COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.

This morning Lord Chief Justice Willes proceeded to deliver judgment in the question raised by the Bishop of Exeter relative to a writ of prohibition to be addressed to the Archbishop of Canterbury, preventing him from instituting Mr. Gorham in the living of Bramford-Speke, in accordance with the decision of the Judicial Committee of Privy Council.

The Court was densely crowded, and long before the hour appointed for the proceedings, many dignitaries of the Church of England being present.

Lord Chief Justice Willes took his seat at half past ten o'clock, and there were also on the bench Justices Cresswell, Martin, and Talbot.

Lord Chief Justice Willes said, that during the last term the Bishop of Exeter came before the Court on a writ of prohibition to Sir Herbert Jenner Fust (as the representative of the Archbishop of Canterbury) to prevent him from instituting the Rev. G. C. Gorham in the Vicarage of Bramford-Speke.

The Motion was founded upon an affidavit which stated that the Queen was the patron of the vicarage, and that her Majesty in that capacity had nominated Mr. Gorham to the benefice.

The Bishop examined the Rev. G. C. Gorham as to his faith and doctrine, as well as to ecclesiastical matters, and found (so stated the affidavit) that his views were contrary to the doctrine and discipline of the Church of England.
