Some of the secular papers are making much of the fact that several recently detected thieves are church members. What a Christian name is a passport to favor, and men are trusted the more because they are in the church, it is to be expected that its shelter and support will be sought by the weak and the wicked. And how shall they be detected? Suppose the church establishes an inquest at the gate, and refuses to admit any who cannot stand a searching examination. Hypocrites often make a better spurt than the weak in faith whom it is commanded to receive. A jury of ministers or elders, vestry men or ex-parte, cannot judge of the state of the heart. The bad man professes to be the best man, and gets in. The world reproaches the church with being traitor-laced and bigoted if it refuses to admit or afterward excludes a man of fair character whose piety it is in doubt. Therefore it comes to pass that the church is under the censure of the censorious if it does not receive into it if it excludes from its membership, the men who are to slip up and bring upon it still greater reproach. It was always so and always will be so.

**THE WHEAT AND THE TARES**  
The wheat and the tares are growing in the same field. The vigilant farmer may pull out a few of the latter, but the most of them will remain where they are till the harvest, and then they will be burned.

**THE DEFENCE OF THE CHURCH**  
This is the defence, the old one, often repeated, which is made for the church when its members prove to be bad men. But it is not sufficient to guard the scandal. It is the shame and grief of the church of God that any of its members are the children of the devil's ones. Even good men are weak in times of temptation and fall into sin. There are very few compared with the great number of hypocrites who have sought the cloak of a religious profession. The church is bound to be more vigilant, faithful and honest in its discipline. The pulpit may well put on strength and bear heavily upon sinners who are at ease in Zion. Discipline cannot detect the inner heart. But the truth followed by the Spirit of God will pierce even to dividing the soul and spirit and may discern the sin.

**FACTS WORTH REMEMBERING.**  
Sudden death is not coming from heart disease, one case in twenty, but from congestion of the lungs or brain, and from apoplexy. More die from congestion of the lungs than from heart disease, and more from congestion of the brain than from apoplexy. Sudden death from heart disease is usually caused by rupture of some large artery near the heart; from congestion of the lungs, by instantly stopping the breath; from congestion of the brain, by causing pressure on the brain which paralyzes and instantly destroys life; from apoplexy, by hemorrhage in the brain.

**HEALTHY LIVING.**  
Persons who suppose themselves suffering from heart disease because they have pain in the region of the heart, or palpitation, seldom have any disease of that organ. In nine cases out of ten, they are suffering from dyspepsia; nothing more. Congestion of the lungs is most frequently caused by a sudden change from the heat of the summer to the cold air of autumn, or from a hot bath to a cool one; or by being protected by sufficient clothing; hence, many persons thus seized drop dead in the streets.

**CONGESTION OF THE BRAIN.**  
Congestion of the brain most frequently results from trouble and anxiety of mind, producing sleeplessness, followed by the engorgement of the small blood vessels of the brain, sudden loss of vital power, and almost instant death. Apoplexy may be inherited disease, or it may be induced by too free living, or its opposite, too great abstinence. Paralysis may affect only a small portion of the body, from a finger to an entire limb, or it may disable half the body, or the whole body when death soon follows. When half the body is affected by paralysis, we may be certain that the seat of the disease is in the opposite side of the brain, because nerve fibres cross. Partial paralysis is often temporary, when caused by the rupture of a small blood vessel, if the clot is got rid of by absorption or otherwise.
