## AMERICAN STEAMER ALCONQUIN TORPEDOED BY HUN SUBMARINE

## By Courier Leased London, March 14.-American Steams pedoed by a German submarine. The crew was saved.

The Algonquin, owned by the American Star Line of New York, was recently, transferred from British registry. She sailed from New York for London on Fe uary 20 and was reported to have about eight Americans in her crew. the American consul at Plymouth. The Consul states that all on board were saved. The vessel was torpedoed at six $0^{\prime}$ clock on the morning of March 12. The
submarine refused assistance, according to the report of the consul at Plymouth. Twenty-seven men have been landed.
