Owing to various causes our receipts from the Anniversary Services have been very much less during the last two or three years than the amount required, although our current expenses have remained the same. As a consequence we find ourselves burdened with a deficit, which should be promptly met and the finances of the Sunday School put upon a sound basis.

A new Library is one of the urgent needs of our Sunday School. We had hoped to secure this a year ago, but the means were not at our disposal. Will you aid us to secure this very desirable object? For this we need the sum of \$200. We need about \$160 to meet the regular expenses of the current year, while our liabilities amount, as you will see by our Report, to about \$140.

The sum which we need is \$500—and this is the sum we ask you for—an amount much larger than usual, but we are confident that you have our welfare at heart and that you will give us according to our requirements.

You will recognize the fact that the Sunday School is one of the most important departments of church work. If it is to be efficiently carried on it is imperative that the machinery be made as perfect as possible. It is your home and your family that we aim to benefit, and we trust that you will aid us by your sympathy, your prayers to the Giver of all good, and your most liberal financial assistance at our Anniversary Services.
