The Mackenzie Hasin. Ortawa, A pril 28.—At Sonator Schultz' Mac-kenzie River Committee this morning, Prof. Maccun gave a good deal of interesting infor-mation, about that great country. He gave particulars of the fauna flora and vegetation of the district, dwelling particularly upon its grasses and vetches, which extended from the southern limit of the Mackenzie basin up to the Laird River mear Fort Simpson and proba-bly beyond that point, as no examination had yet been made of the region.
