British and Foreign.

THE LEGISLATURE.

FREDERICTON, April 9.

The following Bills were introduced:—Hatheway, a Bill to defray certain expenses of Civil Government; a Bill to provide for repairing and improvement of roads, bridges, and other public works of the Province.

Coram, a Bill to incorporate the Alexandria Hotel and Sea Bathing Company. Wedderburn presented a petition from the Mayor and Commonalty of St. John praying that the Bill relating to Water Supply in Carleton may not become law.

The Attorney General laid before the House the Report of the Superintendent of Education.

Willis asked if the Government or any member of the Government had in their possession the resignation of Hon. Mr. Harrison, of the Legislative Council.

Hatheway said the rumor grew out of a joke, and that the Government had received no resignation from Mr. Harrison.

The House went in Committee on Ryan's Bill to incorporate the South Eastern Railway Company. It is the same as the Albert Railway Bill that was thrown out in the Legislative Council a short time since, with the exception that the Section giving operations for six months, at which time the charter of the present incorporated Company will expire if they do not commence operations, is omitted.

The bill was opposed by Hasting, Adams, Maher and others, who contended that the incorporating of this Company would seriously militate against the present Company and the success of the road at large.

The bill was agreed to, with a section restraining the Company for five months from commencing operations.

The House in Committee agreed to a bill in addition to an Act to incorporate the Fredericton Railway Company.

The House is now in Committee on the report of the Committee on Public Accounts.

Horror of Religious Persecution.

At last the details of the last outbreak in Roumania have reached London. They show that the persecution of the unoffending Jews was truly heart rending.

At Cahul the horrors exceeded even those formerly perpetrated at Lemul. Cahul is a town with a population of about 7000, 1000 of whom are Jews. These were suddenly set upon by their fellow townsmen, and for three days beaten, wounded, plundered, driven out of their houses, which were battered to ruins, and the tenants forced to take refuge in the barracks, where, instead of being defended, they were allowed again to be beaten, and for several days left without food.

In these tumultuous hours were split open, arms broken, heads plucked by the roots, and other atrocities committed. One of the sufferers defended his house for three days, his four sons standing by him, he made them swear that, should he fall, they would continue to fight. The bands surrounding his house were for a considerable time held at bay, but the defenders were at last compelled to give way, as the equal proportion of Jews and dirt, arranged in a circle, inflicted on the Jews is valued at 40,000 ducats. Trustworthy accounts say that there is scarcely a village in the whole of Roumania where there have not been frightful scenes. The misery is dreadful, and help is needed immediately.

From Ottawa.

(Special to the Tribune.)

Geo. P. Bliss, son of Rev. C. P. Bliss, is appointed chief draughtsman and assistant engineer on the Kinross district of the Inter-Colonial Railway.

British and Foreign.

(To the St. John Associated Press.)

London, April 9. John Bright, replying to an address from some Republicans declaring he was destined to be the first President of the Republic of Great Britain, writes that he hopes it will be a long time before Englishmen are called upon to decide between a Republic and a Monarchy.

Bright expressed a doubt as to whether Republicans are his real friends.

The German Bishops will meet in Fulda on Wednesday. Conference lasts two days and will be held with closed doors.

Archbishop of Cologne to preside.

Paris, April 9. Otrio officers seized yesterday sixty shells and grenades concealed in the gate of Montreuil.

Mont Vesuvius again in a state of violent eruption.

The Spanish minister of war, Gen. Boleyn, resigned, and Gen. Zabala succeeds him.

Disturbances are general throughout the country.

Toronto, April 9. Steamer Norsman left this morning for Charlotte, the first of the season.

Welland Canal expected to be open by 20th inst.

The Southwest is flooded. A heavy rain-storm on Monday caused a rising of rivers and streams, sweeping away several railroads in Kentucky and Tennessee.

In Ohio there were several land slides. The town of Wilmington is inundated, and half dozen bridges reported destroyed.

Revolutionists in Mexico are advancing on Matamoros and were within 50 miles yesterday. Martial law is proclaimed and the greatest excitement exists.
