Collision on the Ohio River.—It is reported that the mail boats America, fo bound up, and United States, bound down, collided near Warsaw, between gright, and one hundred lives lost. It is said there were a great number of ladies on the United States, who periabed.

Madison, Indiana, Dec. 5.—The following are the particulars of the steamboat collision at Ray's Landing, two miles above Warsaw, on the Ohio River:—When the America struck the United States, the latter was so cut that she sank in two minutes. The United States had a quantity of petroleum on board, which took fire and wrapped both boats in flames. Great excitement ensued, and it it is supposed that 70 or 80 lives were lost. It is estimated that 38 women, passengers were lost on the America.


