
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

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PREFACE.

This Hand Book has been prepared with a view, to enable Instructors to follow more closely, the daily table laid down for the training to be given an Infantry Battalion in a twelve days camp, and also, that they may perceive at a glance, not only the sections to be taught, during each drill, but what part of the drill those sections refer to; thus sparing them much unnecessary waste of time. An occasional glance at the drill to be taught will give the Instructor confidence that he is doing the work expected of him, for while Instructors may have a fair knowledge of the Infantry Drill in general, yet they often find it difficult to keep to the sections laid down for each drill.

In presenting this little work the compiler hopes that it may meet with the approval of those interested in the instruction of In-

fantry Drill.
