAURENT COLLEGE

(NEAR MONTREAL)

PROSPECTUS

This Institution founded by the Fathers of the Congregation of the Holy Cross in 1847, incorporated by act of parliament in 1849 and empowered by affiliation to Laval University to confer degrees, is situated about five miles from Montreal. It combines the advantages of a thorough classical and commercial education.

Classical Course.

This course, which leads to the degree of Bachelor of Arts, comprises six classes, viz : Elements, Syntax, Prosody, Belles-Lettres, Rhetoric and Philosophy. It embraces the study of the English, French, Latin and Greek languages ; History, Geography, Mythology ; Mathematics and the Natural and Physical Sciences ; Poetry and Rhethoric ; Logic, Metaphysics, Natural Theology, Ethics and Sociology.

Commercial course.

This course, in which the students receive a thorough business training, fits young men for the various pursuits in mercantile life. It comprises five classes, viz ; First year, Second year, Third year, Fourth year and Business Class. Commercial Diplomas are given to those who pass a satisfactory examination in the following branches : Elementary Algebra, Commission and Brokerage, Stocks, Profit and Loss, Insurance, General Average, Simple Interest, Compound Interest, Partial Payments, Savings Bank Accounts, Discount, Exchange, Equation of Payments, Partnership, Alligation, Square Root, Cube Root and Mensuration; Bryant and Stratton's complete course of Book-Keeping and Banking, Commercial Correspondence, Commercial Law, Actual Business, English Grammar, Principles of English Literature, English Composition and the Elements of Intellectual and Natural Philosophy.

Religious Training.

"Man know thy-self" is an imperative duty that must not be ignored in the sublime work of education. Not only must his intellect be trained to think and judge correctly, but also his will and heart must be formed to act according to the dictates of reason and revelation. He is bound by natural and voluntary obligations towards his Creator, himself and his fellow-men. He must know these obligations in order to fulfil them. Hence the necessity of studying the fundamental principles of religion for the harmonious development and perfection of man who is rational, free, and responsible for his acts.

Minim Department.

Notre Dame, Côte-des-Neiges, was founded by the Fathers of the Congregation of the Holy Cross in 1869 for the education of children from the age of five to eleven. It is situated on the delightful slope of Mount Royal about three miles from St Laurent. The new and magnificent buildings, erected in 1881, and furnished with all modern improvements, afford to the young and tender pupils all the comforts of home. Particular attention is given to the formation of their innocent hearts to virtue under the benign influence of religion. The rudiments of the French and the English languages, Geography and Arithmetic are taught with equal care. The dormitories, infirmary and culinary department are under the charge of the Sisters who likewise take a special interest in the cleanliness of the children. The discipline is mild and paternal. This course prepares the pupil for the higher studies pursued at St Laurent.

Books, stationery and medicine are charged extra. Payments must be made semi-annually in advance. Students entering after the commencement of the term are only charged for the remaining portion, but every month begun must be paid in full. Students leaving the College during the month of May are charged for the rest of the term.

For the better maintenance of order and discipline, young men coming from other Colleges are only received on the best recommendations.

The students wear no special uniform, but each must be provided with at least two suits of clothes, an over-coat, fur-cap for winter, under-clothing, hosiery, toilet requisites and table napkins.

All mail matter sent by the students or delivered to them is subject to the inspection of the President or his delegate.

Parents and guardians will receive a semi-annual Bulletin of the health, application, progress, etc., of their children and wards.

Le soussigné désirerait vivement solliciter la bienveillante attention des bienfaiteurs et des amis de cet Etablissement, qui est en voie de grande prospérité, sur le fait qu'un ample local pourvu de tablettes, rayons, cases vitrées, etc., a été consacré à un musée général, où sera soigneusement classifié et constamment exhibé tout objet additionnel d'intérêt scientifique, de pure curiosité, ou d'instruction pratique dans chacun des trois règnes de l'histoire naturelle; de même que toutes œuvres d'art, médailles, monnaies, gravures, antiquités, reliques indiennes et autres, etc., etc., etc.

Déjà, comme on le peut voir, cette recommandable entreprise est en belle voie de réalisation; en effet, grâce à la noble générosité et au zèle éclairé d'un bon nombre de bienveillants amis, notre musée renferme actuellement près de 2000 objets, intéressants et de prix pour la plupart, spécialement dans les sections de minéralogie, de conchyliologie, d'entomologie, d'ornithologie, d'zoologie, de botanique et de numismatique.

Il n'est, certes, personne doué d'intelligence qui ne reconnaîse de prime abord qu'il est grandement utile et désirable, pour une institution d'enseignement supérieur, de posséder un musée considérable, disposé systématiquement, et tenu en bon ordre; car une telle collection générale d'une grande variété d'objets facilite beaucoup les recherches de l'étudiant, tend au développement de l'habitude d'observation, et ainsi accroît son horizon intellectuel; elle est, de plus, une source d'intérêt et de plaisir pour le visiteur, non moins qu'un sujet de légitime satisfaction pour les professeurs et les élèves de l'établissement.

Mais l'on doit admettre que la création d'un musée vraiment digne de ce nom, n'est pas l'œuvre d'un jour ou même d'une année; mais elle est nécessairement le résultat d'efforts soutenus, attentifs et éclairés de plusieurs années; et un tel musée ne peut devenir relativement complet, et, partant, utile et intéressant, que par des achats réitérés, considérables et dispendieux, ou par des donations volontaires, d'une nature ou d'une autre, de la part de généreux amis. Mais le Curateur du Musée du Collège de Saint-Laurent ne saurait compter, par manque de ressources pécuniaires suffisantes, sur le premier moyen; toutefois, il sait, sans aucun doute, que cette Institution compte ses amis par centaines, sinon par milliers; et, de plus, il aime à croire qu'ils sont disposés à secouder ses efforts dans cette louable entreprise en contribuant joyeusement et dans la mesure de leurs moyens, à une collection d'objets propres à un musée général. Assurément, le nombre de ceux ou de celles qui n'ont pas en leur possession quelque ancienne médaille, quelque pièce de monnaie rare ou ancienne, quelque gravure ou photographie

fine, quelque estampille de pays étrangers; en un mot, quelque objet d'art antique ou moderne (sans parler de spécimens d'histoire naturelle), doit être bien restreint; et les possesseurs de tels objets, que peuvent-ils faire de mieux que de les offrir, dans l'intérêt des connaissances utiles, à un musée semi-public, où ces choses de curiosité ou d'art seront soigneusement conservées, et constamment présentées à l'étude ou à la curiosité de tous? Les propriétaires individuellement en sentiront peu la privation, tandis que l'établissement en deviendra par là plus complet et plus riche en objets d'art. De son côté, le Rév. Père préposé à l'organisation et au soin du musée sera très heureux, par devoir autant que par reconnaissance, de mentionner exactement dans un registre à ce destiné, et aussi dans les Catalogues annuels des Elèves du Collège de Saint-Laurent, la nature des dons et le nom des généreux donateurs.

The undersigned begs leave to call the attention of the patrons and friends of this prosperous Institution of learning to the fact that an ample local, with show-cases, stands, etc., has been provided for a general museum, in which are to be carefully classified and permanently exhibited whatever objects which may be interesting, curious, or instructive in the three kingdoms of nature; together with all kinds of works of art, coins, medals, antiquities, Indian and other relics, etc.

Already, a very fair start, as may be seen, in the establishment of such an undertaking, has been made: thanks to the noble generosity and enlightened zeal of a number of kind friends, from far and near, our museum contains, at this day, nearly 2000 objects of interest and value, especially in the departments of mineralogy, conchology, entomology, ornithology, oölogy, botany, and numismatics.

All intelligent persons know how useful and desirable it is for an Institution of higher learning to possess an extensive, carefully systematized and well-kept museum: such a general collection made up of a great variety of objects, affords, as is evident, instruction to the learners, pleasure and interest to the casual visitors, and an honest pride to the inmates of the Institution, both teachers and students. But it must be conceded that the creation of a museum worthy of the name, is not the work of a day, but of years; and it can be brought to a high degree of worth, completeness and excellence, only by repeated and expensive purchases, or by the voluntary donations of generous friends. The lack of pecuniary resources forbids the Rev. Curator of the Saint-Laurent Museum to rely on the former method; but he well knows that this College counts its good friends by the thousands; and furthermore, he feels confident that they are most willing to second his efforts in this enterprise, in contributing cheerfully, as far as it may be in their power, whatever object or objects which might be suitable for such a repository of curiosities. Assuredly, very limited is the number of persons who do not have in their possession some ancient medal, some foreign coins or postage stamps, some curious works of art, etc., etc., etc.; and what

better use can the possessors of such objets make than in presenting them to a museum, where these curiosities will be carefully preserved and permanently exhibited in the interests of general information, or science? The owners will not, indeed, miss them greatly; whilst the Institution shall be made the richer by them. On his part, the Rev. Curator of the Museum will be but too happy and careful to record in a register kept for that purpose and, also, in the annual Catalogues of the Students, the nature of all donations, with the names of the kind donors.
